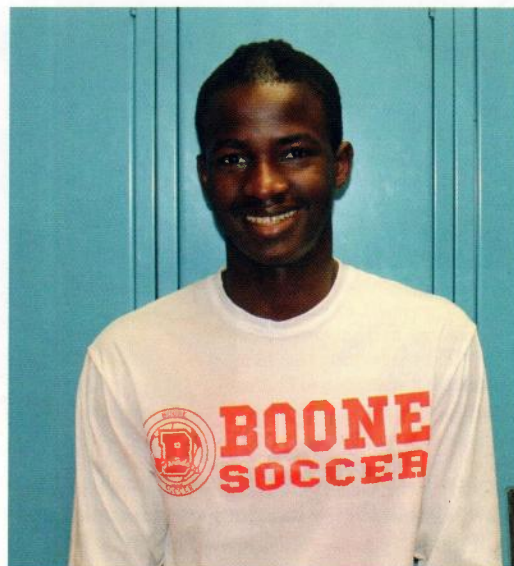
Camille Delanoe

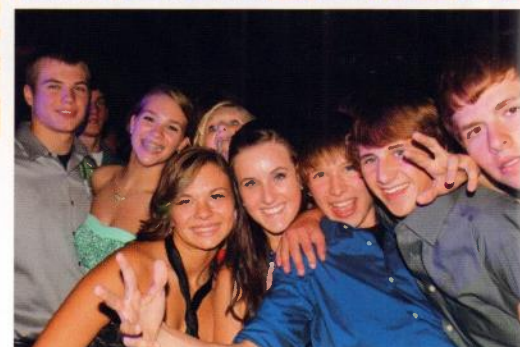

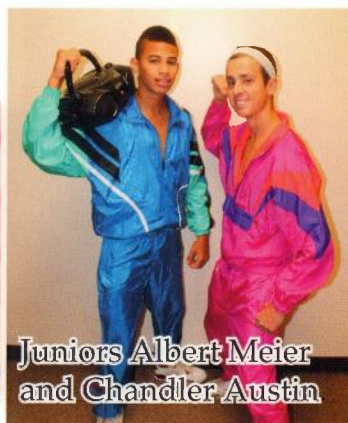

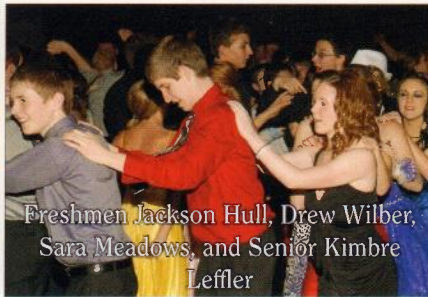

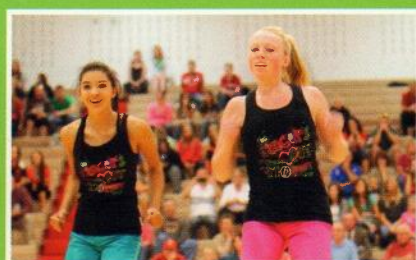

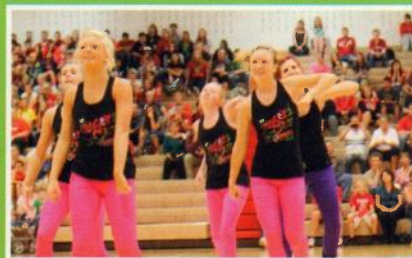

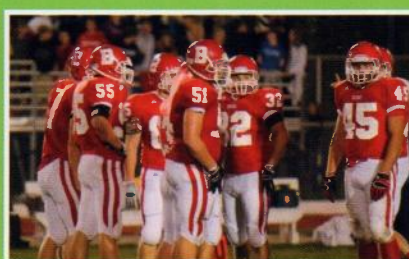

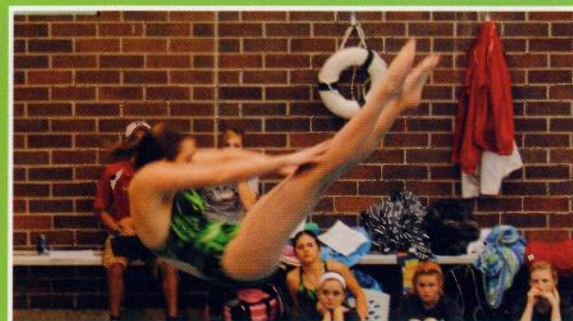

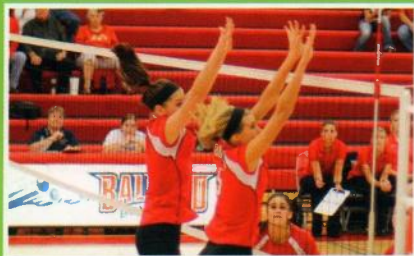

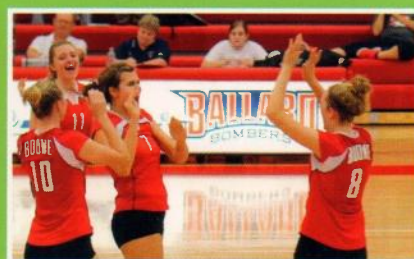
