## Toreadors Open Baseball Season With Lop-Sided 19 to O Victory

## Orr Allows Five Hits. No Runs to Jordan School

Boone Nine Collects Thirteen Hits in Seven Inning Opening Game of Season Here.

Boone high's baseball team coasted to victory Friday after-noon over Jordan high, 19 to 0, behind the stellar five-hit pitching of righthander Roger Orr. The Boone nine collected a total of thirteen hits in seven innings of play, four of them coming from the clean-up bat of Rightfielder Bob McCormick, who nicked Jordan's Springer for two, singles, a double and a homer to lead the Toreadors with a sizzling average of .800 for his first game.

The other home run came from lead-off hitter Louie Patterson who slammed one down the leftfield foul line in the last half of the fifth inning for four bases on the second ball pitched in the Toreador half of that inning.

5 Hits, No Runs.

Orr went the seven inning route for the Toreadors and gave but five hits and four walks to prove to spectators that he held his control even though the chilly weather was against him. He wasn't in trouble at any time during the contest until the first half of the final inning when the bags were loaded with two out. He muzzled even this attempt to score by feeding Gustafson a low curve which he promptly hit to the ground to be thrown out at first and as the ball landed in First-sacker Skimoni Anderson's mitt the Toreadors had tucked the first game of the '46 season under the viçtory column with a lop-sided shutout, 19 to 0.

Only Two Errors.

Boone's fielding was above par for the afternoon, only two errors being committed and the infield functioned beautifully as they made good their only chance for a double play in the first half of the fourth inning when Second Baseman Bill Currell took Nolan's hard hit ground ball, flipped it to Shortstop Chuck Denning, who gathered it in on the dead run and fired it to first with time to spare. .Score by innings:
