e have often prised our new school, have heard others give it a high rating, but Sister Kary t. ugustine expresses in the following account what we would like to have said about it.

Celebration of Lary's birthday, September 8, brought me to Sacred Heart Convent which had been my home for six happy years.

The visit was a momentous one for in my absence, five short years, a "dream school" had risen on the corner of Trelfth and Marshall. I soy a "dream" school for many believed it would never be more than a beautiful dream.

But there it mas, taking the place of the old red building which had, in appearance, so inadequately represented the elor-ies of Catholic education. There it was -- a modern, artistic, quate, representative building, worthy of its destiny-a Catholic school.

As we went from room to room, we admired the tile, the terrazo, the class brick, the soft-colored walls, the new desks, lights--all the materials and arrangements that make new buildings beautiful and pleasant to live in. as we lingered in each bright classroom with its challenging and attrac-tive bulletin . boards and decorations, we were happy that the teachers and children of Sacred Heart School are enjoying what priests, Sisters, and members of the parish worked hard and willingly for many years to give then.
I especially liked the alumni

corner where from the very newest type of class picture equipment familiar faces of alumni smiled at us. There was also a list of those graduates who have devoted their lives to God. It is an impressive record. I recalled the class of '43; fifteen in number, three of whose members are now carrying the Catholic education they received at Sacred Heart to other children in Arizona, Iowa, and Illinois. 
