

Out under the sun on summer days We see our golfers, strong and skilled; Johnson, Moffitt, and Shultz are they. "Form" and fame they've been able to build.


In basketball and football, too, And on the track you'll discover Two junior boys; one's name is Glenn, And Arlo is his brother.





# Football Team

The Toreadors opened the '48 grid season against the powerful Roosevelt Roughriders, the city champions of Des Moines. Roosevelt, using a tricky offense and an air-tight defense, sent the locals down to defeat with a score of 28-0. Outstanding for Boone were Bob Powers at tackle and Don Houser in the backfield.

Fed by the accurate passing of Virgil Byerly, Boone completely outclassed the Webster City eleven by the score of 33-0. In this game the Toreadors gave warning that they would be hard to beat during the rest of the season.

Entering conference play, Boone toyed with the Cskaloosa Indians, finally winning 14-0. The outcome was never in doubt, as the local eleven dominated the game from the opening kickoff.

Marshalltown's big line and hard-charging backfield finally wore down the hard-fighting Toreadors. After a fairly even first quarter, vaunted Marshalltown power plays clicked for 3 touchdowns, making the final score 19-0. Jack Blanshan's rugged play at guard was the outstanding feature for Boone.

Rebounding from this defeat, the "Red & Green" steamrollered hapless Grinnell, 39-0. The entire team looked impressive in gaining their second conference victory while adding to Grinnell's grid woes.

An undefeated, untied, and unscored upon Carroll team provided the opposition at Boone's homecom-

ing. The Toreadors played well before the alumni but had to settle for a 6-6 tie with the tough Carroll aggregation.

Heavily-favored Newton was happy to leave the field with a 20-6 victory over an inspired band of Toreadors. The play of Everett Long in the line was again outstanding on defense.

The final game of the season brought the traditional encounter with the Ames High Little Cyclones. Ames got off to a quick 7-0 lead only to see the score tied on Houser's touchdown and Adamson's perfect placekick. In the fourth quarter the battle-weary Toreadors wilted under Ames' powerful running attack and finally succumbed by the score of 28-7. Long and Linderblood looked good on defense while Byerly and Houser led the offensive parade for Boone.

At the season's end when the sports writers gathered to select their all-state team, Boone's rugged center, Everett Long, came in for a good share of the glory. Jack North selected Long on his third all-state team. This is the highest honor to be received by a Boone footballer in the past decade. Head Coach Larry Baldus put in a season of hard work with his boys, developing them into a fighting team. Line Coach Vern Elslager worked his men into a tough bunch of linemen while Howard Stutzman scouted the other towns for the team. All in all, these three coaches made the Toreadors do their stuff.

## Boys' Basketball

With only one returning veteran from the team that carried Boone to the state finals last year, the Boone High Toreadors underwent a complete remodeling under the guidance of newcomer Gayle Johnson. Starting from scratch, the local cagers developed a lightning-fast break and an almost impregnable zone defense that carried them victoriously through 11 out of 19 games.

Against a highly-regarded Perry five, the new Toreadors got their first taste of battle as they literally swept their opponents off the floor in a 51-30 victory. Carroll, and conference foe Grinnell, also felt the sting of defeat at the hands of Boone before we were defeated by Oskaloosa and Webster City.

The game of the year was that with the Ames "Little Cyclones" who thought they were good enough to spot Boone points. The five Toreadors proved that they were a team to be reckoned with; and when center Robert Powers hit a field goal in the last four seconds, the locals were victorious, 27-26.

A stalling Newton team put the brakes on Boone's free-wheeling offense; and even with Virgil Byerly's brilliant performance, Boone dropped their second conference tilt.

Ames came to Boone determined to teach the Toreadors a lesson. However, with our Boone cagers displaying an almost perfect defense and a sparkling offense we rolled to a 41-36 victory.

All hopes of retaining our conference crown won

in 1948 were dashed to bits as on successive Friday nights Marshalltown and Newton stopped the Toreadors.

Coming back strong in late-season play, Boone dropped Clinton and Cedar Falls before they entered tournament play,

Drawing Webster City for first-round play, the Toreadors gave all they had in an effort to continue in the tournament. But Webster City's ability to shoot over our zone, and connect, turned the game in their favor; and Boone's basketball season was ended.

The brunt of the Toreador attack was carried by seven boys who were used interchangeably. They were Virgil Byerly, Paul Stark, Donald Houser, Robert Powers, Richard Bechtel, Eldon Krug, and Warren Morris. Boone's Virgil Byerly was one of the finest guards in the state. Virgil was the team's leading scorer, defensive ace, and a consistent driver in every game. He was elected captain at the end of the season and was honored by being placed on Jack North's fifth all-state team and I.D.P.A. honor roll. Paul Stark, a junior who performed brilliantly for Boone, was also placed on I.D.P.A.'s honor roll. With the selection of the all Central Iowa Conference teams it was Virgil Byerly again who received top honors. Virgil was awarded a forward position on the first team. For his fine performance at center, Robert Powers won honors on the second team at that position. Paul Stark added to his laurels with a guard position on the third team. Honorable mention was given to Donald Houser and Richard Bechtel.















## Girls' Basketball

Keeping up with their big brothers, the Boone High Toreadorettes tipped the victory scales in their favor this year as they emerged from the 1948-1949 season with nine victories and seven defeats.

The team, under the tutorage of Mr. Noel Jones, had the entire squad returning from the previous year. Opening their season against Gowrie, the girls showed flashes of ability; but as they were not able to keep a sustained drive going they fell, 47-45. The girls' hopes were dashed again the following week as they lost to Valley at Des Moines, but they bounced back against a previously undefeated Grand Junction team to notch their first victory.

For the fourth consecutive year the girls moved through the county tournament and captured the championship trophy. As always Napier supplied the main opposition, but Boone's insatiable hunger for victory won them the thrilling battle, 57-55. In one of the highest scoring games in the state, Boone and Paton waged a furious basket duel with the Toreadorettes on the short end of an 86-64 count. Forward Alice Fisher set a school record

for total points scored in a regular season game as she bombarded the basket for 42 counters. A strong Coon Rapids team attempted to protect a five-year victory record on their home floor, but Boone's attack was so forceful that the game ended in a 53-48 victory for Boone.

Moving into sectional tournament play, the Toreadorettes literally chased a hapless Woolstock sextette off the floor as they moved into the semifinals with a 48-17 victory. In a nip-and-tuck overtime battle, Stanhope ousted the locals, thus putting them into the consolation against defending state champions, Kamrar. Boone fell before the champs, 63-58, but only after a fierce battle for supremacy.

The girls completed their season on a high note as they dropped both Eldora and Gilbert.

It would be hard to point out an outstanding player on the team for all the girls were capable of playing fine basketball. With the selection of all-state teams, mid-semester graduate Alice Fisher, who maintained a 30-point scoring average to lead her team, was placed on both Jack North's and the I.D.P.A.'s honor roll.




## Swimming


