Boone High Class of 1928 attend anniversary reunion

Fifty seven out of one hundred thirty eight graduates of the 1928 graduating class of Boone High School held their 50th anniversary reunion in Boone on May 26, 27 and 28th. Members came from 15 states and represented over fifty percent of those still living. Classmates from as far away as both coasts attended.
