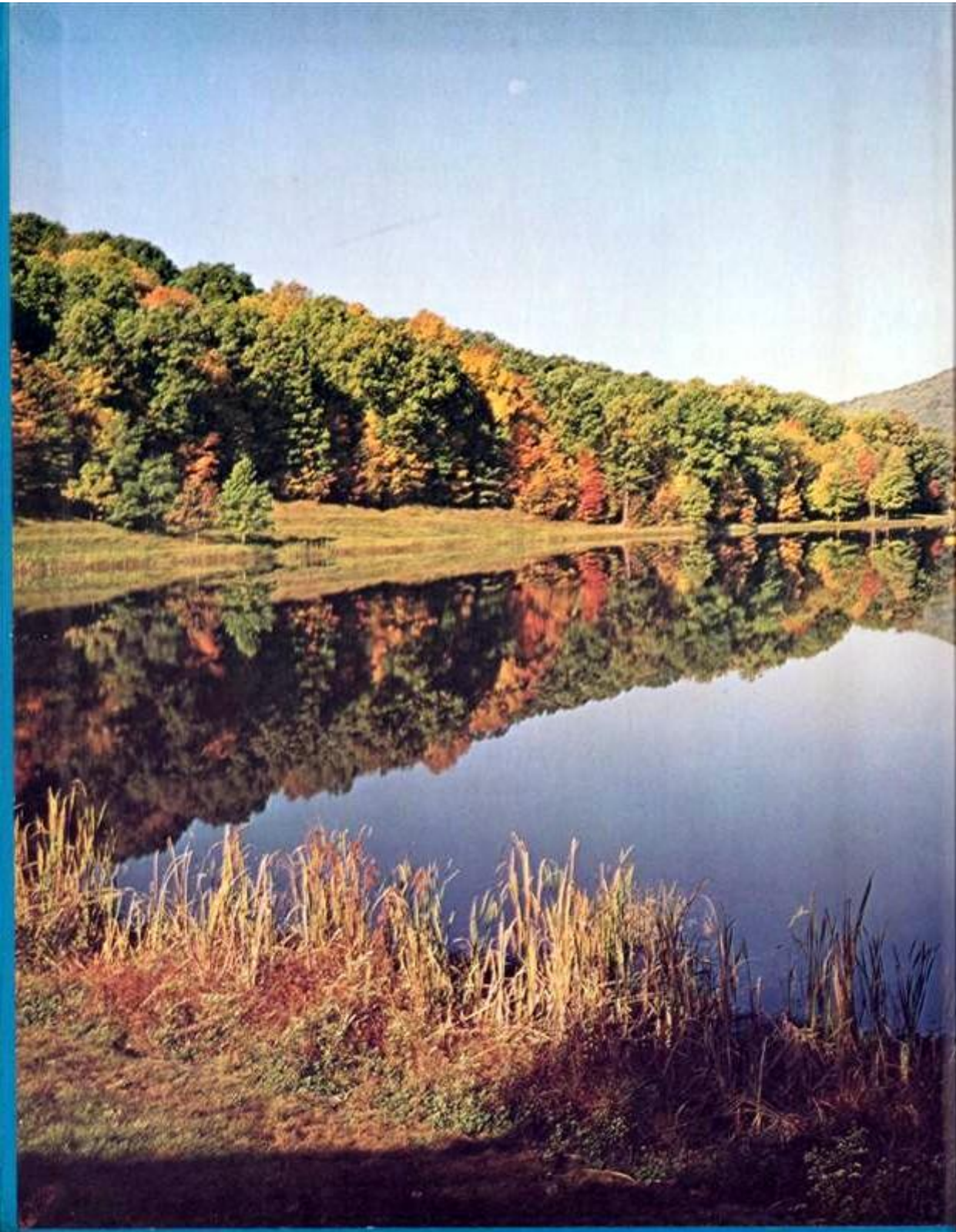
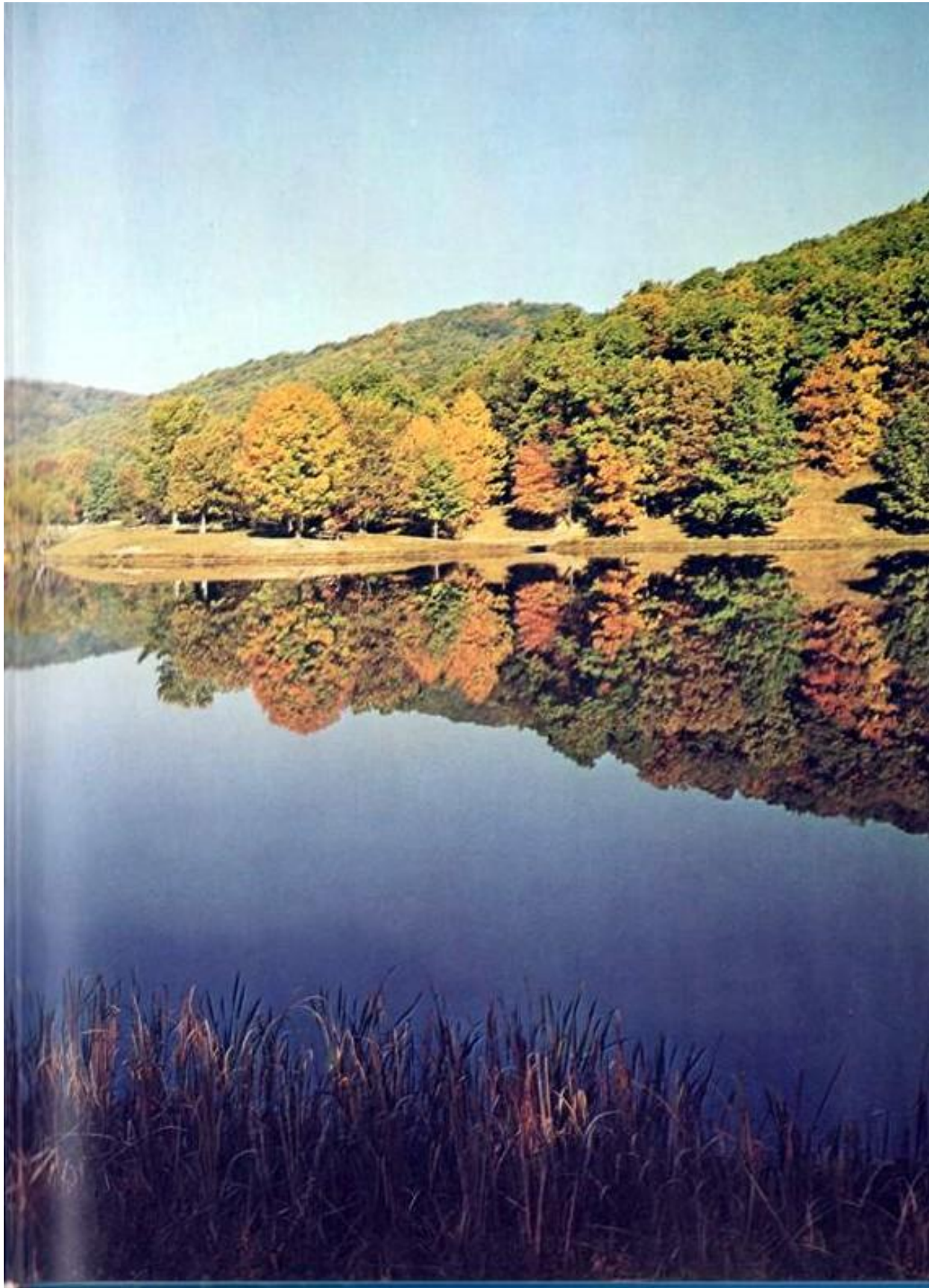

