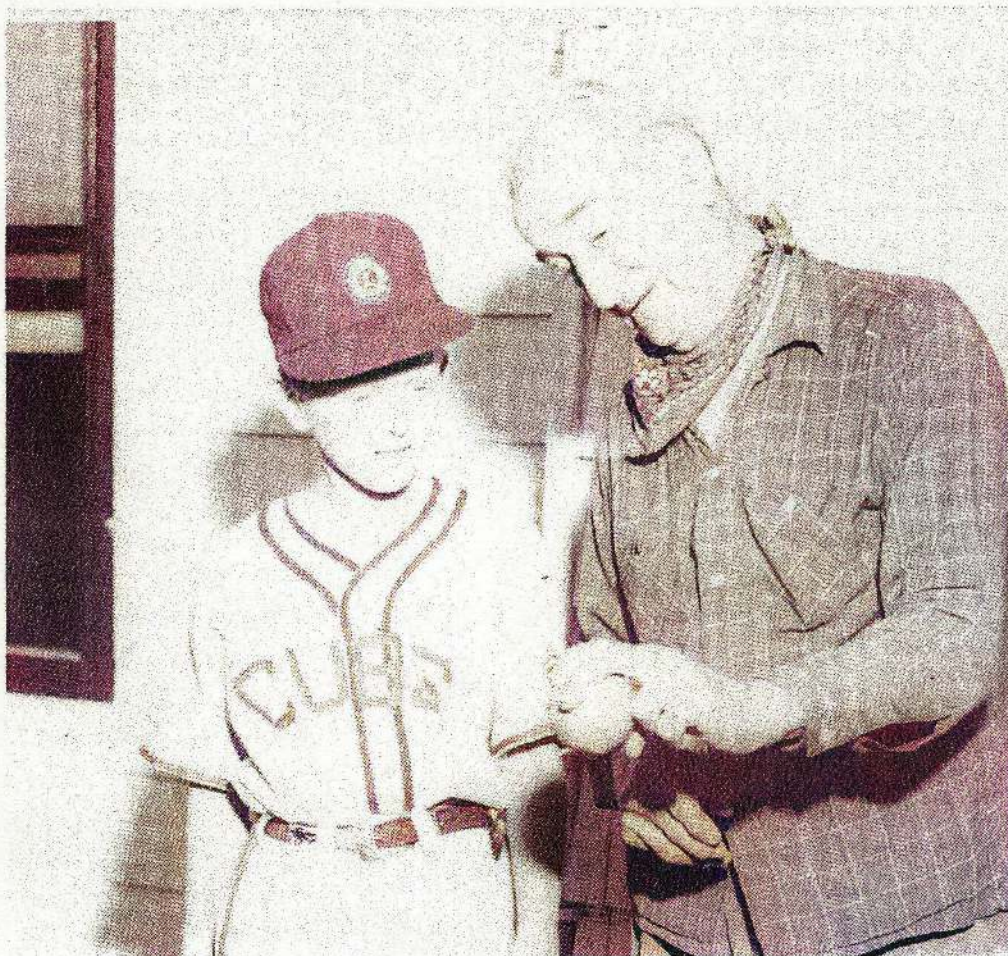

Boone's first Major Leaguer, Jimmy Archer, was a frequent visitor to the city long after his baseball career ended. Here, he's shown giving Boone Little Leaguer, Steve Duffy, a few tips on the proper way to grip the ball.

Jimmy Archer, who was a catcher on Boone's team in the Iowa State League in the early 1900's, later became the city's first Major League baseball player. Archer played with the Detroit Tigers, Chicago Cubs, Pittsburgh Pirates, Brooklyn Dodgers and Cincinnati Reds. His wife was a Boone girl, the former Lillian Stark, and the Archer's were frequent visitors to our city long after Jimmy's baseball career ended. Jimmy Archer died in 1957 but his widow returned to Boone to make her home until her death. Benny Meyers, Ival Howard and Jim Grant were other Boone boys who later put in some time with Major League clubs, but Jimmy Archer was first and, as a result, Boone's first official Little League Park, at Tenth and Tama, was named Jimmy Archer Field.

