BOONE VS. FORT DODGE

Boone opened the 1964 football season with a 14-12 win over Fort Dodge. The Toreadors scored on a fourth down and goal to go situation. The extra point was good and Boone led 7-0 with about six minutes left in the half. The Dodgers came back with a pair of quick touchdowns to take a 12-7 halftime lead. The Toreadors scored what proved to be the winning touchdown in the third period, this time by Mike Harris.



BOONE VS. MARSHALLTOWN

The Toreadors opened their conference campaign with a 27-0 win over Marshalltown. Marty Rinehart, who scored three of the touchdowns, notched two of them in the first half, giving Boone a 13-0 halftime lead. Boone made sure of the win with two more touchdowns scored in the fourth quarter. Defensive playing like that in the picture prevented Marshalltown from getting inside Boone's 31-yard line offensively.

BOONE VS. OSKALOOSA

Oskaloosa scored a touchdown late in the first period to take a 7-0 lead, but Boone bounced back furiously for a 33-7 Homecoming win. Mike Harris scored a pair of touchdowns to climax Boone drives. Ted Hora scored on runs of 15 and 23 yards and Marty Rinehart added a touchdown on a ten yard spurt.



BOONE VS. AMES

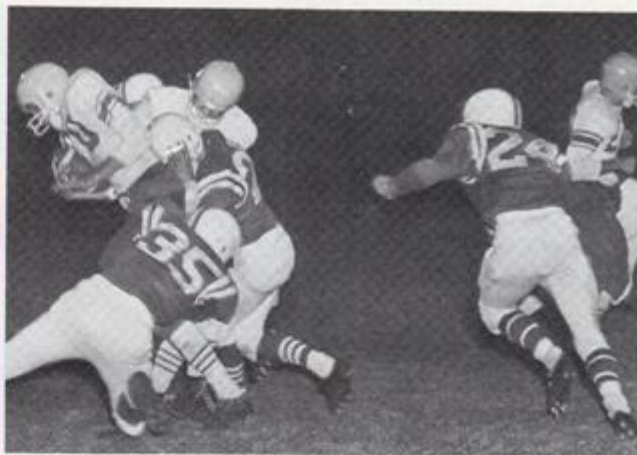
Boone scored two touchdowns in each of the first two periods and added single scores in the last two frames to defeat the Ames Cyclones, 40-7. Marty Rinehart scored on runs of 27 and 17 yards and also tossed a 50 yard scoring pass to Ted Hora. Mike Harris hit Dan Newland with a 24 yard scoring aerial, Don Riker scored on a four yard run, and Steve Godfrey tallied on a ten yarder.





BOONE VS. TAMA-TOLEDO

Boone thumped Tama-Toledo, 28-0, for a non-Conference victory. Ted Hora scored on a 16 yard run, Mike Harris on a two-yard plunge, and Don Riker added a touchdown on a one yard plunge. Tackle Sid Erickson blocked a Tama-Toledo punt at their 5-yard line and when the pigskin rolled behind the kicker into the end zone, Erickson was there to pounce on it for another Boone score.



BOONE VS. NEVADA

The Toreadors scored 21 points the first period and 20 more the second to jump off to a 41-0 halftime lead over the Nevada Cubs. Don Riker scored on runs of five, six, and six yards, Ted Hora sprinted to a 70 yard touchdown, Steve Godfrey dashed 59 yards for another, Bruce Richeson tallied on a nine yard dash, and Denny Vaudt fired a 42 yard pass to Marty Rinehart for a score.

BOONE VS. NEWTON

Boone downed a stubborn Newton Team, 21-14, assuring them of their second straight conference championship. Don Riker scored twice in the first half, giving Boone a 14-0 halftime lead. Newton bounced back in the third quarter making the score 14-7. Early in the fourth frame the Toreadors scored what proved to be the winning touchdown on a ten yard pass from Mike Harris to Bruce Geerdes. Newton retaliated with their second touchdown with three and a half minutes left in the game, making the score 21-14.



BOONE VS. GRINNELL

The Toreadors scored twice before the Grinnell Tigers had a chance to handle the ball offensively. They took a 42-13 victory. Mike Harris scored on a one yard plunge to climax a 68 yard drive after the Toreadors had taken the opening kick-off. Boone then kicked off to Grinnell and Don Riker recovered the free ball at the Tiger 30-yard line. Four plays later, Boone had another touchdown. Harris eventually scored another touchdown on a short plunge, Marty Rinehart scored on runs of 27, 12, and seven yards, and Don Riker sprinted to a 53-yard touchdown.

