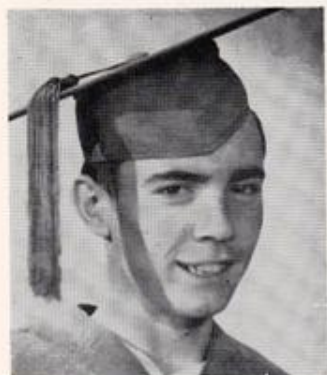
Dedication

IN THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1927, Boone Junior College opened its doors to sixty freshmen. The original program, which offered a course of study corresponding to that of the first two years of a liberal arts college, has gradually been broadened to include pre-commerce, pre-dentistry, pre-engineering, pre-law, pre-medicine, and pre-nursing. The most recent addition has been a two-year teacher training course, begun in September, 1953. The school has served the youth of the community in various ways. For some it has meant two extra years at home without delaying their education. For others it has made a college education financially possible.

Much of the success of the school is due to the devoted leadership of Mr. J. R. Thorngren, dean of the college for many years. His unfailing effort on behalf of the students and his continued endeavor to strengthen the institution have been a source of pride to its graduates. In 1953, after twenty-five years of active service, Dean Thorngren achieved the rank of Dean Emeritus, and it is to him that we dedicate the junior college section of this yearbook.

Mr. Dale Peer, mathematics instructor in the college for several years, this year assumed the position of dean. The staff extends to him its best wishes as he continues the work that Dean Thorngren has so ably begun.