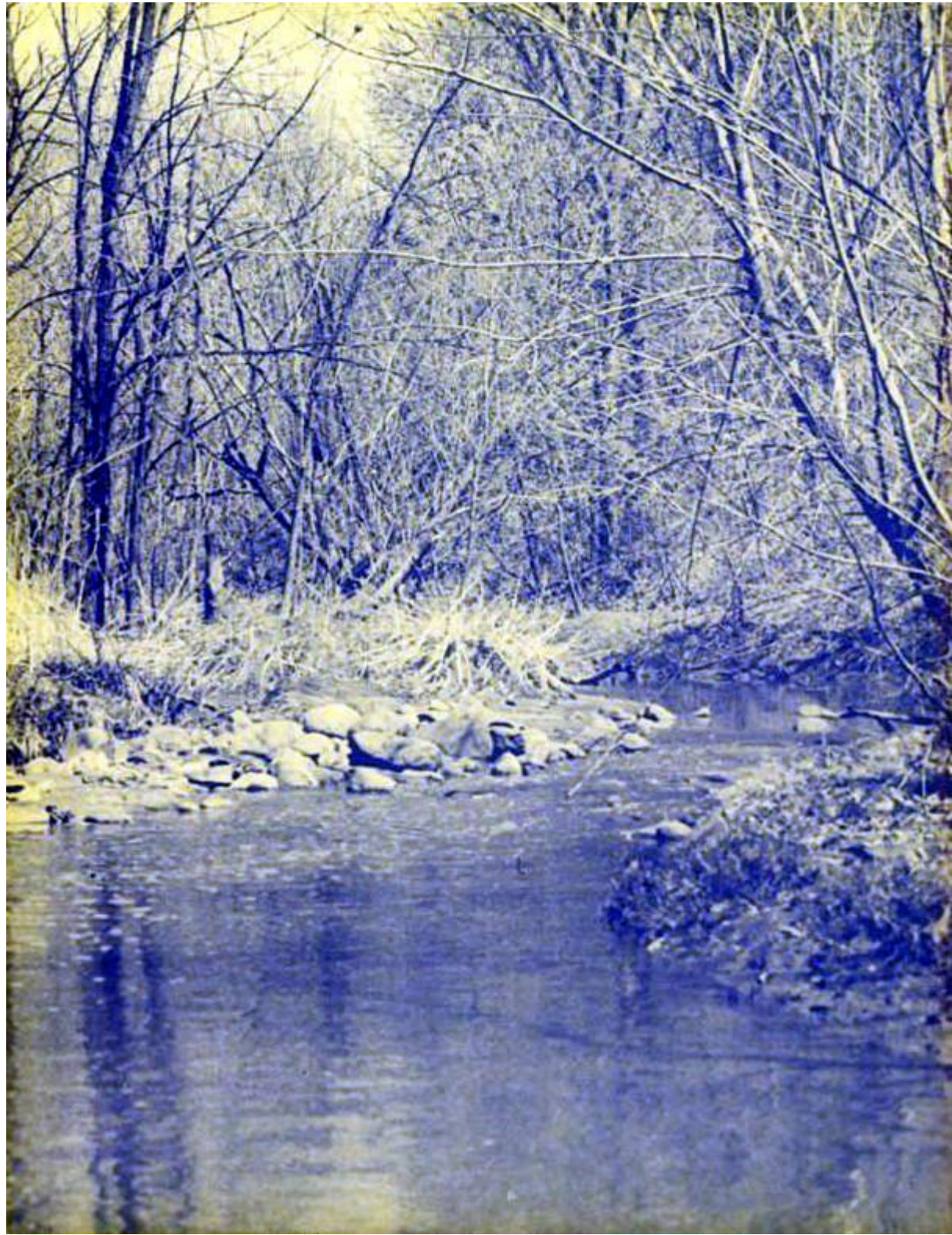

CIRCLE K CLUB

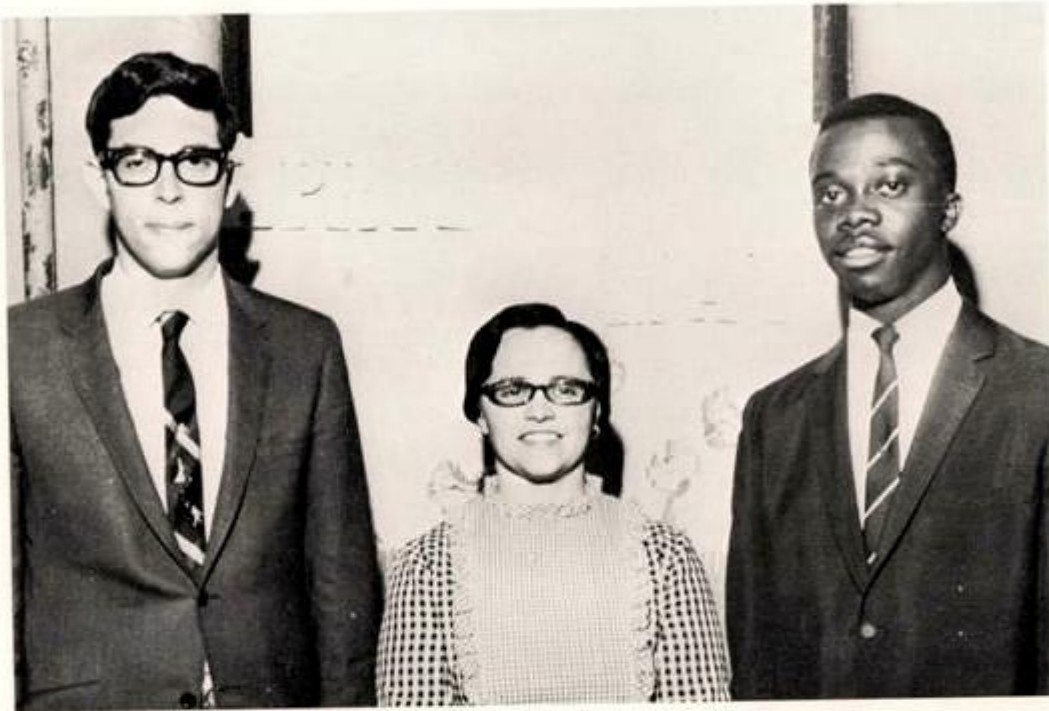


