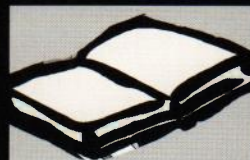

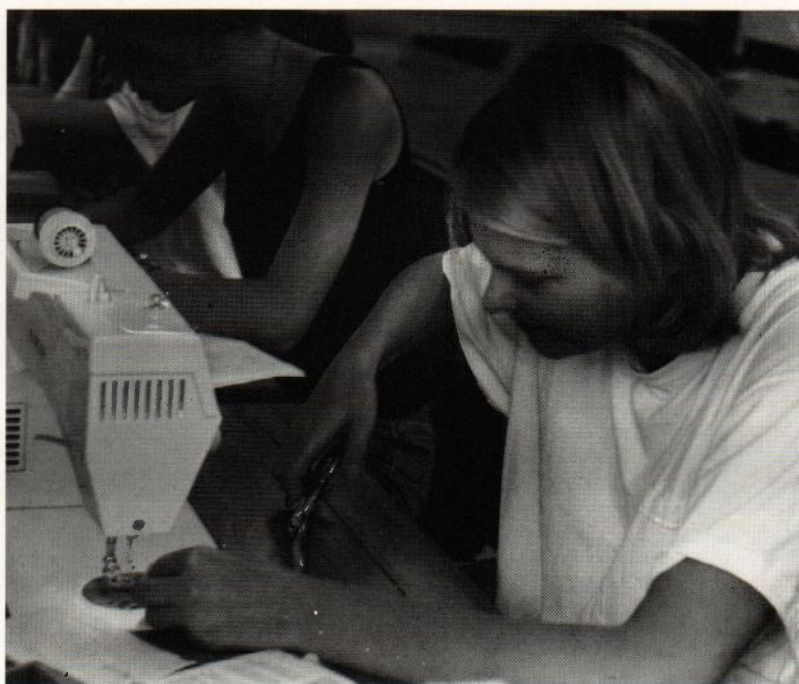
HOW MANY HOURS DO YOU STUDY EACH WEEK?



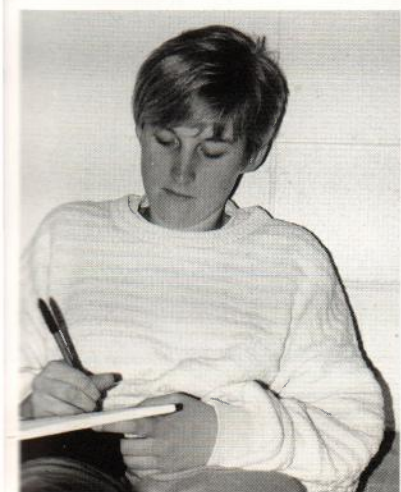
Under 5 hrs. 64%

"I feel these meetings are very informative but if it focuses on one department, I think that separate meetings would be better," music teacher, Mrs. **Pam Grundstad** said.



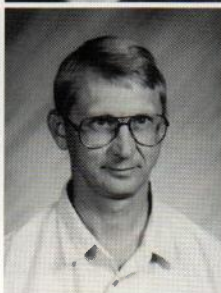
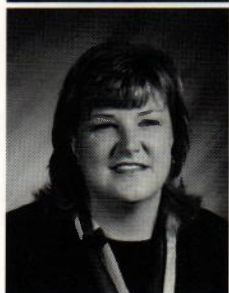
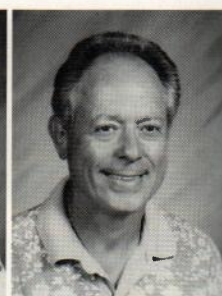
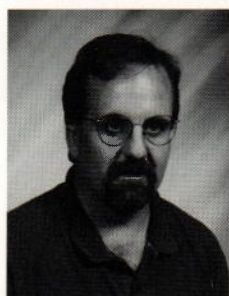
