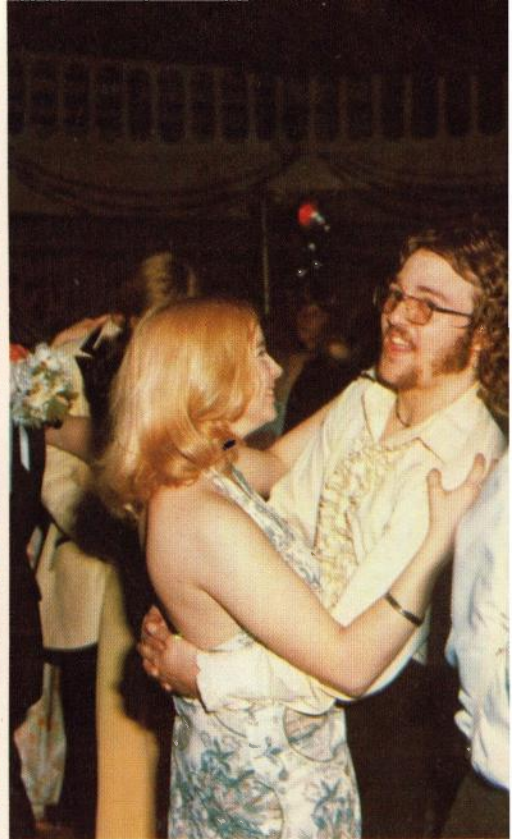
# Prom 1975

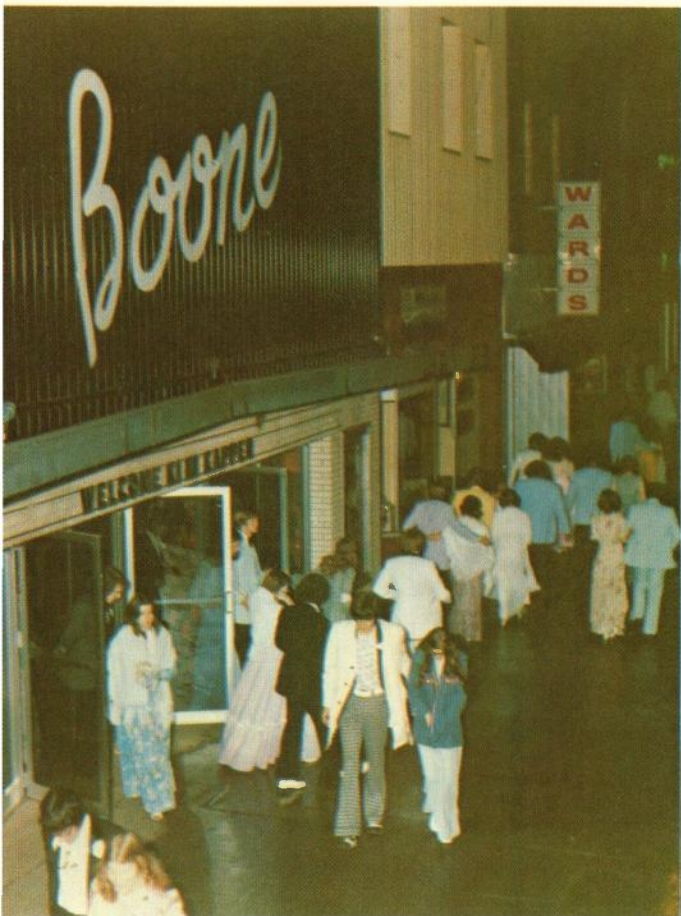

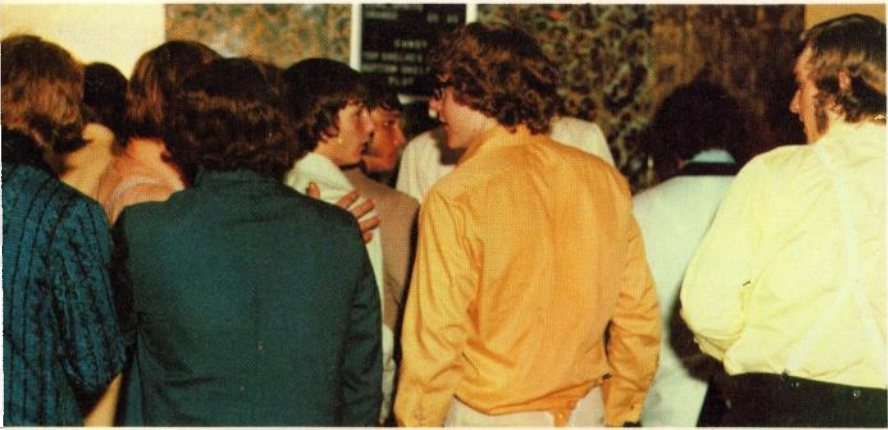

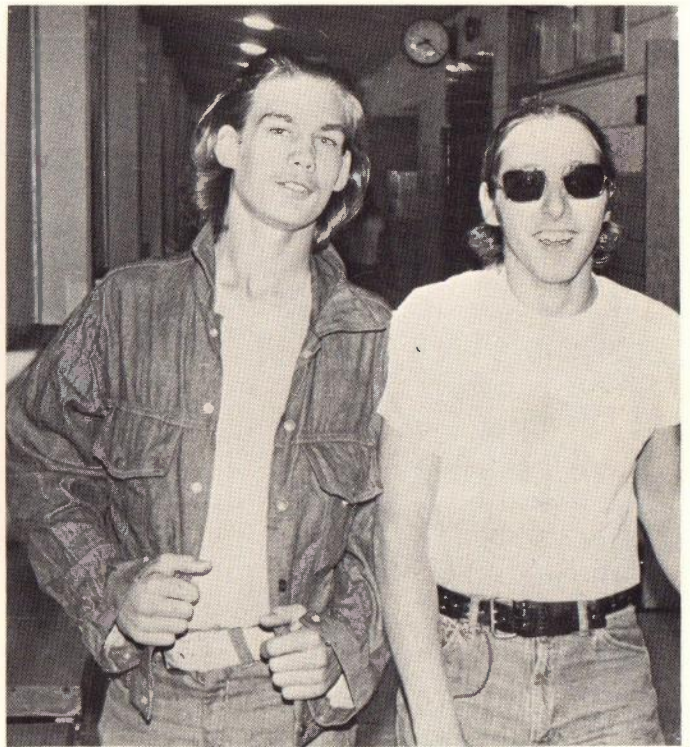
