FOR THE FIRST TIME, keyboarding was taught on new equipment. Con puters replaced the typewriters. Keyboarding became a required class for graduation. Students opinions varied about this change.
"I think everyone should have keyboarding because it will help them in the future," sophomore Emily Blumer said.
"Businesses are run by computers so this is a necessary skill to learn," freshman Brian Dotzler said.

Entrepreneurship was one of the new classes added to the business department. This class taught students the basics about opening their owi business. The process needed in order to take out loans was also discussed

The class developed a survey for the student body to investigate what type of business to open. The CD Exchange opened as a result of this. The new business owners sold stocks in the company with the hope of making money for the investors. CD's were sold on a consignment basis. By the end of the semester, investors earned $110 \%$ on their initial investment. Entrepreneur students were paid one dollar per hour for the hours that the worked.
