





BOONE CAMPUS PHI THETA KAPPA, TAU PHI CHAPTER INITIATION

Phi Theta Kappa is the Scholastic Society of American Junior Colleges. There are 385 chapters in 43 states, Canal Zone and Puerto Rico since 1969.

Tau Phi Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa was organized at the Boone Campus, of the Des Moines Area Community College in 1969 and at the end of Spring Quarter 1974 initiated seventeen new members with dinner at the Imperial Inn in Boone. Special guests were from the 1973 initiation of Phi Theta Kappa: Janie Anderson, Donna Smith Johnson, and Robert Lubke. To qualify for membership, a student must be regularly enrolled in a junior college, shall be carrying a full-time load, and shall have completed at least one term in the college division. At least 12 hours of his work must be in courses leading to a recognized degree in a fully accredited university or four-year college of the junior college in which he is enrolled. In addition to these requirements, a student shall also be of good moral character, shall possess recognized qualities of citizenship, and shall have established academic excellence as judged by the faculty.

Phi Theta Kappa exists to recognize and encourage scholarship among students in American Junior Colleges. It seeks to provide (1) opportunity for the development of leadership and for service, (2) an intellectual climate for the exchange of ideas, (3) lively fellowship for scholars, and stimulation of interest in continuing academic excellence.