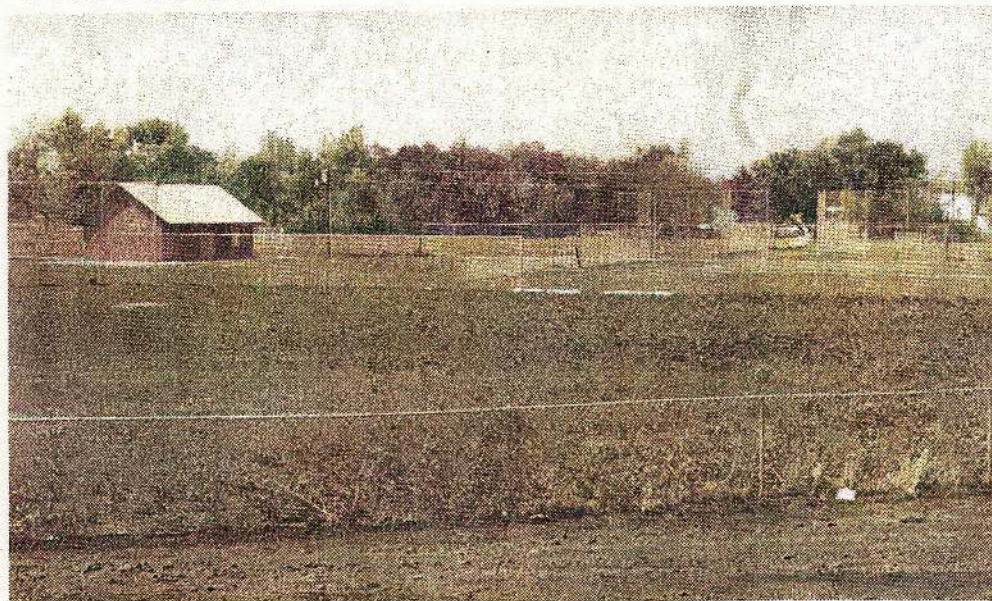

Opened Summer, 1976; Dedicated May 21, 1977

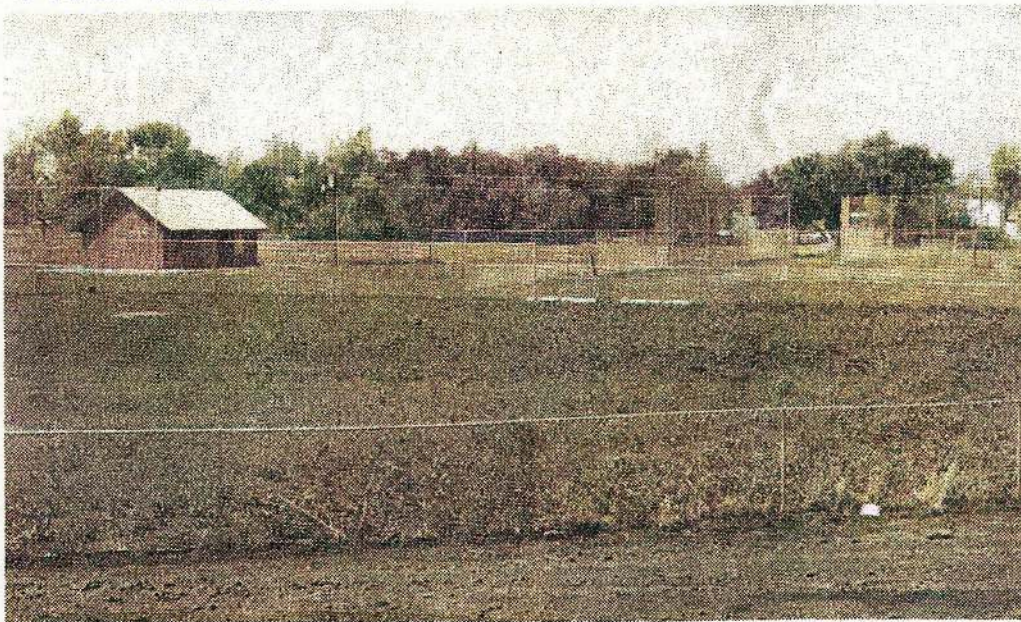

After a meager beginning of its program at McHose Park, the Boone National Little League eventually entered into an agreement with the Chicago & Northwestern railroad to use its property at Tenth and Tama streets. The rental fee was a very token amount and this agreement prevailed for over 15 years prior to a decision by the railroad that they desired to dispose of the property.

In 1974, the railroad notified Boone National Little League officials that they desired to enter into an agreement for the purchase of the Tenth and Tama site. The league, however, had no savings account for such a large outlay of money. In addition, it was starting to become apparent at this time that a softball program for young girls was also needed ... a program which it was anticipated would, perhaps, eventually become as popular as the boys youth baseball program.

It was the decision of the Board of Directors of the Boone National Little League that new site locations should be studied with the possibility of purchasing a bigger area of ground (it was felt about ten acres would be needed) so that eventually a capitol funds drive could be conducted and the result would be a new facility that could handle the growing Little League programs.

