Carroll Enters Senate Race on G.O.P. Platform

Stock in the Democratic party took a sharp rise today, when it was announced that Ralph Carroll, the notorious Boone High eleventh grade history teacher, would run for the United States Senate on the Republican ticket in the 1960 election. 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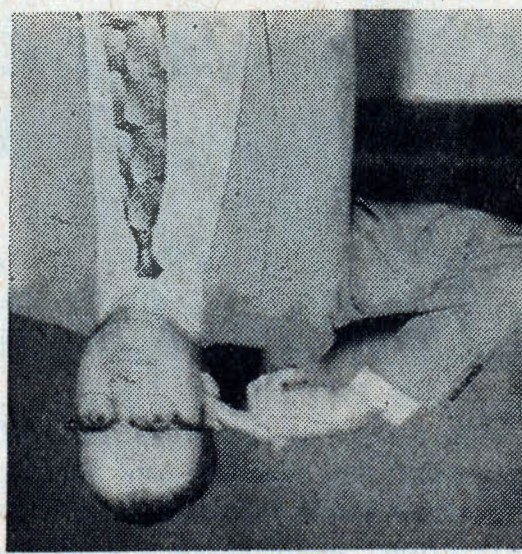
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Terence Arrives at B.S.H.

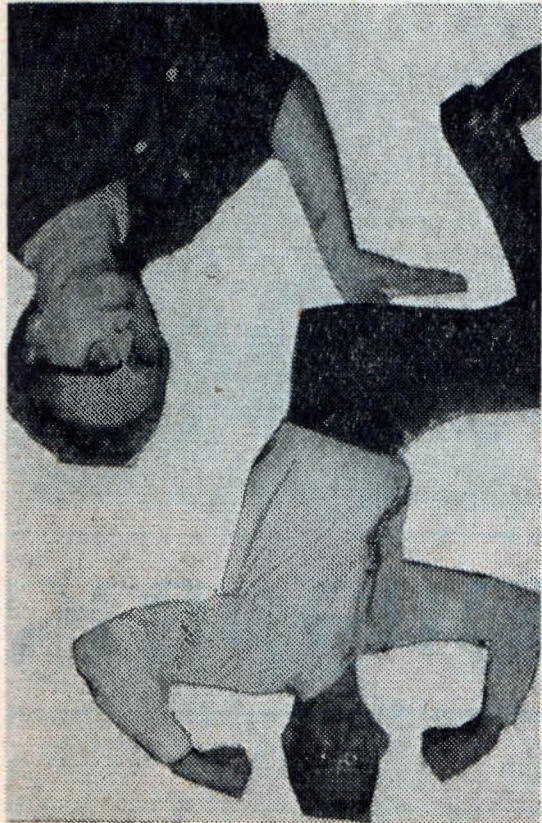
Clem Mudhopper to Play for Slosh Hop

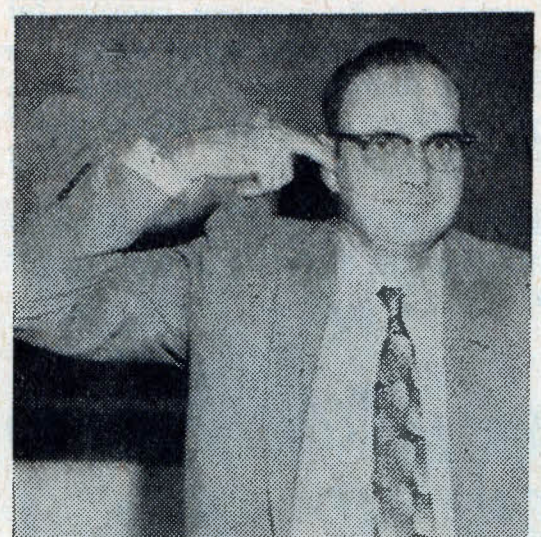

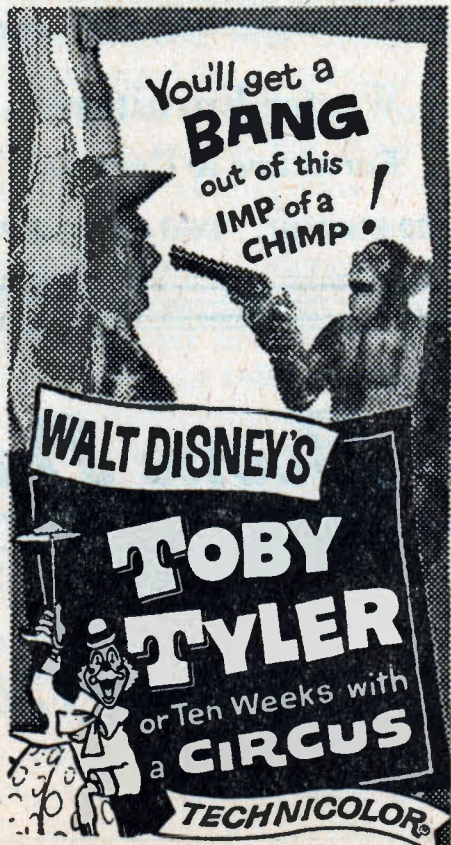

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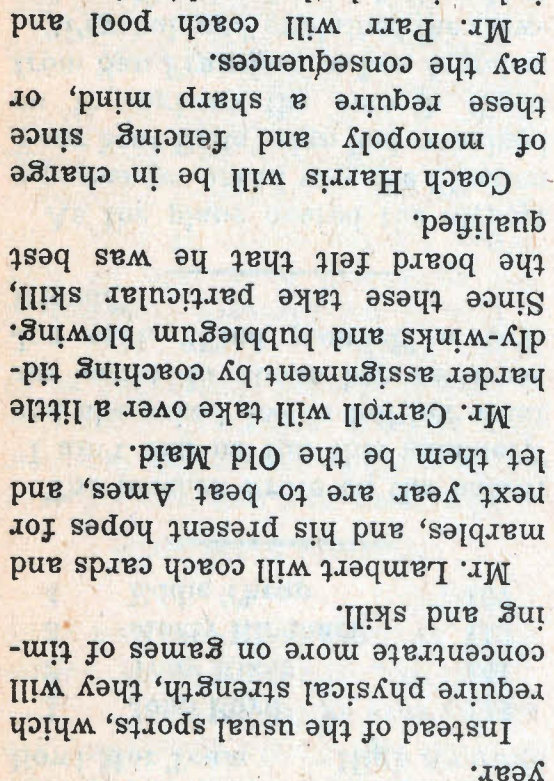
