Carroll Enters Senate Race on G.O.P. Platform

Stock in the Democratic party took a sharp rise today, when it was announced that Ralph Carroll, the notorious Boone High eleventh grade history teacher, would run for the United States Senate on the Republican ticket in the 1960 election. Carroll has become increasingly popular in G.O.P. circles in recent years by his vivid remarks concerning the party in his history classes, and through his tireless work for organizations of Republican youth groups.

Carroll was a strong supporter for the Eisenhower-Nixon ticket in the last presidential elections. His car was constantly covered with "Ike and Dick" signs, and he was even known to wear a mammoth "I Like Ike" button on his suits. Posters and large signs boasting of the presidential candidates were placed in obvious centers around his classrooms.

Carroll received considerable publicity after the last elections as a result of uncanny predictions concerning the outcome of the elections. U.S. Senate Investigates B.H.S. (U.S.S.R.) Missile Spies

It was disclosed today, in Washington, D. C., that two of Boone High School's teachers, a Mr. Ben Bruns and a Mr. Bill Devaney, are being investigated by the Senate Investigating Committee on charges of aiding the Communist government in their missile program.


