Boone J.V. '5' Edged by Ames

Until center Bob Bush fouled out early in the fourth quarter here Monday night Boone's J.V. basketball team was making a determined bid to win its first game in five starts this season.

But the rebounding sagged after Bush left and Ames dashed to a 58-47 victory.

Coach Wilmer Hokanson's Toreador reserves led 23-19 at the half and 38-36 going into final period after Ames had led 6-5 at the quarter.

Leon Anderson's 15 points led Boone and got a 14-point assist from Denny Askvig. Mike Ahlstrom tallied nine.

Paul Townsend and Jim Williams each had 12 while John Huntress scored 10 for Ames J.V.

Because of an insufficient number of players to make up a junior varsity team, Webster City had to pull a few men away from the varsity squad and junior Steve Kehoe led their scoring with 15 points.

Boone's junior varsity closed out their 1961-62 basketball schedule on a sour note as they lost to Mitchellville, 87-44. Scoring honors were shared by Gary Dean and Bill Olson. They each scored eight points to lead the Treadors.

Coach Wilmer Hokanson's crew posted a 2-7 season mark. The j.v.'s defeated Madrid in the season's opener 49-44, and downed United Community 54-45.

The remaining games were dual losses to Ames and Webster City, and single losses to Gilbert, Blairsburg, and Mitchellville.

Of the twelve Junior Varsity members eight are seniors Leon Anderson, Mike Halpin, Mike Sindlinger, Bob Herman, Ed Myers, Denny Askvig, who doubled as both varsity and Junior Varsity member Gary Dean, and Bill Olson. Juniors include Denny Adreon, Larry Lindmark, Lynn Vale, and Mike Riker. These four will be back next year to the varsity or the Junior Varsity squads.

Coach Wilmer Hokanson had this to say, "Over-all, we improved. We had some boys who really improved."

Injuries hurt the Treadors throughout the season. Denny Adreon was plagued with a bad knee. Leon Anderson missed the Blairsburg game. At least one contest Coach Hokannson feels the Junior Varsity could have won if all of the squad had been in the pink of health. Besides Denny Askvig sometimes traveled with the varsity, another blow to the J. V.'s.
