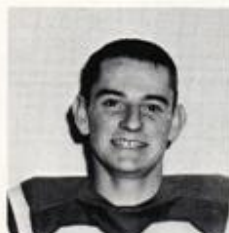

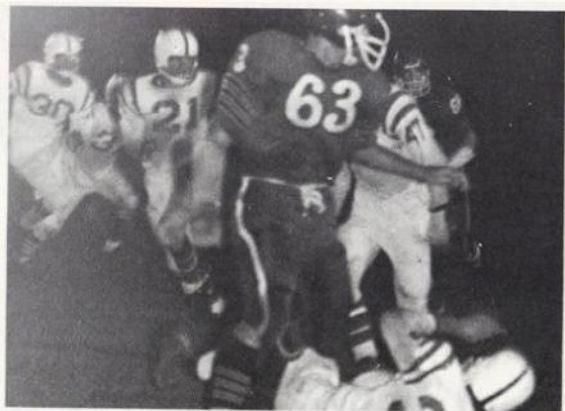

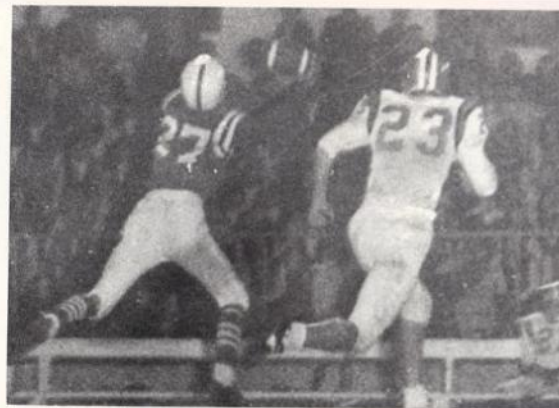

VARSITY IN ACTION

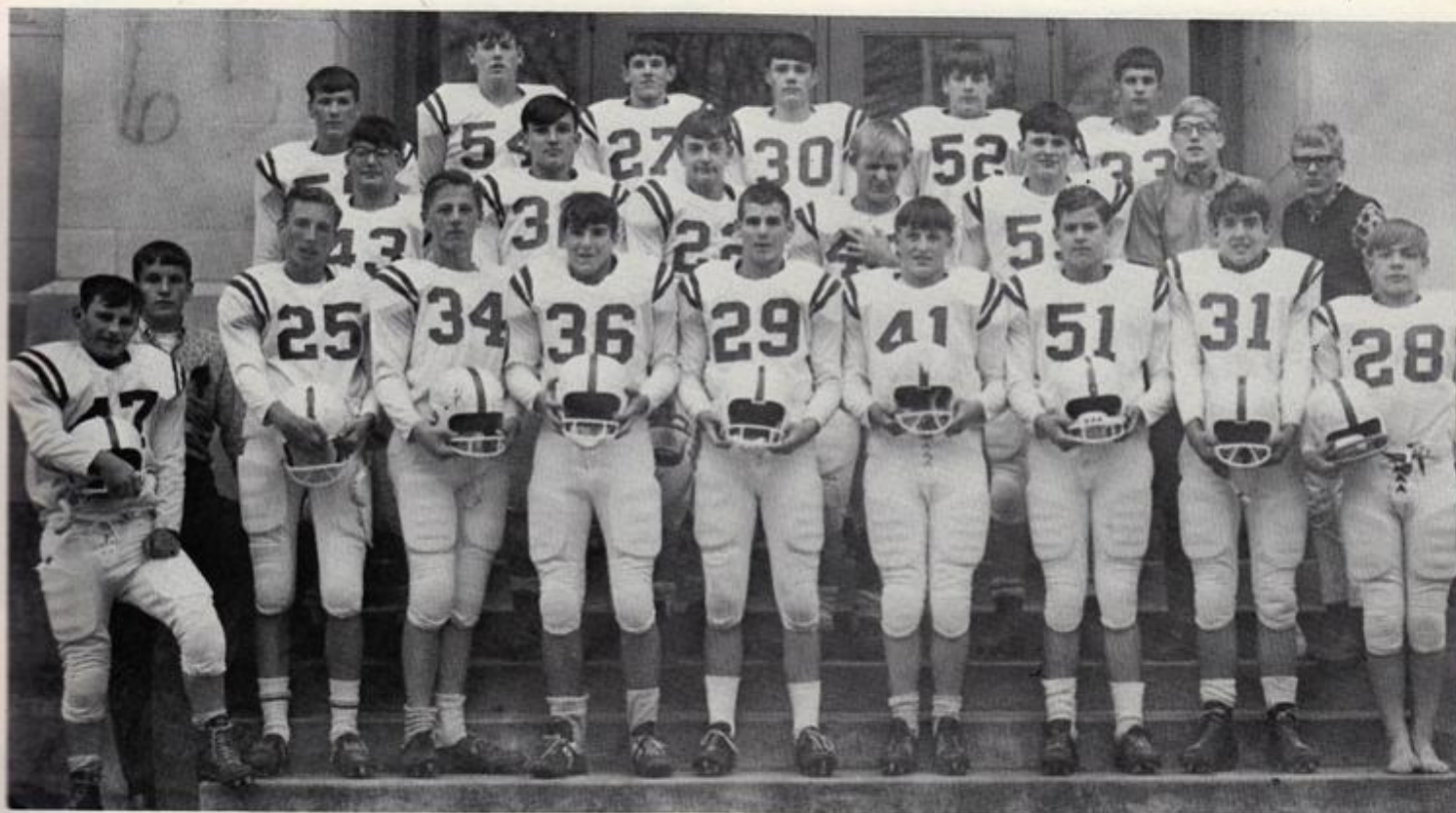

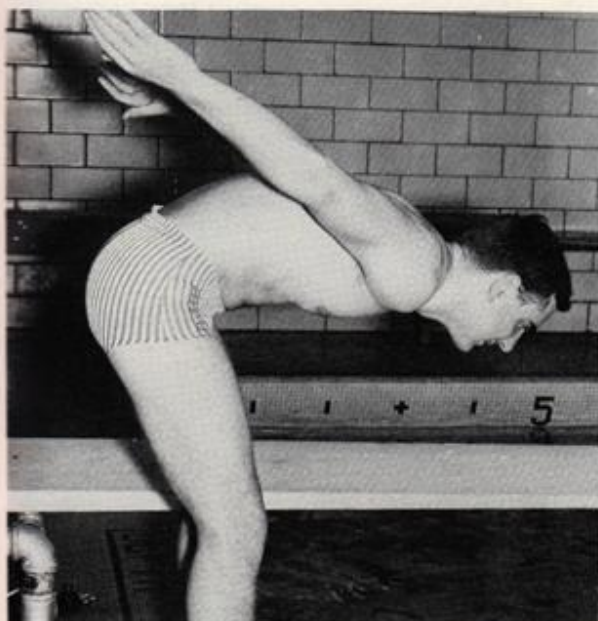

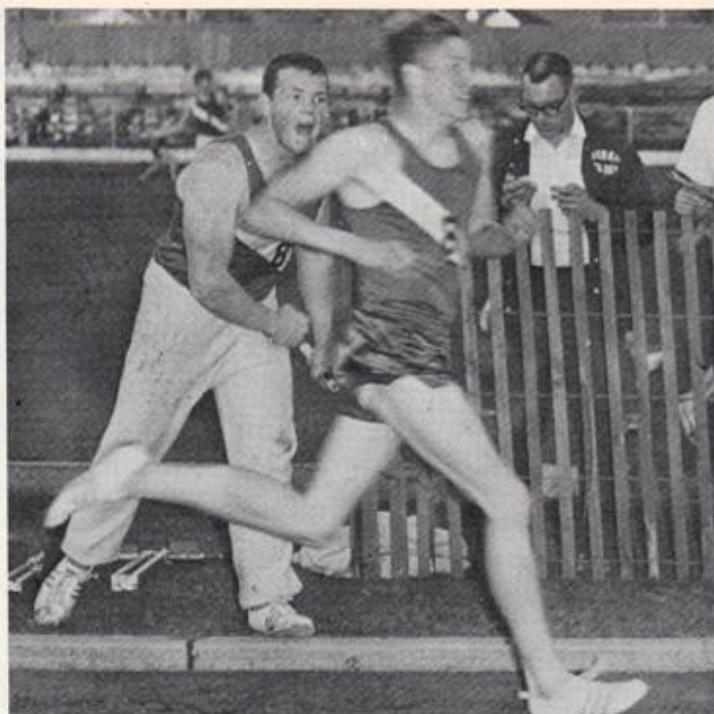