Again this year the members painted the floor of the lounge. Is this becoming an annual thing?

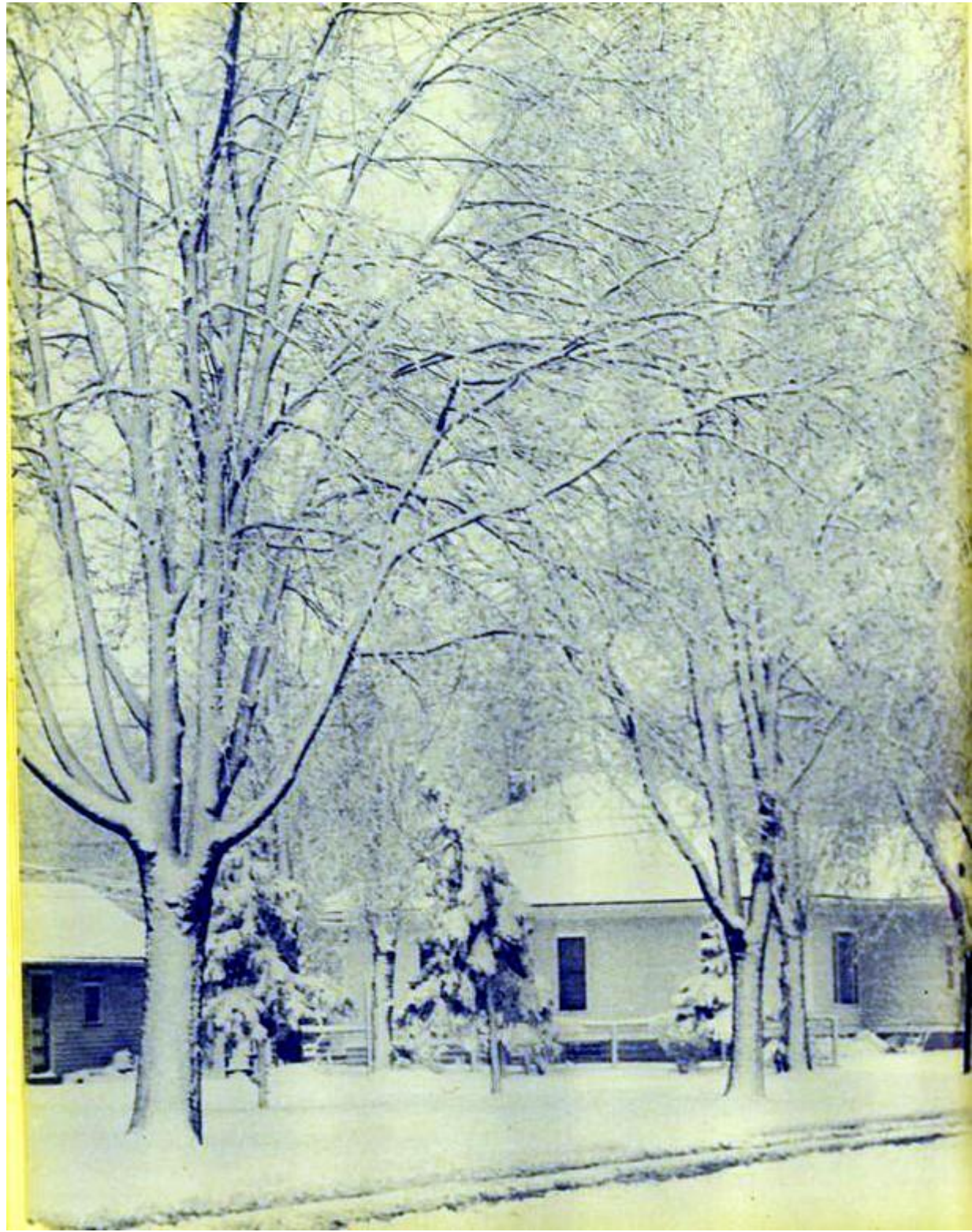

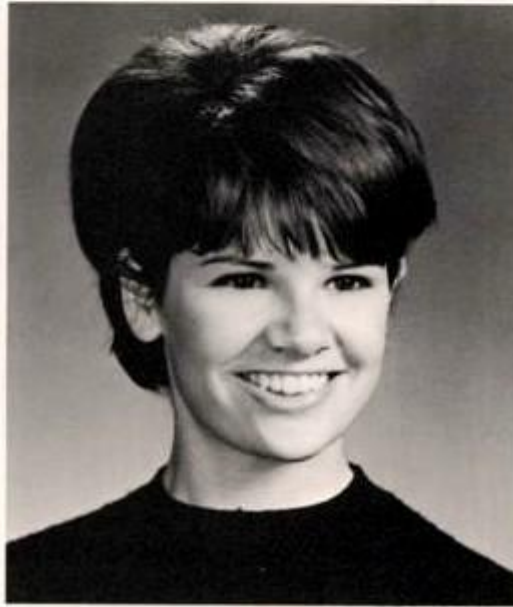

Mel Berryhill is about to get a kiss for being voted the Most Valuable Player by his teammates.

