

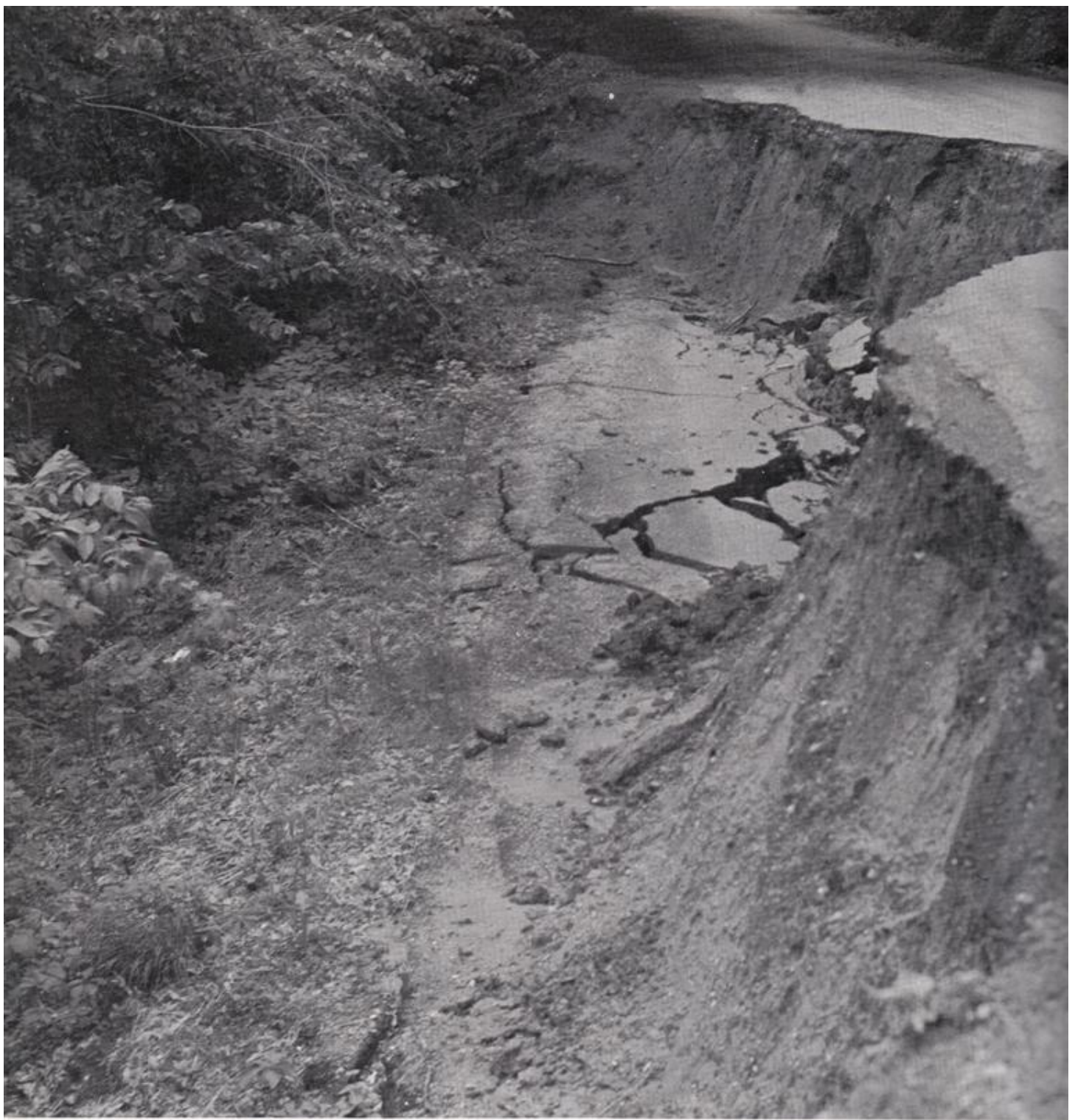

Through the generosity of Louis Goepfinger as provided in his will, awards of ten dollars or a gold medal are made annually to members of the Boone Junior High who have completed the ninth grade and whose average semester grades fall in the upper ten per cent of their class.

The awards were first instituted in 1923-24. Two girls and two boys out of the sophomore class received this award up until 1957, when, with the approval of the Goepfinger Estate, pin awards were given to each of the top ten per cent of girls and boys.

A committee consisting of the superintendent, high school principal, and one member of the junior high faculty, determine the students to whom awards are presented.

Eligibility is considered only for those who have attended Boone Junior High for at least four semesters. General attitude and conduct are important factors in addition to scholastic rank.



SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

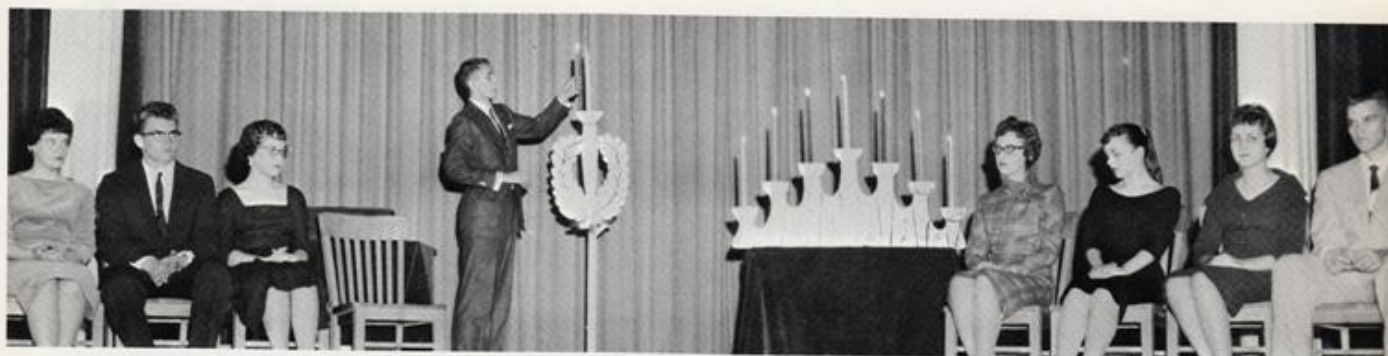
