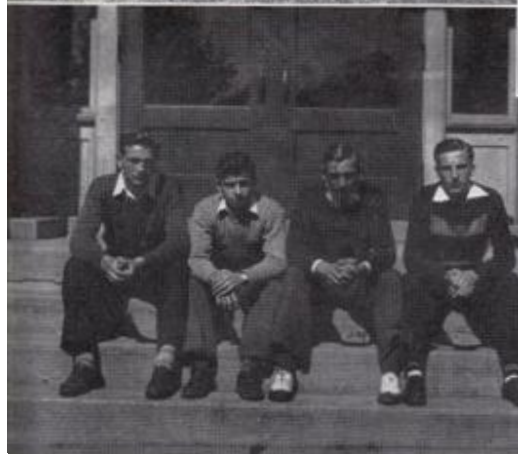

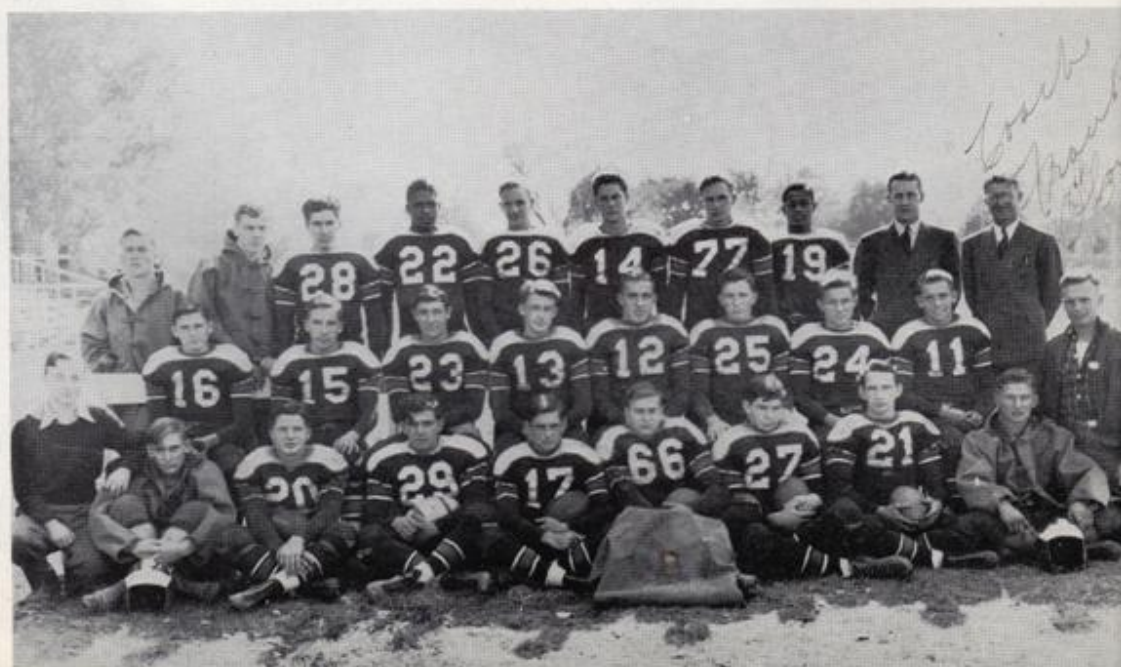


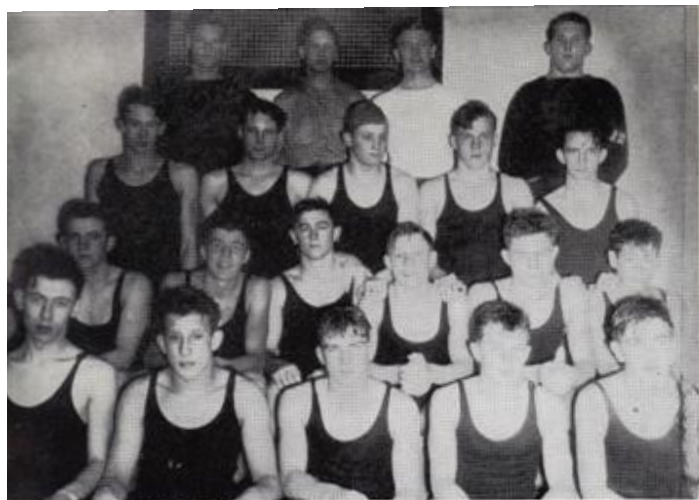
