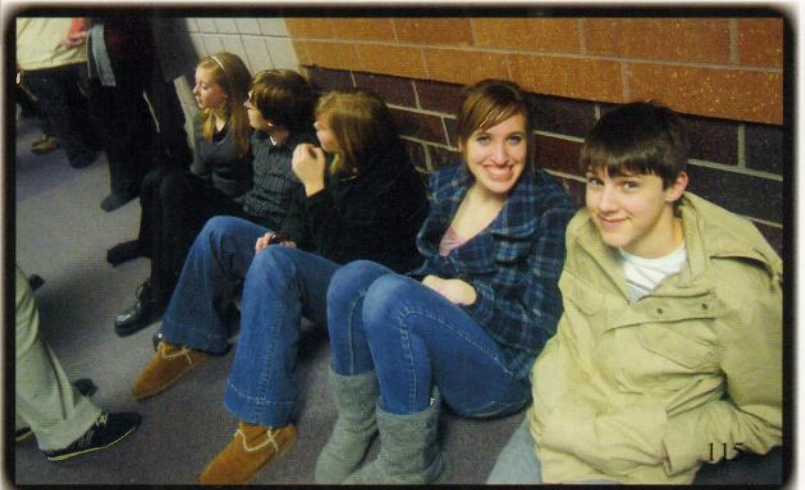

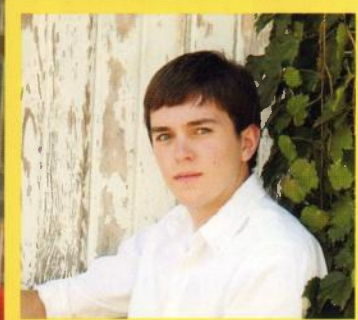
Advisee Senior Leaders

Foreign Language Spanish

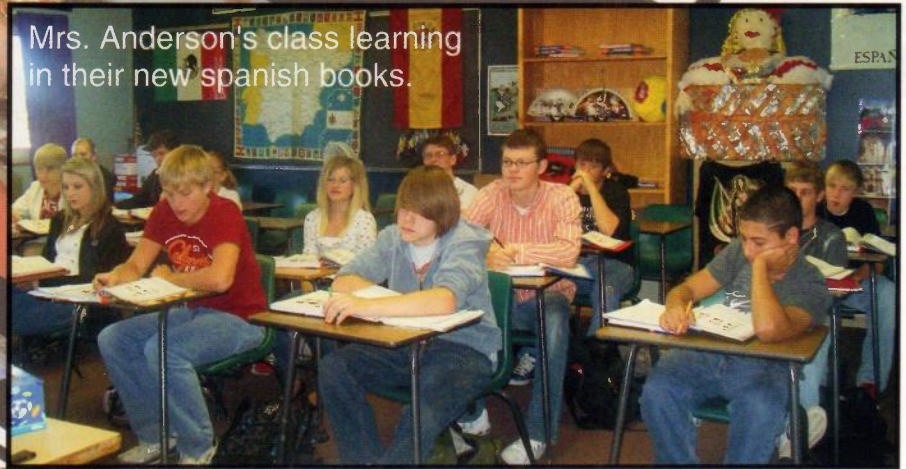

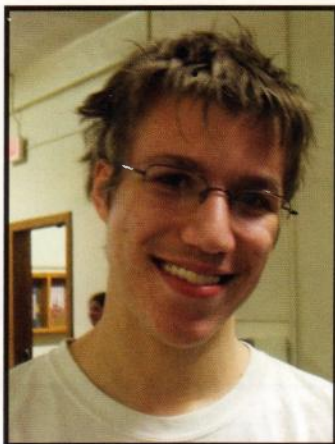

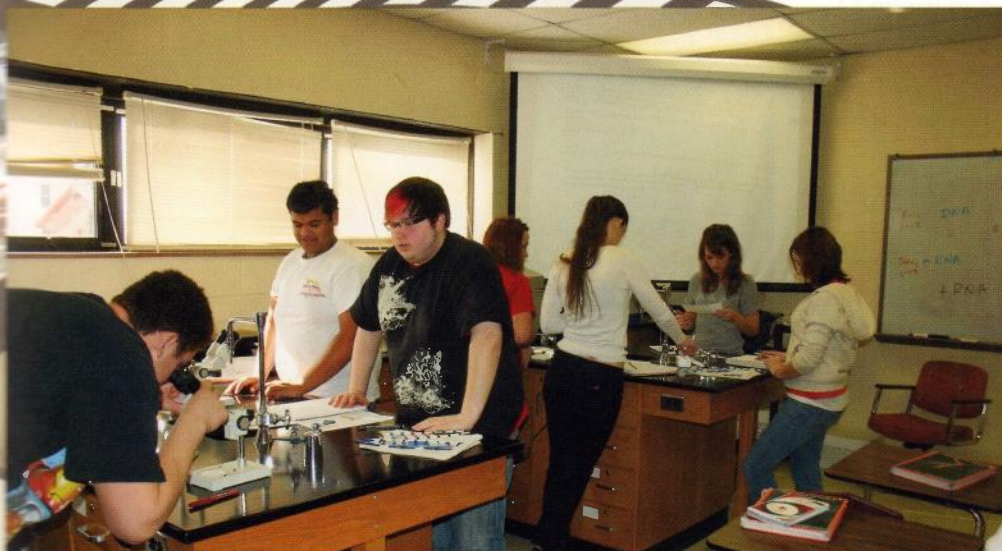


SCIENCE

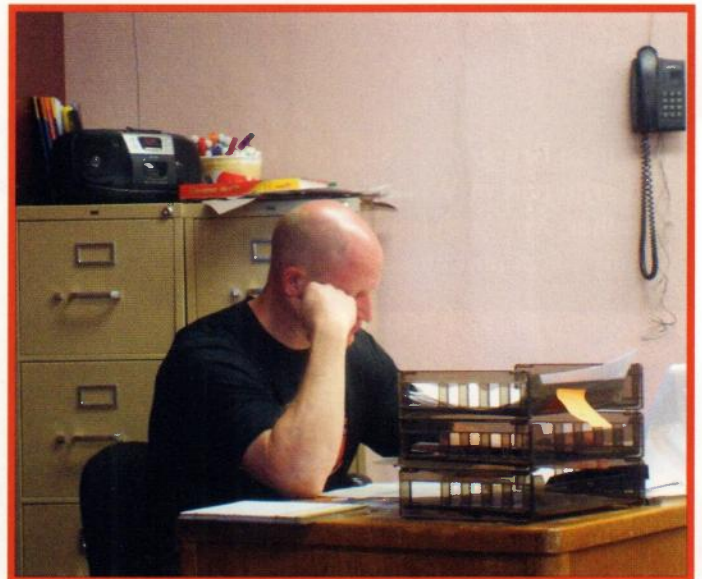
Health

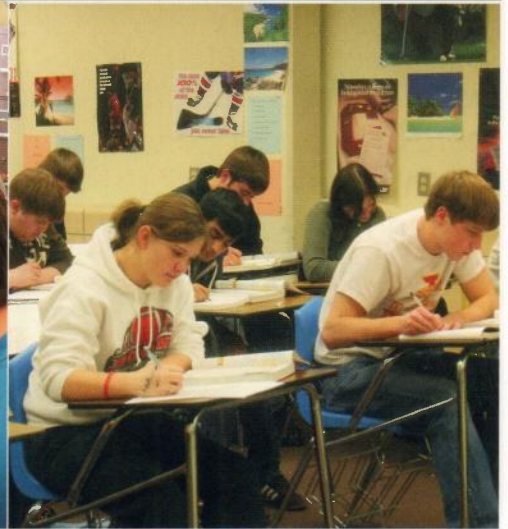