Netmen Better Previous Record

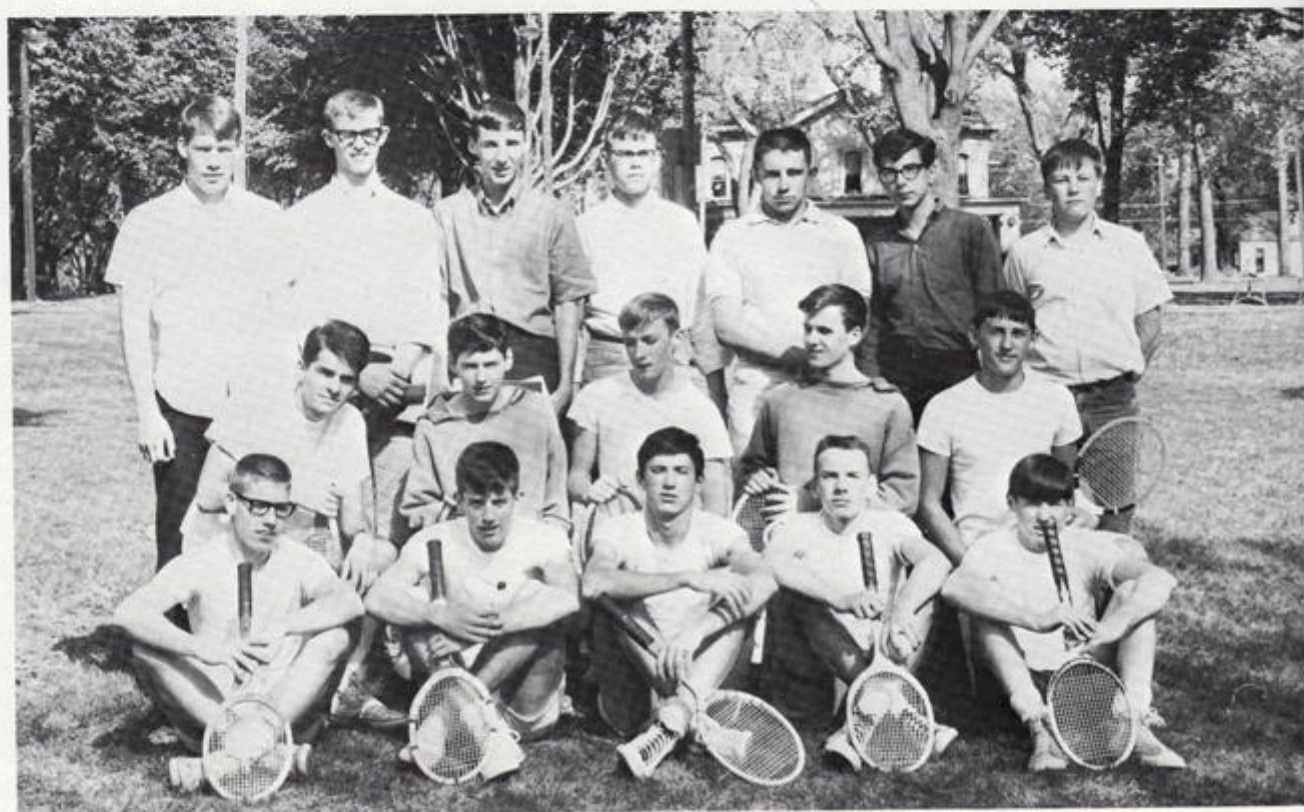

