
FOREWORD

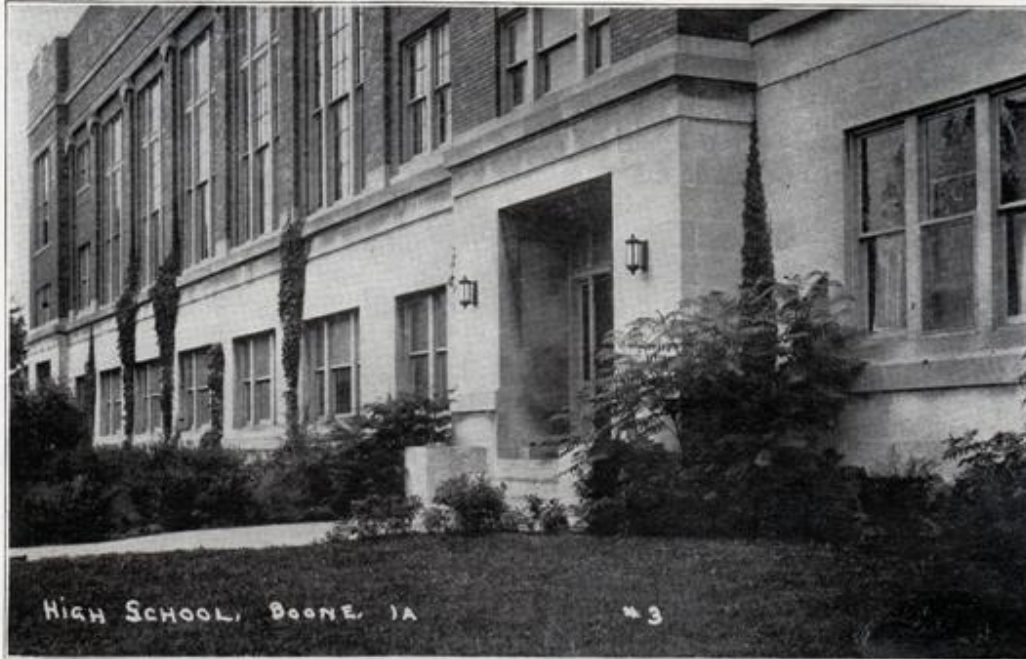

SAMUEL LOGAN MOORE

An Appreciation

A true estimate of the life and character of Samuel Logan Moore requires the perspective of years. His life, tempered by time and distance, will be more and more a commanding figure in the generations to come.

To the very last, there was about him a youthful helpfulness and buoyancy of spirit that supported him in many trials. If plans and projects on which his heart was set, miscarried, he met the disappointment with a smile which robbed it of half its power. The persistency of this hopefulness often wore out the most obstinate opposition; not visionary, but resourceful, based on confidence in himself, and most valuable quality of all, capable of inspiring confidence in others.

A man engaged in vast schemes, with many clashing interests, is sure to be misunderstood and arouse sharp hostility in many quarters. To criticize the method of his life would be presumptive. Exceptional men cannot be judged by ordinary standards; only a biased portrayal would neglect to bear testimony to his inherent kindness of heart. Busy, prosperous and so much absorbed in large projects, he might easily have slighted the call of the poor and needy whose lives are of importance only to themselves.

He had an unusual number of calls on his time and sympathy as well as his purse, and to all he responded with gracious liberality. Although he did not have much of the learning of the schools, he was an intellectual man, he read much and thought deeply, was well versed in history, and profoundly interested in boys and girls. His deficiency in scholarship was his long regret and served as an incentive to help ambitious youths. His awards of medals in declamatory contests and prizes in home economics reveal his interest in and keen appreciation of the value of such training in the schools.