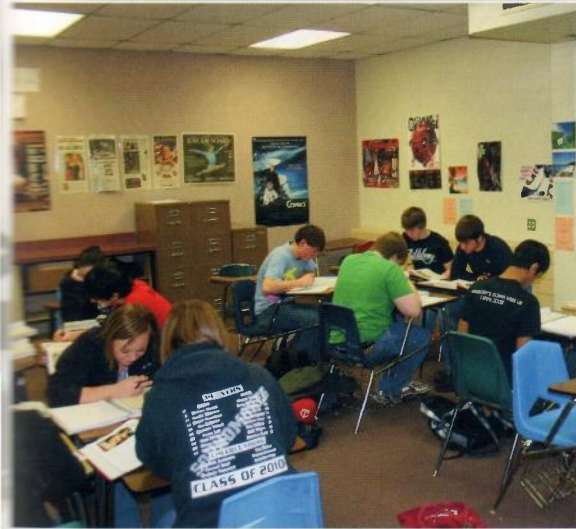

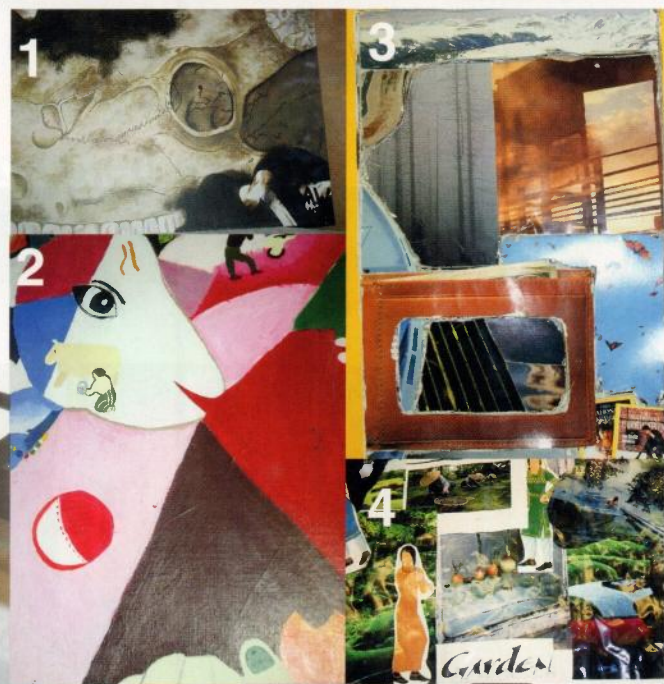

Q: When were you first interested in art?

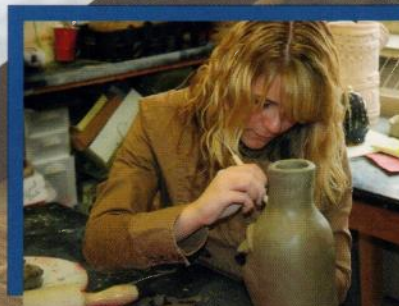
A: My mom is an art teacher, so I grew up watching her paint and draw. It's just always been natural for me.

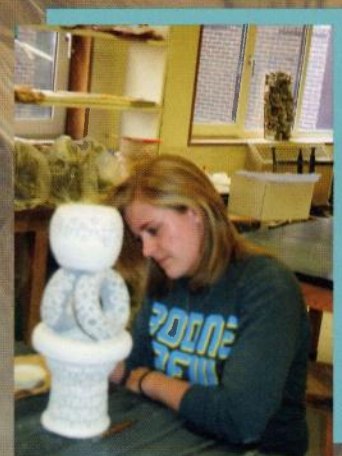
Q: What is your favorite piece?