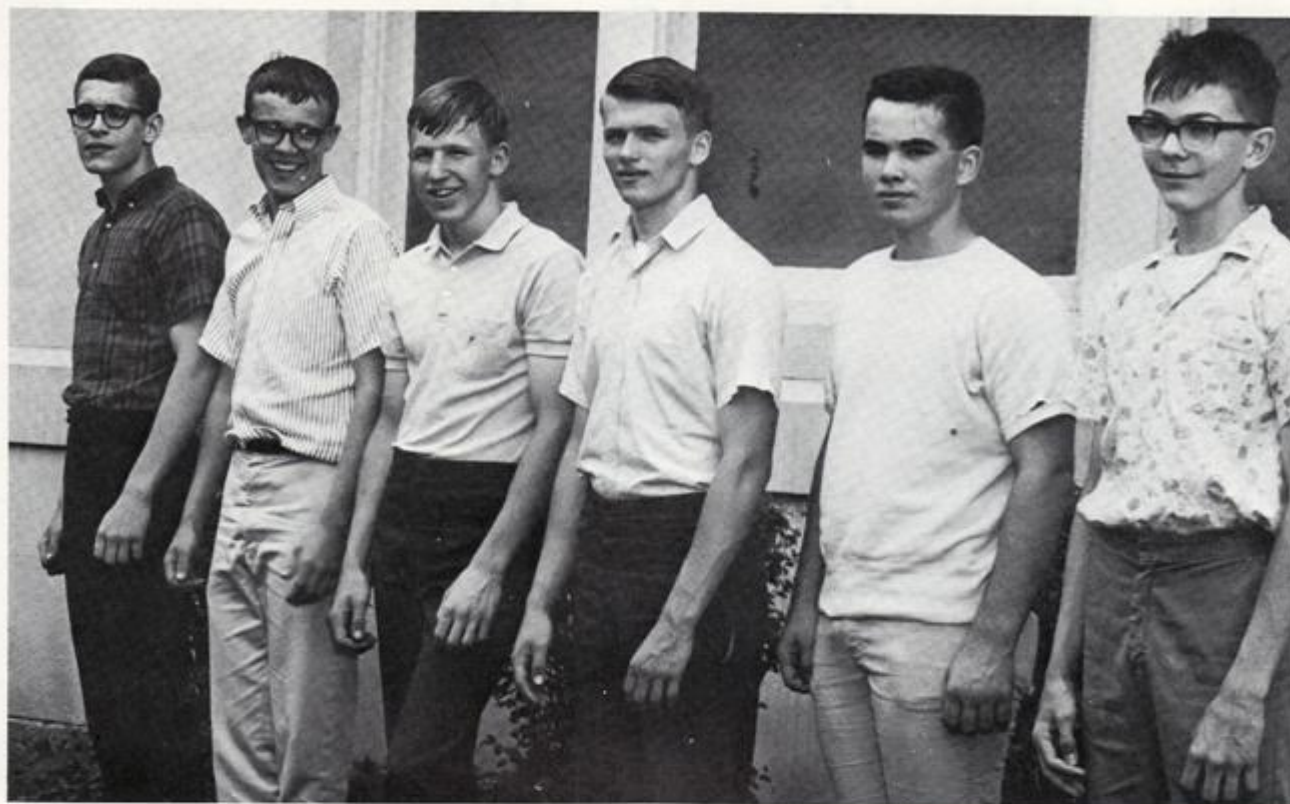

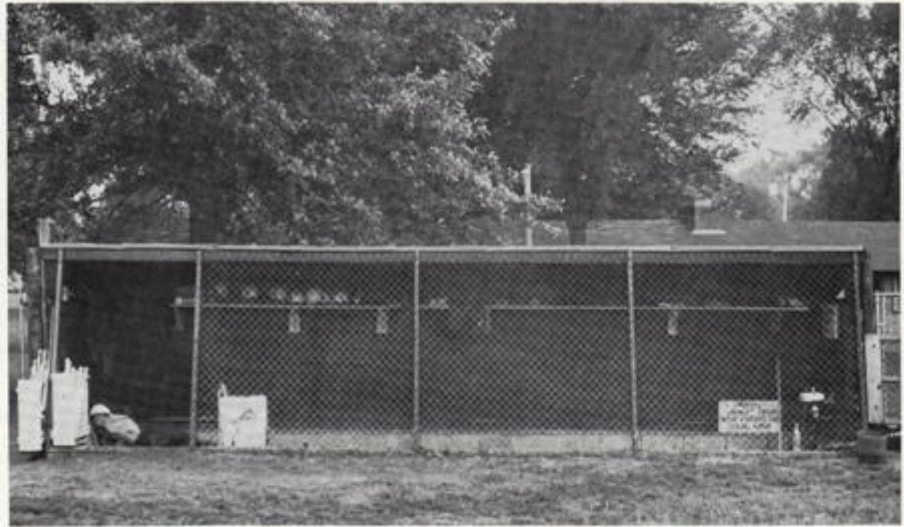
