Field trips weren't reserved to the grade school crowd, however. Several different classes traveled around the state in order to enhance the learning done in the classroom.

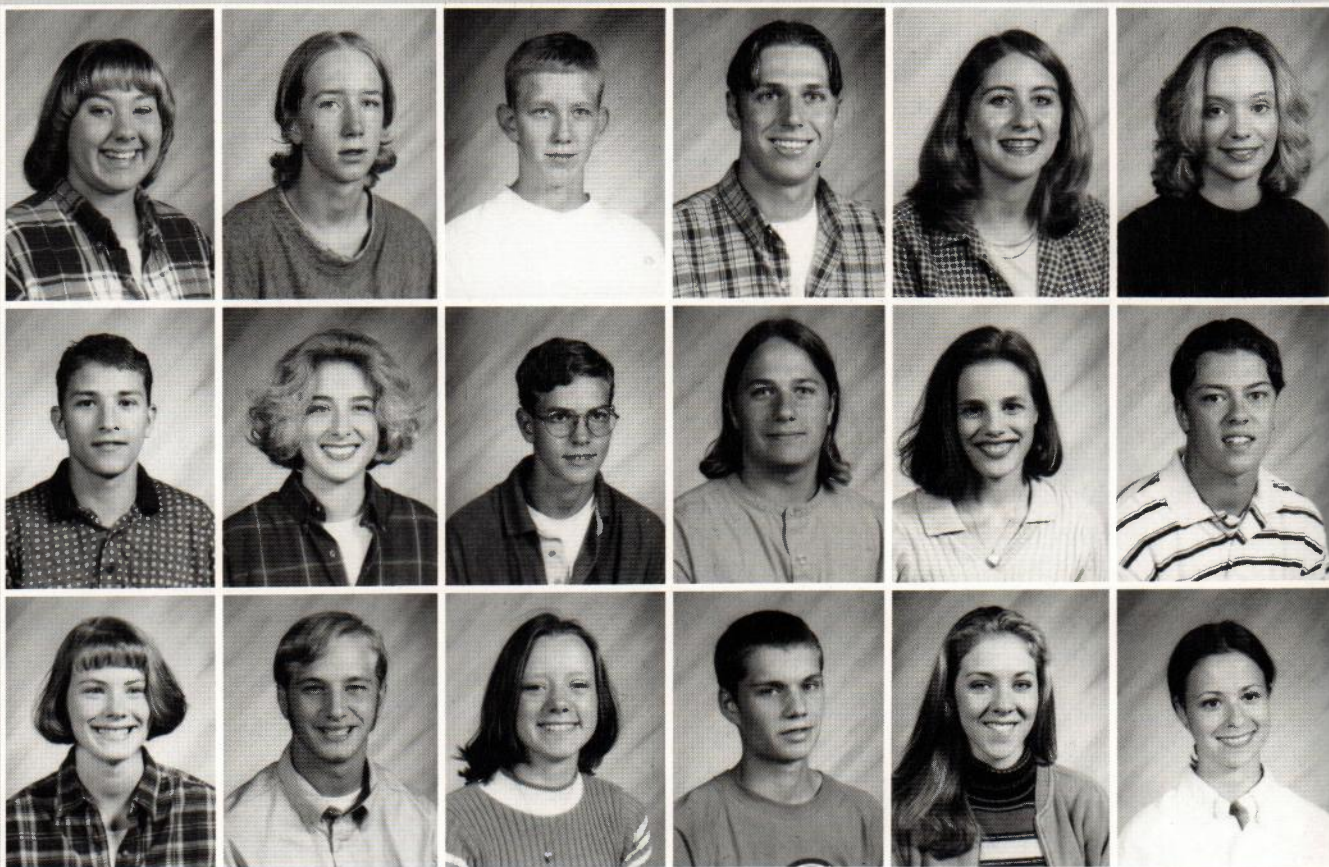