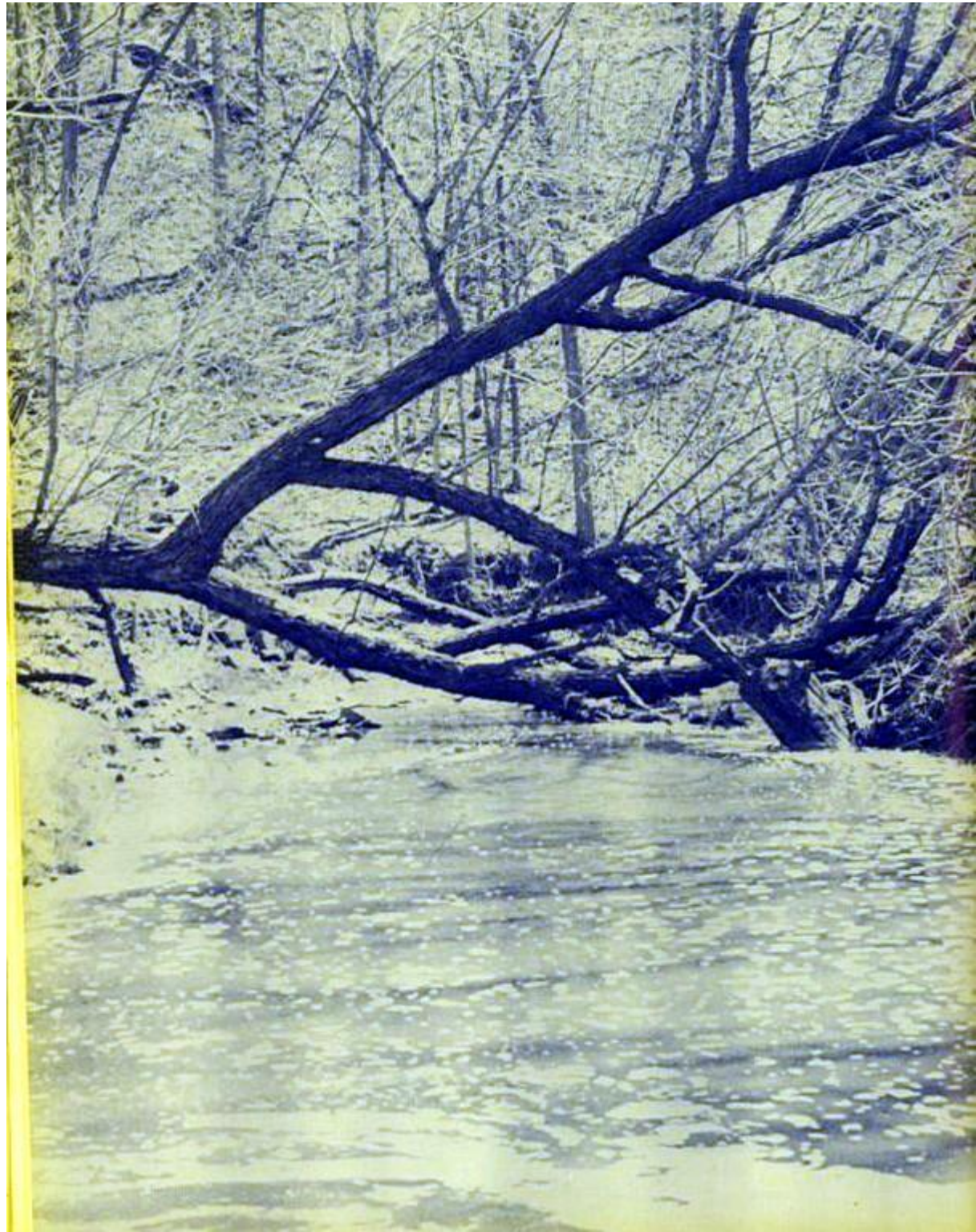
