The Boone High students held their annual AFS dance on Mar. 8 in the High school gym. This dance was given to welcome the foreign exchange students from various parts of Iowa.



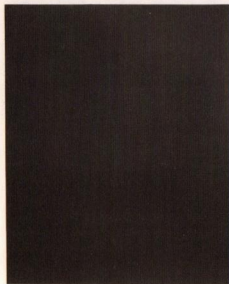
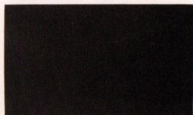

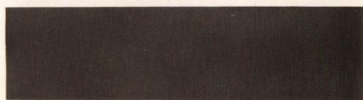

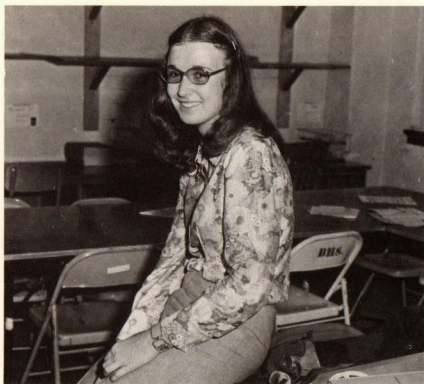

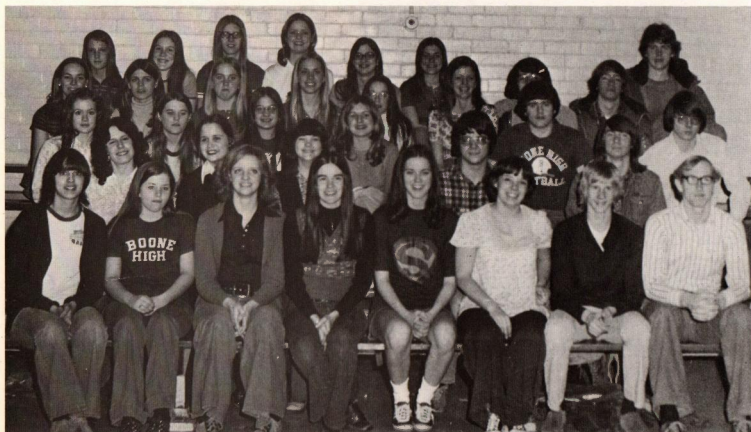

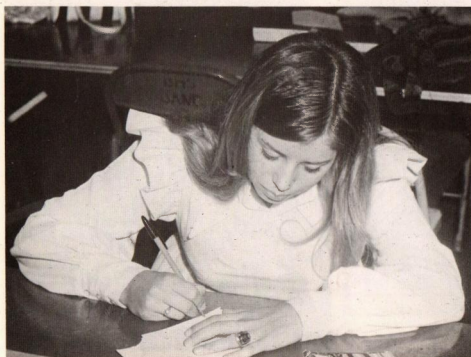

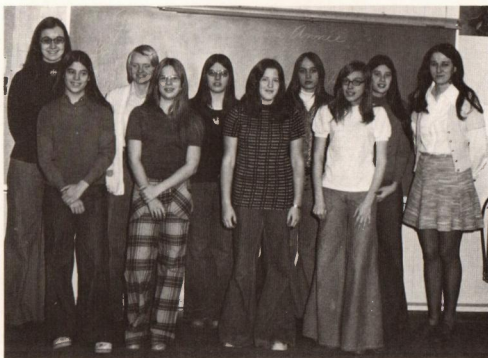

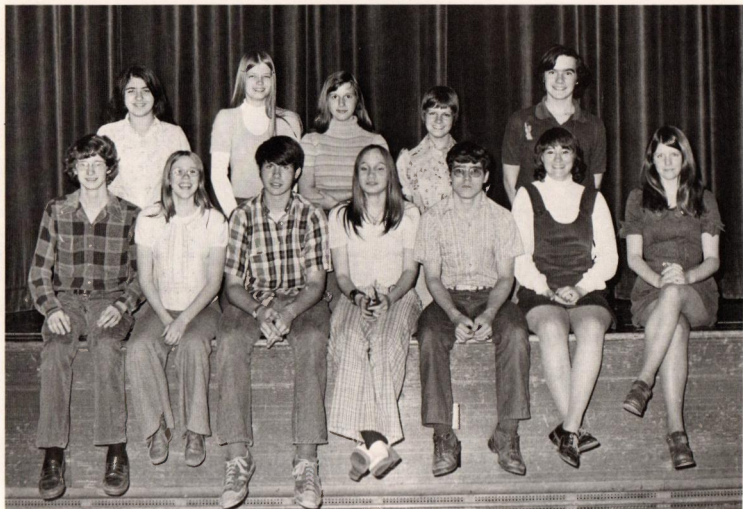

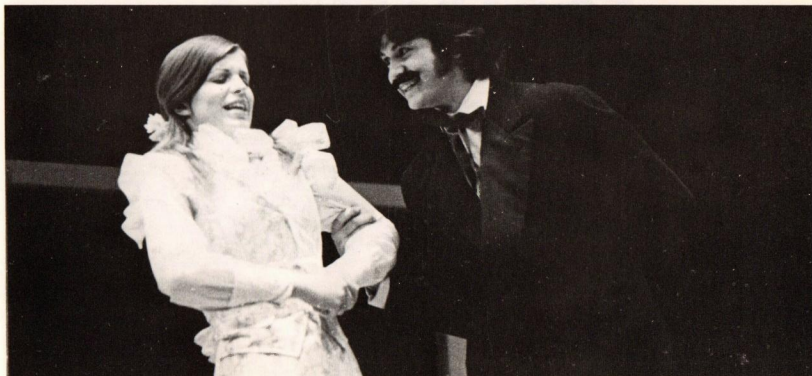
