





Orchestra

The highlight of orchestra activities this year was the appearance of the group before the Music Educators National Conference in Minneapolis on March 31. An unusual aspect of the concert was the appearance of four wind instrument soloists from the Edina, Minnesota, High School who played difficult compositions with our orchestra. In addition to the solos, the orchestra performed the "Messiah" overture by Mozart, "Pictures For Suzanne" by Pyle and "Cathedral" by its conductor, Mr. Scholl. This was the fourth appearance of a Boone orchestra before a national convention of music educators since 1950.

On March 27 a home concert was played which featured Hanson's Symphony No. 2, Concerto in A-Minor by Vivaldi, "Claire de Lune" by Debussy, Eneace's "Roumanian Rhapsody No. 1" and "Prairie Sketches" by a new Canadian composer, Robert McMullin. The orchestra also played on the Christmas program and for baccalaureate and commencement.