A thirty-day option for ten acres of land near College and Division streets for a total cost of \$30,000 was finally agreed to and the League started accepting pledges of money for the purchase.

The Boone National Little League then asked the Boone City Council the possibility of giving the Boone Park Board enough revenue sharing money to help purchase this plot of land and in May of 1975, the Council did agree to such a proposal and the Park Board did, indeed, purchase the land.

The Boone National Little League and the Boone Park Board then signed a written agreement as to the development of the area. An architect drew up a plan for the area that was approved by both groups and it was agreed that the Little League would develop the baseball and softball facilities while the Park Board would develop other aspects of the total plan such as a basketball court, picnic areas and a tennis court.

At this point, a mammoth fund-raising drive was started and in the spring of 1976, a construction firm started moving dirt at the new site.

Fence was purchased and erected and a concession stand-restroom complex was built and in May of 1976, the first games were played at the new facility.

In the fall of 1976, the playing areas were disked and grass was planted and in February of 1977, all the areas outside of the playing areas were seeded.

To this Dedication day and far beyond, the work will continue. Dugouts are being built, sidewalks installed, and parking lots paved.

Original estimates showed that the overall cost of developing the entire park complex would range somewhere from \$60,000 to \$110,000. According to League officials, \$30,000 doanted cash has been spent to date, along with another estimated \$10,000 in "donated machinery" time. It is now hoped that an estimated additional \$12,000 or a grand total of somewhere near \$52,000 will complete the job.

Nice going Boone.

In State finals, Ottumwa American downed Boone, 7-3. Jim Caldwell was the losing pitcher. Boone was outhit, 8-4. John Bush homered for Boone.

1958

In Area tourney here, Boone tripped South Dallas County, 7-2, as Pat Ahlstrom, Greg Davis and Terry Sparks hit homers. Boone outhit them, 8-3, as Mike Loehrer hurled the win.

In Area tourney here, Boone lost to Franklin County National, 2-1, as Terry Sparks lost a two hitter. Boone got six hits with Mike Loehrer and Dick Musser cracking two each.

In area tourney consolation game, Boone beat Denison, 15-0, as Larry Lindmark hit two homers. Boone got 13 hits and three Boone pitchers, Pat Ahlstrom, Ted Gifford and John Deal, combined for a no-hitter.

1959

Beat Franklin County National at Alexander, 2-1, as Jack Mustapha fired a two-hitter and fanned 15 men. Boone got five hits and John Hendricks had three of them.

Beat South Dallas County at Jefferson, 8-4, as Don Riker hit a grand slam homer and Roger Dutton hit another homer. Les Hohanshelt hurled a six-hitter. Boone got nine hits.

In the District final here, lost to Sac County, 4-0, as Bud Morris got Boone's only hit. Mustapha gave up five hits and fanned 11.

1960

Beat Perry here, 8-1, as Jim Brogden hurled a two-hitter and fanned nine. Bob Atherton hit a three-run homer and had five RBI. Jim Hamil added three hits as Boone totaled seven safeties.

In the Area finals here, Boone beat South Dallas on a three-hitter by Bob Atherton, 3-1. Boone got seven hits.

In the District at Jefferson, Boone beat Denison, 12-3, as Bob Atherton collected three hits. Steve Duffy, Bruce Conlin and Jim Brogden homered for Boone in a 12-hit attack.

In the District final at Jefferson, lost to Sac County, 7-3, as Jim Brogden and Bob Atherton allowed four hits. Boone got seven hits, including homers by Mike Kelso and Jim Hamil.

1961

Beat Marshalltown Nationals at Marshalltown, 9-2, as Dick Duffy hit a three-run homer and Rick Neely added three hits. Neely and Tom Peterson combined for a two-hitter and Boone collected nine hits.

At Hampton in the District, lost to Franklin County Nationals, 12-1, as they were outhit, 14-4. Dick Duffy had two hits for Boone. Duffy, Bruce Johnson and Kelly McMullan pitched for Boone.

1962

Lost to Marshalltown American, 5-4, in eight innings. Boone was outhit, 8-4. Hal Lyness had a homer and another hit for Boone. Dick Sapp and Clyde Hovick hurled for Boone.

1963

Lost to Jefferson here, 6-1. Jeff outhit them, 10-4. Roger Martin and Marty Dannatt hurled for Boone.

1964

Perry beat them at Perry, 2-1, on a two-run homer in the sixth inning. Tom Hull was the losing pitcher as he allowed two hits. Boone also got two hits.

1965

Beat Marshalltown National here, 3-0, as Rick Atherton pitched a two-hitter and fanned 10. Boone got six hits and Atherton had two of them.