Varsity Football

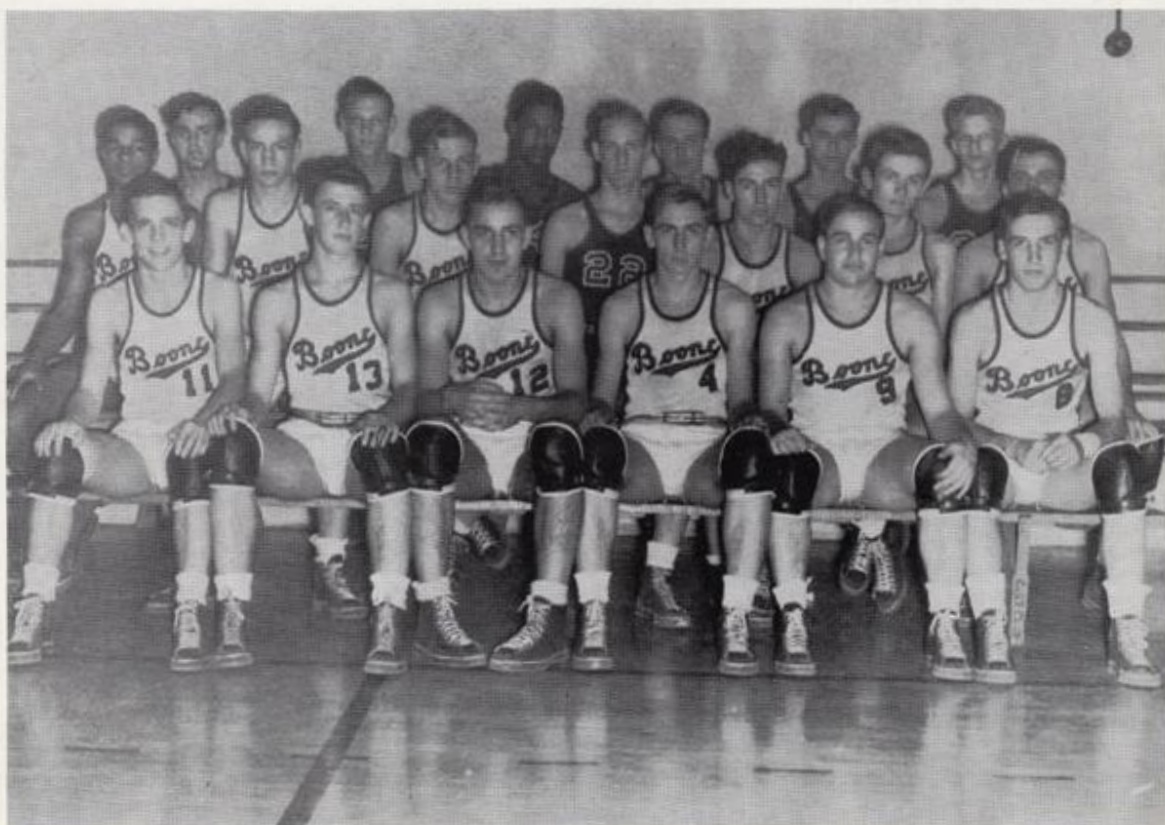

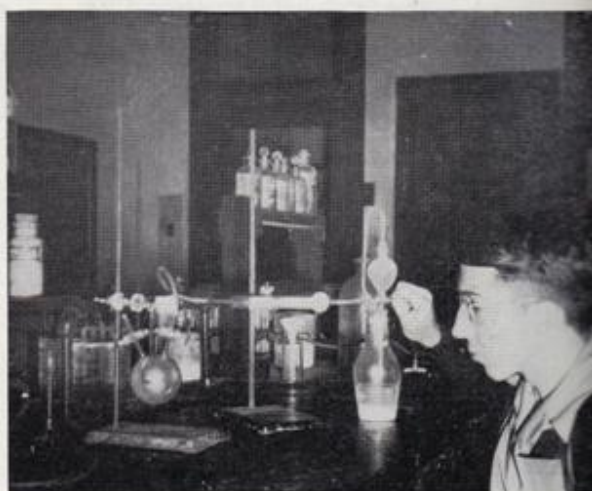