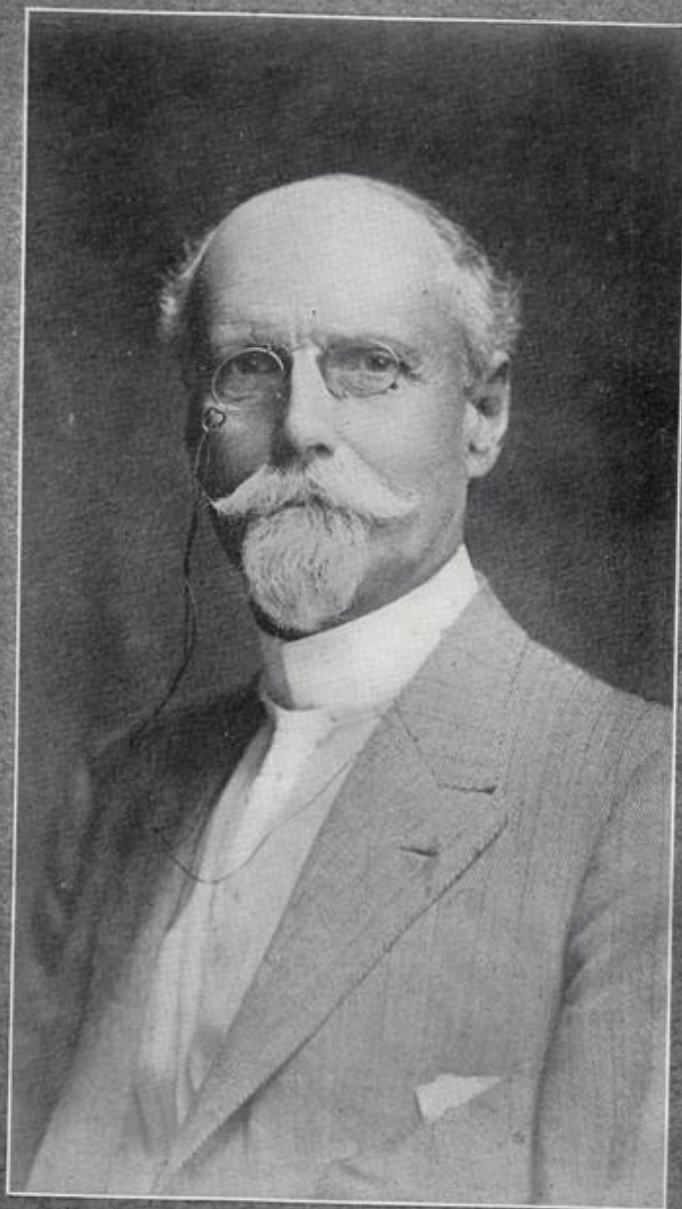
There may have been men in this community who have filled a wider space in her annals or are more closely identified with her history, but it would be hard to name a man in the past half century, who was more deeply interested in her welfare or more appreciative of her needs. He was intensely patriotic. As a soldier in the Civil War and later, by word and deed and benevolent aid during the World War, he exalted the apothegm of Edith Cavell, "Patriotism is not enough."

Not the least important service of Mr. Moore was his emphasis of lofty ideals, of which his own life was the best example. Nothing in his life became him more than the graceful way in which he grew old. He had not the usual intense opposition to all that is new, of the old. He was progressive, and put no credence in the saying, "all men are delighted to look back," for his eyes were set upon the future and before him were "visions of glorious hopes," and with it all he had that delightful serenity and equanimity of mind which is one of the blessed accompaniments of advancing age. His presence was itself a sort of benediction; his culture a refining influence, and there was about him a certain niceness of nature and honest self esteem, that well became his position and his years.

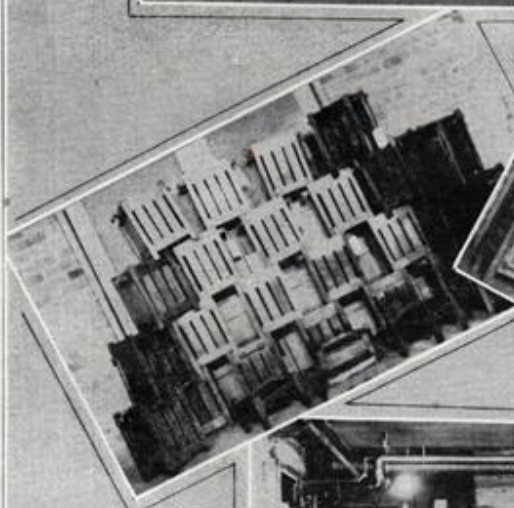
Although premature in one sense, death came after he had seen fulfilled many desires of his eyes, and to the rich life he had lived, the future could have added but little, though doubtless his restless spirit would have driven him into fresh fields.

"He went as he had come, nobly careless of himself, thinking only of the things he had endeavored to do." In the fullness of years, each of his many associates and friends can say, as did the elder Bagehot of his son, "I should never have known how great a man he was, had I not survived him."

