It was nearing the end of August, and "Back to signs were in all of the stores. We noticed some rather queer looking characters wandering around the day of the Oskaloosa game. These were the Pep Club initiates, and the afternoon was enlivened by an assembly in which they did stunts. The whole school was proud of our Student Council when they were hosts to the State Student Council Conference on September 25th. Boone High celebrated the last day of September by electing class officers.

In October the B-Y-Ettes welcomed their new members with a covered dish dinner at the Y. W. C. A. There was real trouble the Saturday night the Hi-Y Club had their hay ride. A broken axle, a flat tire, and a broken wheel left the boys \$15 in debt. Everyone had fun, though, except a few hay fever sufferers. Dr. Olson entertained us in assembly with his program, "America the Beautiful," which renewed our appreciation of this scenic country. Other noteworthy events in October were Homecoming Day (which was celebrated in the usual bang-up fashion), and the Scroll campaign.

School elections November 2nd proved that Boone High agreed with the rest of the nation because we, too, elected President Truman. Characters stepped right out of Lil' Abner comic strip when the girls escorted the boys to the Sadie Hawkins dance. Those with the best costumes were rewarded with brightly colored lollipops. On Armistice Day an address by Mr. Lant Doran helped us "to remember." After weeks of rehearsals a capable cast presented the all-school play "Growing Pains," to a large audience. Then there was an interesting assembly program on liquid air which was explained to us by Dr. Brown. But best of all was the opening of the basketball season. The girls got a head start when they played Gowrie, November 16th. A victory over Perry on the 19th started the boys out with a bang. Just before Thanksgiving vacation Hi-Trı sponsored a Junior High Religious Emphasis Week with devotionals each morning.

In December C. E. Jones, who succeeds in interesting us in some phase of science every year, returned for a lecture on sound. Working for better international understanding, the Hi-Tri Club sponsored an assembly featuring three foreign students from Iowa State College. December 18th was a red-letter day for the girls' basketball team, as they defeated Ogden in the finals of the county tournament. The Christmas season was heralded with the usual gaiety. However, a solemn note was furnished by the impressive Christmas concert given by the band, orchestra, and chorus. The halls of Boone High were quiet during the next two weeks while the students and faculty enjoyed their Christmas vacation.

In an impressive candle-light ceremony on January 13th, the National Honor Society initiated new members. It was a grand day for some people. Our team played against Newton on the evening of January 13th. To our disappointment we were defeated. The week from the 24th to 28th was Religious Emphasis Week sponsored by the Inter-Church Youth Council. Rev. Lacour spoke at a series of senior high assemblies on subjects of interest to high school students. On January 26th a marionette show, "The King of the Golden River," was presented to both junior and senior high.

Music filled the air in February, when the high school symphony orchestra presented their annual concert. Since Hi-Tri had outgrown the Y.W.C.A. they moved to the city hall for the first meeting of the second semester. On the 9th and 16th of February preliminary speech contests were held. Another contest, the state swimming meet, was held in Iowa City on February 19th. Now you see it—now you don't. That's exactly what happened on February 21st when the Arnolds, well-known magicians, entertained us.

March got off to a bad start when we lost to Webster City in the District Basketball Tournament on March 3rd. The Y. W. groups sponsored a service in observance of "World Day of Prayer" on March 14th. Our high school concert band gave a program on March 7th. A second musical treat during the month was a concert by the Iowa State College Chorus. Small groups and soloists from the music department met their first competition at Gowrie on March 15th. Recognition was given to the winners of major awards in sports when they were initiated into the "B" Club on March 27th. Football, basketball, and swimming letters for this year were awarded at an assembly on March 24th. On March 25th the Ritz Trumpeteers presented a varied musical program to the combined junior-senior high assembly.

April was ushered in by the last 1,000 Club concert presented by the high school vocal department. "Sorority House," the senior class comedy, appeared on the stage of the auditorium the following Friday, April 8th. The wings of time sped on to April 15 when the school clocks were stopped for two wonderful days of vacation—Good Friday and Easter Monday. Following fast on the heels of spring vacation was the opening of the student political campaign on Tuesday, April 19th. The victors took office April 28th and governed Boone for a day. The new faces seen in Boone High on April 22nd and 23rd were students entered in the state speech contest. This year the Hi-Tri decided to make the club's annual banquet a mother-daughter affair, April 26th.

The Dolphin Club chose the four seasons of the year as the theme for their water carnival on May 4th and 5th. Boone High musicians trekked to Mason City on April 30th for district contest, and the winners there went to Perry to participate in the state contest on May 8th and 9th. For students who had worked hard all year and had done outstanding work, induction into the National Honor Society on May 12, proved to be ample reward. Also reaping the fruits of their labors were those journalism students who had met Quill and Scroll's requirements. On May 23rd the Senior Class Day Exercises were held and the senior picnic was held the afternoon of the same day. Doctor Lister, pastor of First Methodist Church, gave an impressive sermon at the baccalaureate service, May 29th. The halls were quiet again on Monday for the observance of Memorial Day. Tuesday, May 31st, was that crowning day—Commence-ment! Ah, at last—a diploma in hand!!
