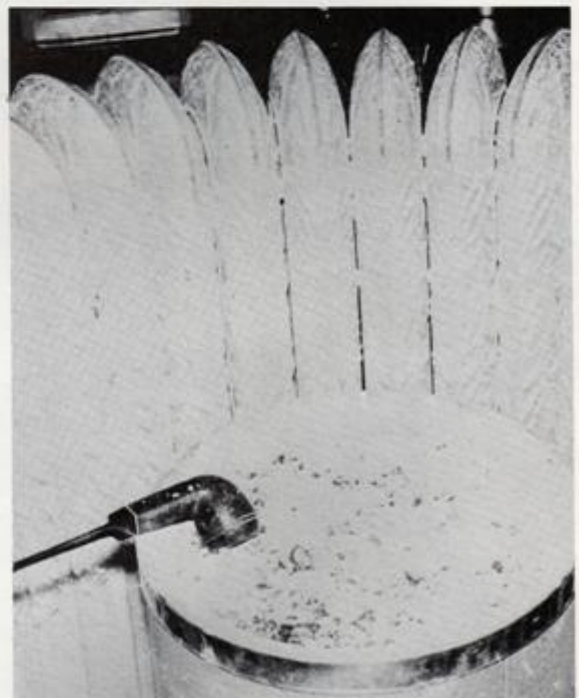

Lyle Poyzer, Math

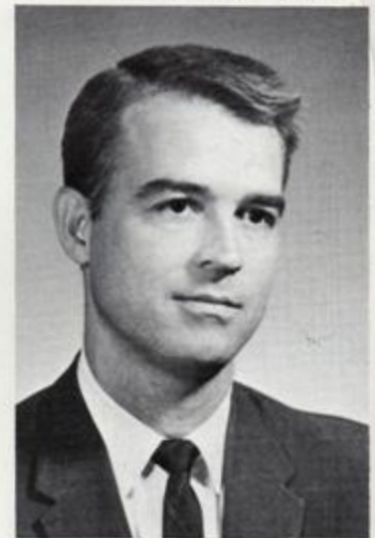
Mr. Poyzer likes to hunt. He does carpentry at home. He fills out income tax forms and his ambition is travel to primitive countries.

Billy Ryan, Biology

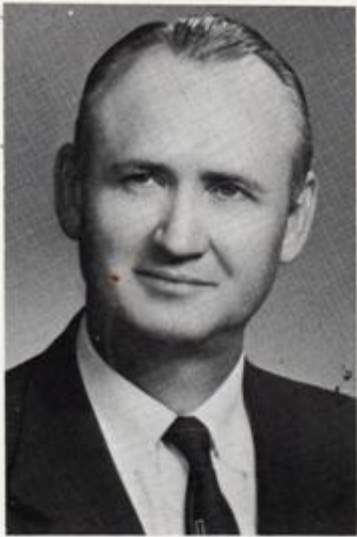


Some of his interests include hunting, fishing, traveling and reading. He is particularly interested in outdoor recreation, having spent three summers working as a park ranger in the national park system.

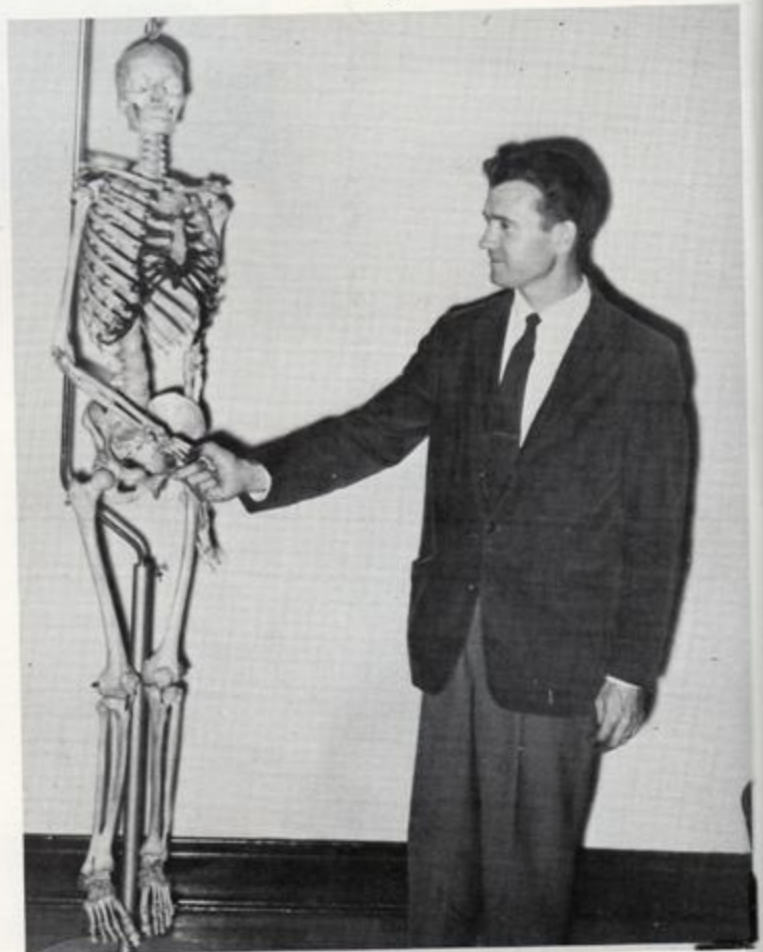