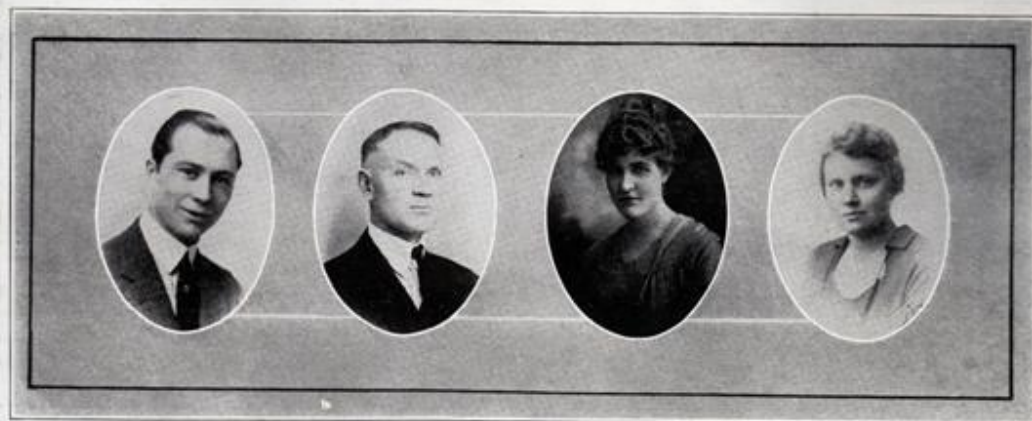

SCHOLARSHIP MEDAL

BOONE HIGH SCHOOL COURSE OF STUDY

To the average high school student the course of study represents subjects which he **must** take and one or two that he is permitted to choose for electives. But to others the course of study represents the standard of the school. Boone ranks high with six courses, namely Commercial, which has the largest enrollment, Scientific, which is a close second, Latin, History, Normal Training and Social Science.

This past year three new studies were offered to the seven hundred and twenty-seven pupils. One hundred students accepted a six weeks course in Public Speaking taught by Mrs. Gray.

Through the efforts and desires of the town people four classes were organized in Bible Study. Miss Fisher of the Y. W. C. A., Mrs. Whitehill, Rev. Frost and Rev. Travis donated their services willingly as teachers.

The Bumble "B" Staff under the direction of Miss Cruikshank, the staff advisor, formed a class in Journalism.

Never before in the history of our school have the people outside of the school, merchants, various clubs and individuals shown as much interest in the welfare of the students as they have the past year. Seven medals have been offered to the graduating class in order to stimulate and improve the scholarship in Boone High School.

Gold medals have been offered by the Woman's Club, Lions Club, Rotary Club, and Chamber of Commerce to the persons doing the best work in English, Science, Mathematics, Commercial and Social Science respectively. A general scholarship medal goes to the "B" man with the highest average. These prizes are not only for the year 1922 but the donors are planning to continue them year after year.

The D. A. R. offers for the second time their bronze medals for exceptional work in American History. As an incentive to patriotism the two D. A. R. Chapters have also presented to the High School a large silk flag and a smaller state flag.

Prizes of five dollars, two dollars and three of one dollar were awarded to the students writing the best essays on "What Two Years of Prohibition Has Done for United States," and "Why the High School Student Should Fight the Cigarette," by the W. C. T. U.

Miss Frances B. Mason gave to the winner of the annual local extemporaneous contest a prize of five dollars.

With all these inducements for good work in school there is a wide field for competition and a chance for each to show the best that is in him.

