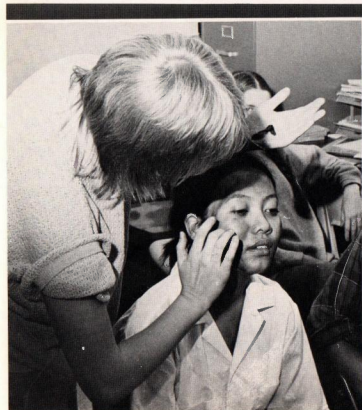

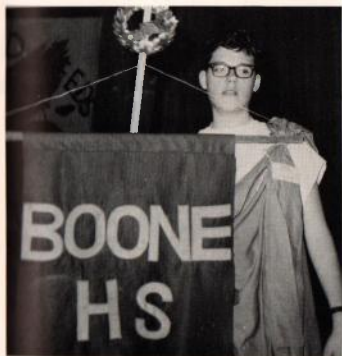

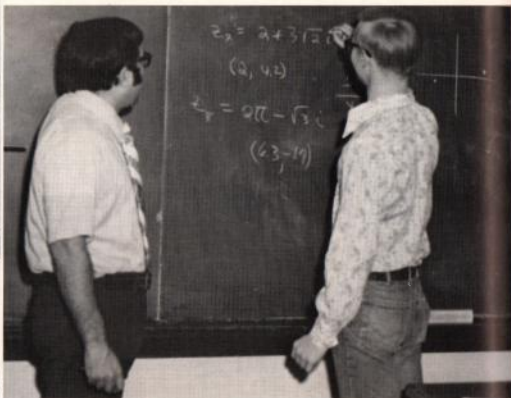


ACADEMICS

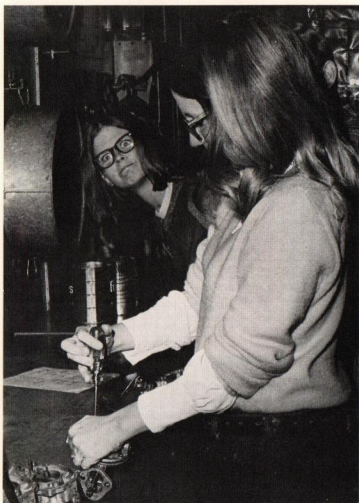
Business education classes give students a variety of experiences, from typing to using computers, to actual job experiences on the job in the co-op program (below).

Not so academic, but lots of fun is ship building, eh Mark? Many good things come from shop, not the least of which is the development of some fine hobby crafts.





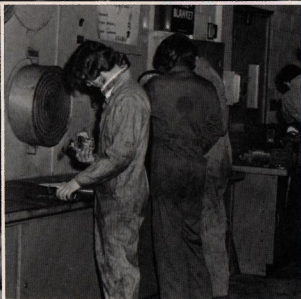
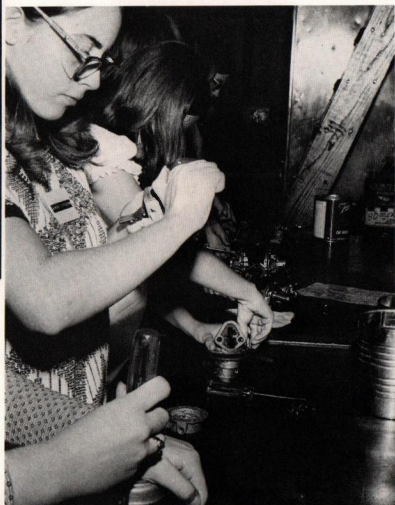
