Students still wish that school today was that easy. But as times changed and they all grew up, there were always memories in the back of everyone's mind.








Not only was the smell coming from the student body in some cases but the stench also came from the internal core of the school. The pipes were part of the reason for the smell.


The hand dryers on the wall came in handy. When a student spilled something on clothing and thought it was ruined, those little dryers and cheap soap dispensers came to the rescue.

# Do simulations really work?

There was a new member of the family and your parents didn't even know about it. In the middle of the night the baby cried, waking and giving your parents a heart attack. "Don't be alarmed," you told them, "it's just a class project for school."

"Baby Think It Over" became a new project in the Family and Consumer Science parenting classes. For the project, past or current parenting students "adopted" the battery-operated baby simulators. The class required students to journalize their thoughts, feelings, and problems of caring for a baby at infant age without any help.

"I took the parenting class last year. We had to carry around the flour sacks. I wish that I could've gotten to use these," senior **Kari Vickers** said.

The baby simulator cried or needed attention every three to five hours. The student inserted a probe into the back. The probe was hooked onto the student's wrist and he/she waited until the baby cried again and then removed the "care probe". Mrs. Betty Hanson, the parenting teacher, checked to see if the babies had been neglected or abused while in the student's care. A red light signified abuse, a yellow light signified neglect.

"The only thing realistic about the babies was that they cried occasionally and you couldn't shake or drop them," senior **Ramona Jacobson** said.

Over several weekends in the fall and spring, parenting students took the babies home. The students picked them up Friday after school. During the school day Mrs. Hanson served as the daycare provider. During the weekends, some students had to work. Most businesses were very supportive of the project.

"I thought that it was a good learning experience although I felt that one major drawback was that realistically parents don't take their children to work with them, and in our case some of us had to," junior **Mollie Conyers** said.

Mrs. Hanson said she really appreciated teaching students how hard it really is to be single parents. She wishes she could teach more prospective "dads".






