

Marriage and family



In 2004 I retired and have loved every minute of my retirement.


I have spent winters in Garden, Florida with my sister who has a second home there. We were really glad to be in Florida this winter!


We have 2 children. Michele is married to Pete Konigsberg and they have three boys Ian (4), Logan (3) and Ben (1).

After graduation from Boone High, I attended Iowa State University (ISU) from fall 1960 until spring 1966, receiving a BS (1964) and MS (1966) in electrical engineering. At the initial freshman assembly at ISU there were 330 smiling, expectant faces; however, four years later, 90 were left to graduate.

As I neared the end of my time at ISU, I began the interviewing process. It was a particularly crappy March that year, cold and freezing rain (the usual), when I arrived in Phoenix Arizona to visit GE computers. I got off the plane and it was 85 degrees, sun shining, green grass, and palm trees swaying in the balmy breeze. I decided to take whatever job GE offered including janitor. It turned out GE was a really good company and I learned a lot there, including earning a PhD in EE at Arizona State University (ASU) in May 1971.

During my PhD research (1966-1971), I began development of Operational Evaluation Modeling (OpEM) that is a graphical language based on parallel processing language concepts and mathematical linguistics in order to be able to model concurrent process interactions and multiple instantiation of parallel threads. This language was first described in my 1971 PhD dissertation, "A Top-Down Analysis Technique for Parallel Systems Using Continuous Time Markov Models." Subsequently, the language notation was converted to its present graphical form in 1975 to make it more intelligible to general audiences.

Models based on the OpEM graphical language have been successfully used for 40+ years in industry, government, and academe to perform operational modeling of complex systems. Early simulation models (1975-1988) were developed by using the OpEM FORTRAN programming system that I develop while working as a US Navy weapons systems analyst. During this time, US Navy destroyers, carrier battle groups, and the Trident Submarine simulations were developed by me and my project team in order to evaluate combat system effectiveness.

Next, models were developed using the OpEM Pascal Programming system (1982-1996) developed by myself and my Rockwell mission analysis team. Some of OpEM Pascal models included a Sonar Array System model. The OpEM Pascal Simulation Programming System was transformed into the ExtendSim (Imagine That Inc.) graphical simulation format starting in 1996. I published in spring 2009 a Wiley Interscience textbook "Simulation-Based Engineering of Complex Systems" that discusses many ExtendSim models.

I started teaching part time 1976 for Chapman College and full time in 1982 for California State University Fullerton. Since teacher's pay is not near enough to live in So Cal, I always had a part job or consulting gig to make ends meet. I worked for Rockwell International and Raytheon to mention two of them.

I married Nancy Wikre in March 1964; we had three children (Dawn, Valerie, Tanya); and we were divorced in 1975. Subsequently, I met and married the true love of my life, **Dorothea Bedinger Walker**. **Dea's 5** kids plus my 3 plus 1 grandchild we raised resulted in an interesting life together (Chinese curse "May you live in interesting times"). We both love classical music; opera, books and reading, and we have never stopped talking about everything. These days we garden, do genealogy, make quilts, read, and otherwise hang **out at Border's**.