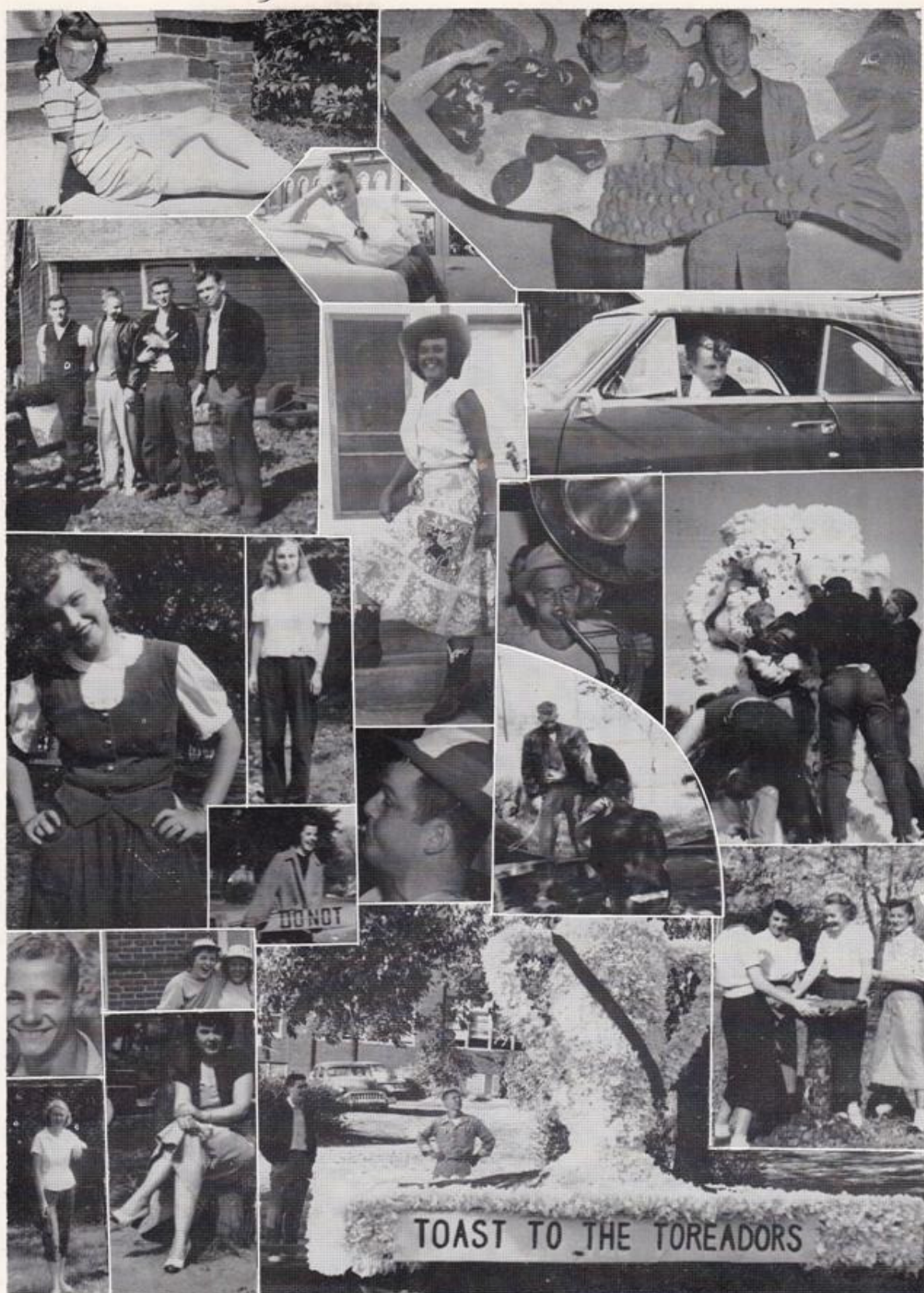

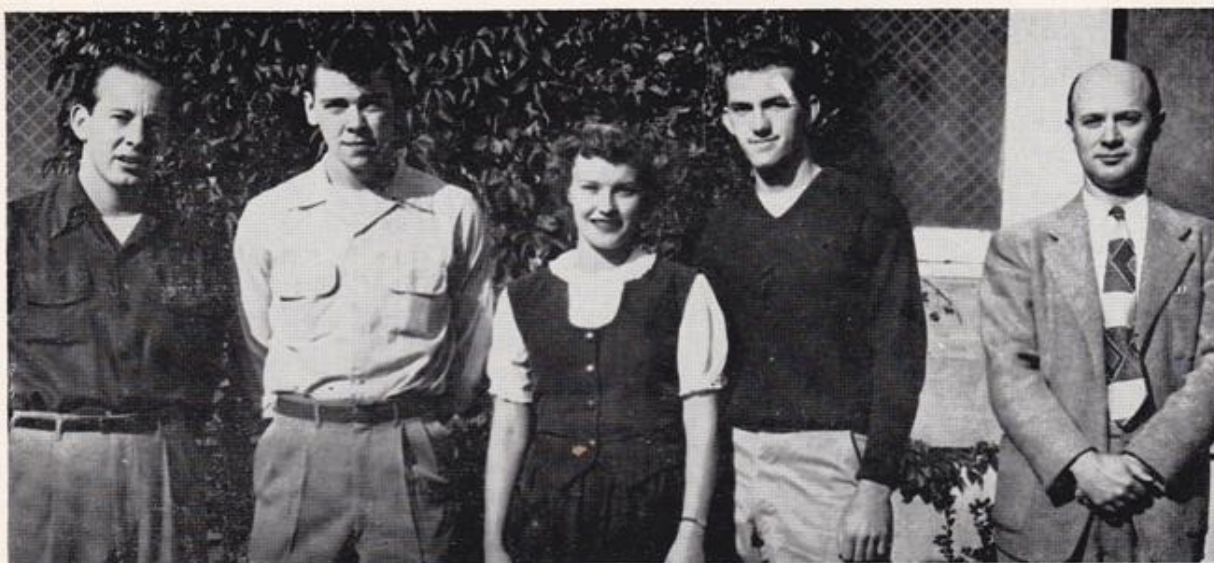

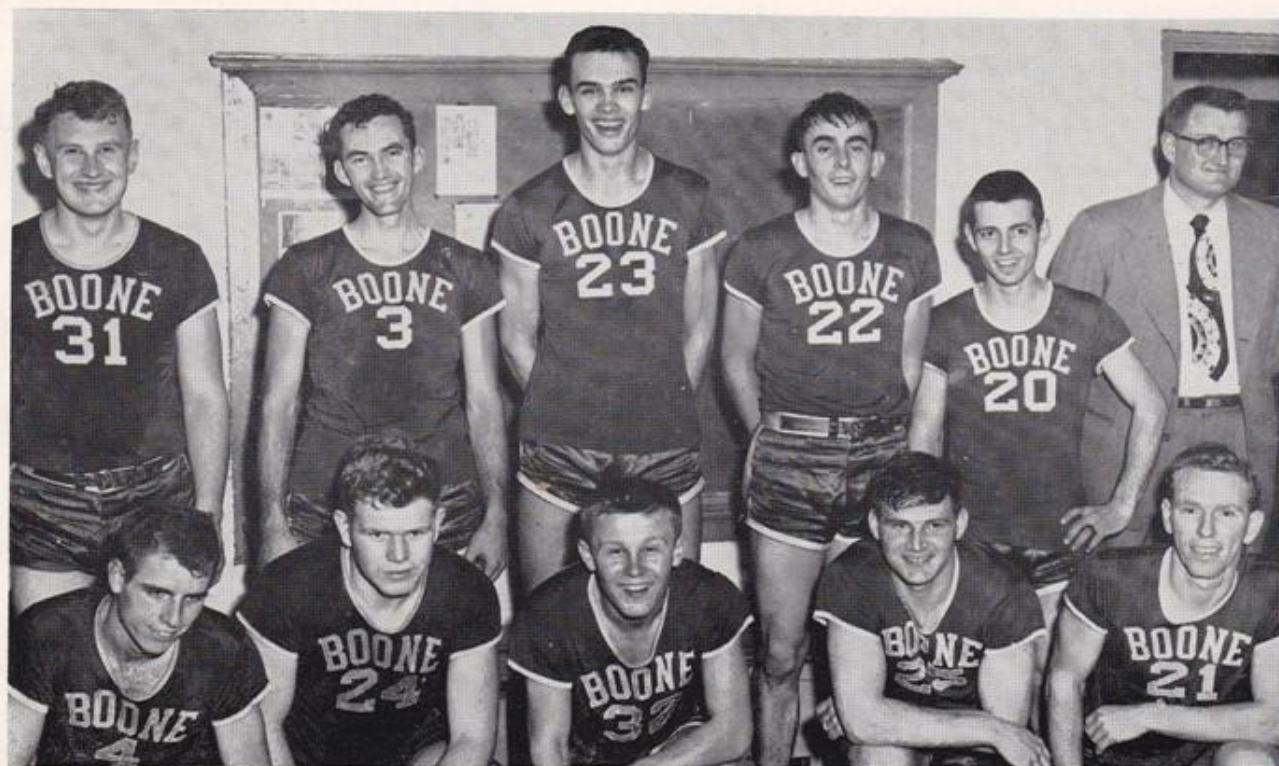