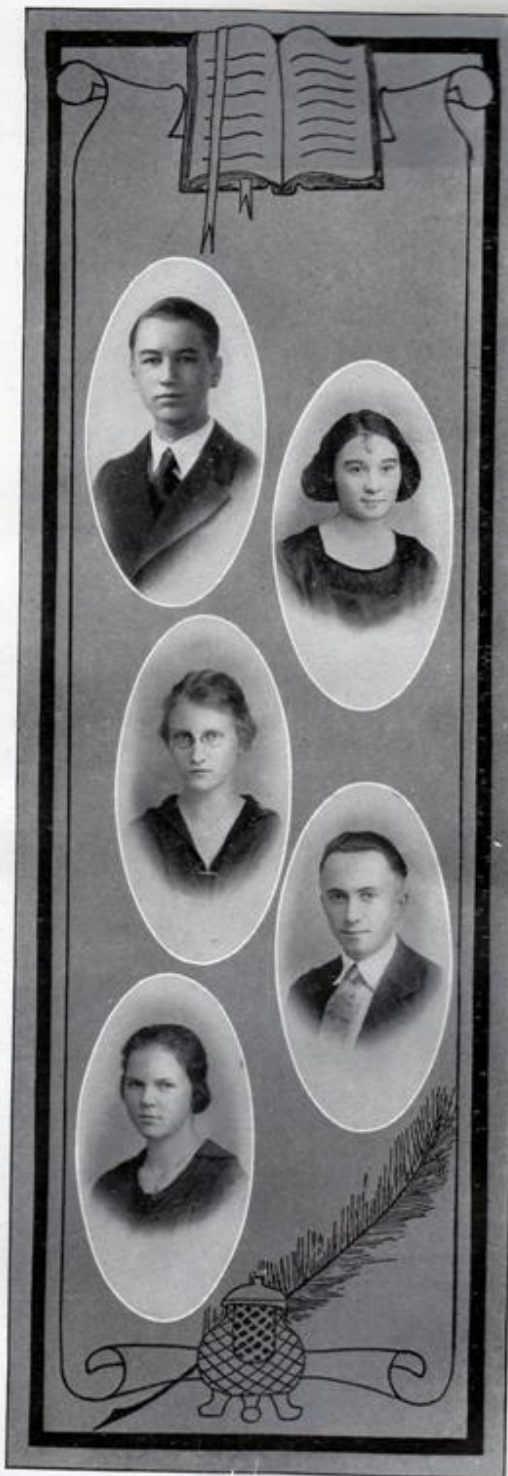

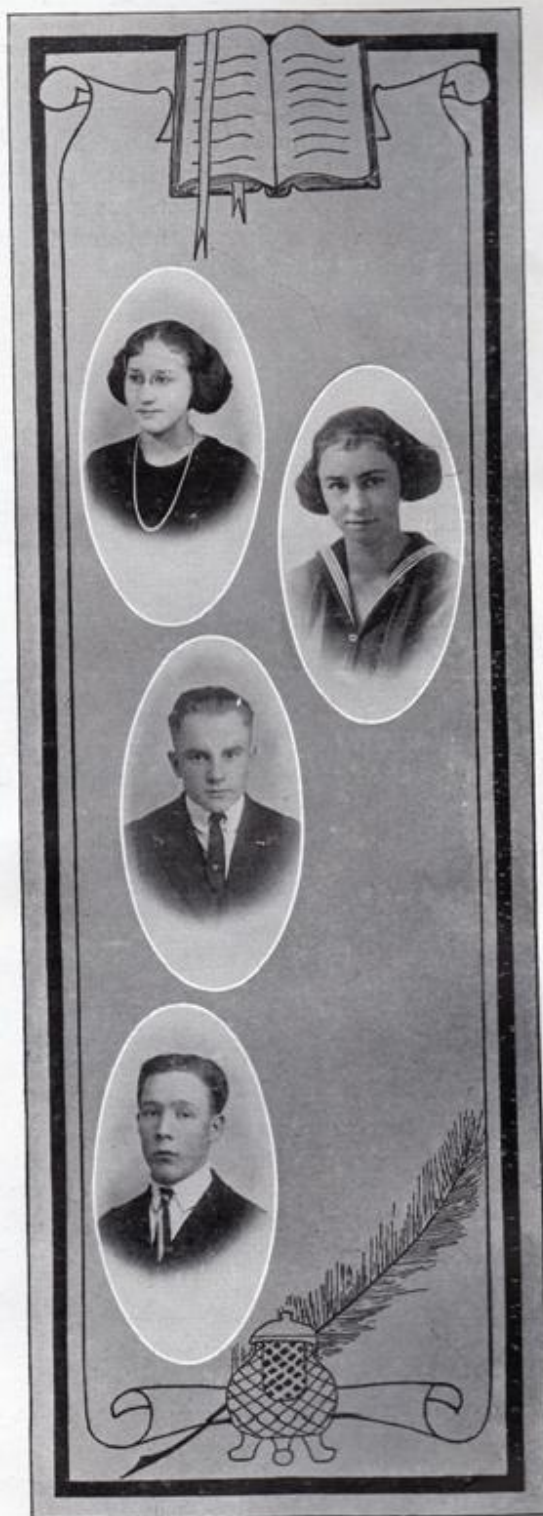
