Anderson Guiding 39 Boys In Cage Drills Currently

There's a move afoot to bring basketball back to Sacred Heart high school on an interscholastic basis by next season. And the plan is already in motion with a coach hired to teach fundamentals.

Practice began the last of January for some 39 players from the seventh grade through high school. There are only two seniors currently engaging in drills.

Joe Anderson, the former Ft. Dodge Corpus Christi hardcourt great, is currently guiding the efforts of the prospective Sacred Heart cagemen.

The practice sessions are being held at the Lowell school gym with Coach Anderson working with the seventh and eighth graders from 6:30 to 7:30 nightly and with the senior high from 7:30 to 9 o'clock.

Boone high school's gymnasium has been rented for six off-night home games for next season. The home games probably will be on Thursday nights.