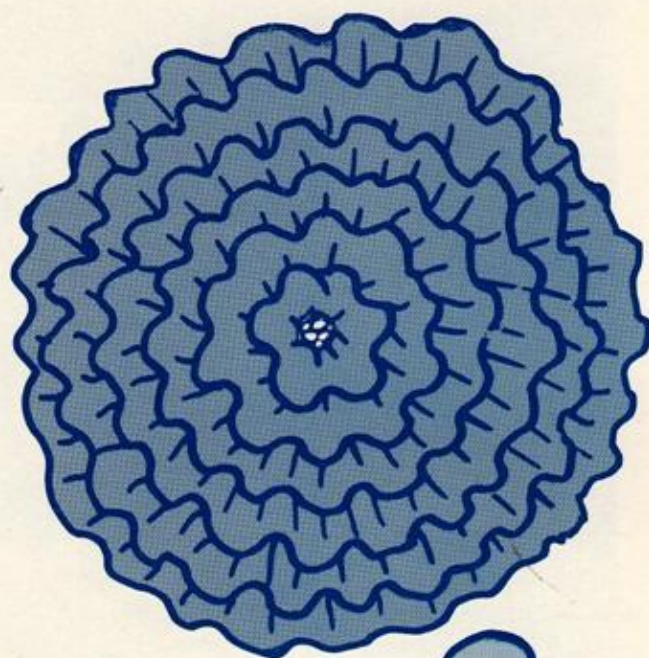
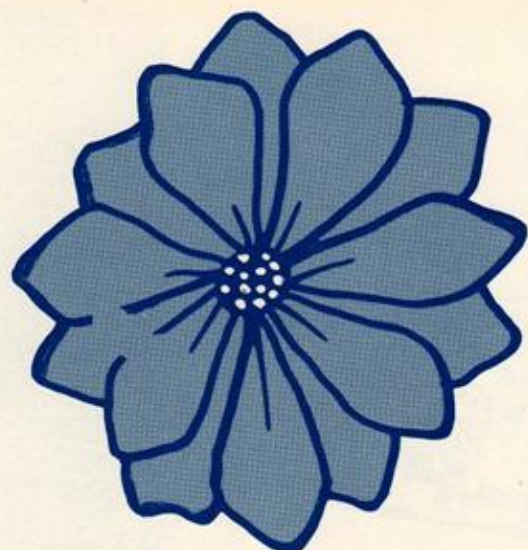
After a brilliant season with a 23-1 record, our fantastic Boone team went on to win five straight tournament games for their second State Championship in three years.