Beat Marshalltown American here, 5-4, as Jay Nelson and Bob Sapp hurled. They allowed nine hits and Boone collected five hits. Nelson homered and Rick Atherton had two hits.

Lost to Jefferson, 5-4, here as Atherton and Tom Price pitched for Boone. Boone outhit them, 7-6, but Jeff had three homers. Nelson had two hits for Boone.

1966

Beat South Dallas County, 3-1, here on a five-hitter by Mike Wickman. Boone had five hits, including a two-run homer in the sixth by John Boesen and a pair of hits by Bob Anderson.

Beat Perry, 14-4, here behind an eight-hit attack. Bob Anderson hurled a five-hitter. Larry Briley had two hits for Boone and Wickman homered.

Lost to Marshalltown American here, 3-2, as Tom Rierson got Boone's only hit. Mike Wickman, the loser, allowed four hits.

1967

Beat Marshalltown American here, 8-0, as Terry Hitsman hurled a two-hitter. Boone got 10 hits and Charles Long had three of them, including a two-run homer. Ron Martin and Chuck Huffman had two hits each.

Lost to Marshalltown National, 9-8, at Marshalltown although Boone outhit them, 10-7. Marshalltown had two homers. Charles Long led Boone's attack with four hits, including a double and homer. Terry Hitsman had two doubles. Ken Bollenbaugh and Dave Collison pitched for Boone.

1968

Lost to Marshalltown American at Marshalltown in tourney opener, 14-1. Boone was limited to just three hits. Marshalltown collected eight hits off Mark Van Cannon, Ron Brown and Dave Lingren. Marshalltown led just 4-1 after five innings, but got 10 runs in the sixth frame.

1969

Beat South Dallas Co., 11-2, at Jefferson. Marlin Clemens and Roger Brown homered and Dave Briley pitched a 10-hitter.

Lost to Marshalltown American, 6-5, in 10 innings at Jefferson. Boone was outhit 10-7. Marlin Clemens had four hits for Boone.

1970

Beat Jefferson in District here, 6-4. Brian Lundberg homered, Jim Anderson had three hits and Tim Rolfes hurled a six-hitter.

Beat Marshalltown National here, 4-3, as Tim Rolfes homered and Al Knudsen hurled a five-hitter.

Beat Denison at Jefferson, 3-0, as Tim Rolfes and Rick Byriel hurled a four-hitter. Boone had six hits.

In the State meet at Carroll, lost to Fort Des Moines, 12-0, as Boone was limited to just one hit ... a single by Dave Eastlund. Tim Rolfes and Rick Byriel allowed eight hits. There were four teams in the State meet.

1971

Lost to Marshalltown, 5-4, as Matt Bass was the losing pitcher.

1972

Lost to Marshalltown, 10-0, as Boone got just one hit. Robert Kluckman was the losing pitcher.

1973

Beat Perry, 5-2.

Beat South Dallas, 3-2, in nine innings as Boone outhit them, 9-4. Wyatt Chidester was the winning pitcher.

Lost to Sac County, 7-4.

1974

Lost to Jefferson, 6-3, as Boone got just three hits.

1975

Beat Jefferson, 6-2, on Todd Feldman's four-hitter and a homer by Randy Martin.

Beat Carroll, 16-8, after trailing 5-0. Dave Dearborn was the winning relief pitcher.

Beat Sioux City, 7-2, as Feldman was the winning pitcher and hit a homer.

Lost to Storm Lake, 7-3. Dearborn and Rick Byriel pitched.

1976

Beat Jefferson, 3-1, as Brian Martin pitched a two-hitter. Boone collected only four hits.

Beat South Dallas, 13-5, behind a 12-hit attack. Eric Grove and Rick Martin homered. Kim Grove had four hits. Larry Schroeder was the winning pitcher.

Beat Sioux City Northeast, 4-2, on a four-hitter by Larry Schroeder. Boone had five hits.

Beat LeMars, 10-3, behind a 14-hit attack. Brian Martin hurled a five hitter. Tony Baldus had four hits. Rick Martin homered on the first pitch of the game.

In State, beat Davenport, Central, 3-1, on three runs in the final inning. Boone got its only three hits of the game in that final frame. Brian Martin allowed four hits in pitching the win.

Lost State Championship game, 10-1, to Des Moines Windsor Heights. Boone limited to four hits. Winning pitcher Bill Eberts fanned 16. Windsor had 13 hits off Larry Schroeder and Rick Martin.

IN SUMMARY

Boone has an overall tourney record of 34 wins and 21 losses. The Boone Little League boasted the State Runnerup team in 1957 and again in 1976. In addition, the 1970 team made it to the "Final Four".
