

Administrative Leaders

The supervisors and faculty have unselfishly given much of their time and service towards the war effort. Besides the regular duties of running a school, they have put many war-time programs into effect. You will find them all doing war work outside of their school hours.

The Victory Corps, a national program for high school students interested in helping attain victory, is under the supervision of Mr. Laurance Evans. Assisting the principal of our high school in this program is Mr. Jack Fisher, vice-principal. Both Mr. Evans and Mr. Fisher, with the faculty members Mr. Heggen and Mr. Longnecker, are members of the Iowa State Guard.

Mr. Evans was also the chairman of a committee that set up the Elks National Defense School. This instruction, based on naval aeronautics and navigation, proved to be very advantageous to the boys on entering the Naval Air Corps. The boys met semi-weekly for ten weeks under the instruction of H. L. Cunningham.

Adults who desired special training for war occupations have the night school open to them. Such subjects as typing, shorthand, and a course in machine shop have been taught by the high school faculty. Spanish also was offered because of our growing interest in South American countries.

The faculty by adapting their varied talents have found a definite place in our war program. Many have been busy instructing students in first aid, Red Cross life-saving, and physical fitness. Regular recreational hours leading to better health have been organized. Bad-minton, pingpong, swimming, boxing, and basketball became very popular with the students through the efforts of faculty members. Others have assisted and encouraged the students in scrap drives.

Mr. Van Ness is to be commended for the efficient way he directed the faculty in handling the issuing of the ration books. Over eleven thousand copies of Ration Book Number Two were issued in the record time of three days. Mr. Van Ness, superintendent of Boone Public Schools, arranged the program of adult education for the benefit of the community.

Our school has been cooperating with Iowa State College and the Office of War Information in showing a series of twelve motion pictures. These government productions deal with the war and Pan-American relations.

The armed forces have enrolled many of our teachers. To date there are six members of the Boone High School faculty serving Uncle Sam. Frank O'Conner and George Adams are serving in the Air Corps. Claire Watson and William Hartley belong to the Signal Corps. Mr. Hartley, the last we heard, is in North Africa. Wayne Hill is in the Navy, and Dale Moore is serving in the Quartermaster Corps.



Student Body Leaders

The Student Council is an organization which gives the members experience in good citizenship by permitting them a certain amount of authority in school government. The developing of leadership is of special value in such an organization. Boone High's Council is chosen in a democratic way in that each student is allowed to exercise his right of suffrage. The Council is composed of the presidents of the various home rooms. Each year new student council officers are elected, a president, vice-president, and secretary. At present these of-ficers are: Les McIntyre, Willis Biggerstaff, and Florine Wheeler. Some of the objects of the Student Council are: to represent the ideas and ideals of the student body; to develop a greater spirit of democracy; and to promote the welfare of the institution. Before any administrative idea is brought before the Student Council as a body, it is the duty of the Executive Board to pass it. This board is made up of the three officers of the Student Council plus five more members: Betty Donovan, Jack Schroeder, Jacques Welin, Jean Berry and Marcia Standlev.

The Building Committee, a subdivision of the Student Council, has several duties. These are: ushering at football and basketball games, checking lockers, handling master keys, and promoting the various ticket selling campaigns. The council itself devised these duties for the Committee.

Henry Wallace, Jr., is the sophomore class president; Les McIntyre is the president of the Student Council; Don Benson, president of the senior class; and Bill Smith, president of the junior class. Along with his other school activities, Henry, "Hank," has shown a definite interest in football. Les, although primarily interested in sports-football, basketball, and baseball-has managed to find some time to write the sports column for the Bumble "B," as well as to sing in the Boys' Glee Club and Mixed Chorus. Bill, also interested in athletics, has shown great success in both football and basketball. He has been a member of the student council and president of his home room. Donald has been the class president and student leader of the present senior class for the last three years. He has been a cheer leader, member of the Student Council, and is active in almost every phase of school life.

Our War Effort

During the years of 1942 and 1943 the nation has gone all-out for Victory. Our school, likewise, has devoted most of its time for a more complete and decisive victory over the enemy. The war effort program of B. H. S. corresponds almost exactly with the war efforts of high schools all over the country. In recognition of this, the school kept a scrapbook of the activities of the various home rooms and classes. The work of the classes included patriotic essays, Red Cross work, bond and stamp sales, and scrap collections of all kinds: needles, pins, iron, silks, tinfoil, buttons, rubber, radios, rags, paper and many other things. The bond and stamp booth that the second year Latin class sponsored has done a very good piece of work in stimulating the sale of stamps and bonds. They have sold over eight thousand dollars worth since last fall.

The most important part of our war effort is, however, the High School Victory Corps. It is a national organization suggested by the United States government for all the High School War Effort programs in the country. There are four different divisions—Air Service, Land Service, Production Service and Community Service. Each division is headed by a Chief and Assistants who are faculty members, and a Leader and Assistants who are student members. Maurice Hagaleen and Gerald Pepper, Chief and Assistant Chief, respectively, of the entire corps, were elected at large. The following are the faculty chiefs and student leaders of each division:

For each service there are special requirements in school subjects and a general requirement of five hours per week of physical training and two hours weekly of Military Drill or Community Service. The Military Drill takes place at the Armory on Tuesday evening, but for Community Service there are many jobs from which to choose. Probably the most popular is the Nurses' Aid. Around twenty-five girls signed up for it. They report they find their work very interesting, but this isn't unusual because most of them plan to become nurses themselves. Many members fill in required time at the Red Cross work rooms. Here they roll bandages, cut out clothing, and sew. Others attend classes in first aid, life-saving, and civilian defense. Those who wished to be blood donors were sorry to hear that the Boone County Hospital didn't have facilities for storing and classifying blood plasma. They were relieved, however, when they learned that arrangements had been made for representatives from the University of Iowa to come here June 1 for their donations. The ration board has also provided many hours of work for many students.

The enlistment dates were January 11-15, and there are now approximately one hundred and fifty in the corps. To each member an emblem of his branch of service was given. The Boone High Victory Corps is a great success and has done a great deal in furthering the war effort in this community.





Junior

The Scarlet Masquers, the dramatic group in junior high, deserve a great deal of praise for their Christmas play, "Las Pasada." The play embodied the three main Christmas customs of Mexico—the nacimiento, a representation of the property of the p manger scene; the pinata; and the song "Las Pasadas," which was sung by the senior high

Bob Barstad was president and John Miles was secretary of the Monday group, and Elaine Holst and Gail Mickle were the officers of the Wednesday group.

The junior high student council is part of the senior high council. These students are the presidents of the various home rooms and are learning early in school life the true meaning of democracy.

Scholastic achievement, leadership, and service are recognized each semester when the Goeppinger award winners are announced. Mid-year recipients of the award this year were Maxine Erickson and Dean Waychoff. Winners of this award for the semester ending in the spring of '42 were Earl Thompson and Betty Wiernsberger.

It certainly is not uncommon to hear remarks made about the post-war world in which the wives will earn the living, and the husbands will clean and cook. If such a thing were to happen, these boys in the cooking class won't be unprepared.

Those boys in junior high who start shooting baskets and guarding their "pals" are the ones who make the varsity squad. The boys are not only the only ones interested in basketball. Several evenings a week the junior high girls were in possession of the floor.






