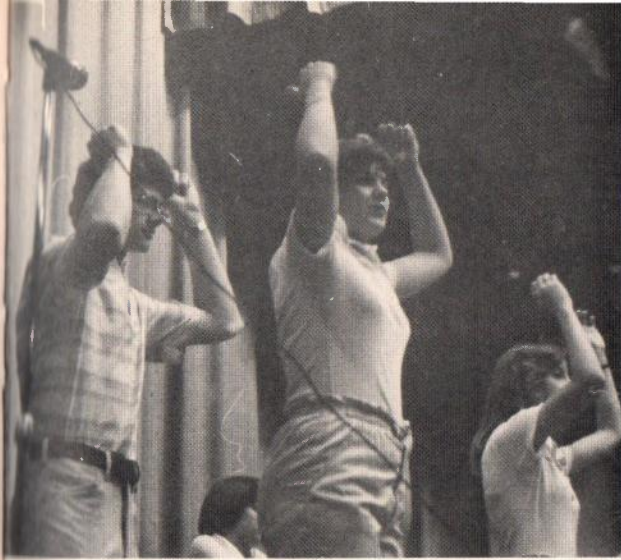

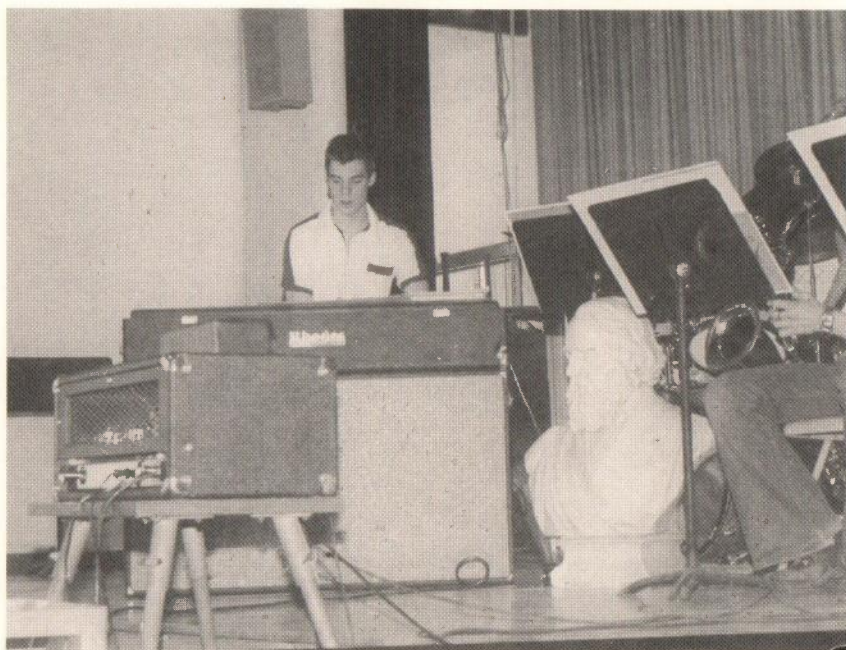

the music die!"







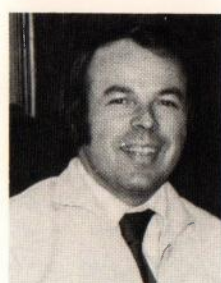

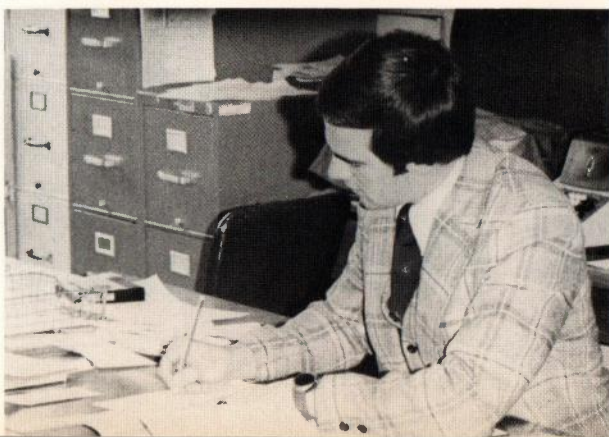
