









The sign located at the corner of Hancock Drive and Story was designed by one of our students and voted on by the student body.



The fifteen members of Omicron Zeta Chapter were involved in many activities throughout the year.

In October, four members attended a Leadership Conference in Orange City: Sue Middle, Vickie Setterberg, Denise Jacobson, Cedric Joseph. State Conference plans were made. "Youth Leads" was the theme selected for the year's activities.

November and December were fund-raising months for Omicron Zeta. A Cherrydale candy drive netted the organization a gross profit of \$107.

In November, Mr. Charles Linden, Boone County Hospital Administrator, was invited to discuss his ideas on employment and the job interview. At the end of the year, Mr. Liden was presented a token of appreciation by members of Omicron Zeta.

December was the beginning of the basketball season at DMACC-Boone Campus, and members of Omicron Zeta immediately got involved. For eight home games, Omicron Zeta members worked in the concession stand serving the fans.

In January, State Representative, Jack Nystrom, was guest speaker. This Omicron Zeta meeting was opened to the student body, and a special invitation was sent to each member of the staff and faculty at DMACC-Boone Campus. Mr. Nystrom discussed the procedures of introducing a bill, voting on a bill, and passing a bill. Dr. Stadel and members of the faculty were particularly interested in the bills dealing with educational aid to state schools.

In February, the members of Omicron Zeta toured the Iowa State Highway Commission. They visited the Data Processing Department, the Central Files Department, the Accounting Department, and the Personnel Department.

In April, the Omicron Zeta members honored five secretaries in the Boone area for National Secretaries Week. The secretaries honored were:

To thank the secretaries for their cooperation, a red rose and bud vase were sent to each of the secretaries. The six secretaries on the campus were similarly honored with red roses and bud vases.

The State Phi Beta Lambda Conference was held April 24, in Orange City, Iowa. DMACC-Boone Campus was well represented. Phyllis Cox earned third position on the National Vocabulary team. Vickie Setterberg won third in Miss Future Business Executive and won an honorable mention in Shorthand. William Dyer won first in the Accounting contest. Sue Middle placed second in the Extemporaneous Speaking category. Also, Sue Middle was elected to fill the State Office of Historian-Reporter for 1971-1972. The chapter won second place for their Original Project, Activities Report, and Service Project. Third place was awarded to their Chapter Exhibit.

Boone's competition consisted of students from the University of Northern Iowa, Cedar Falls; Iowa Central Community College, Eagle Grove; Iowa Central Community College, Fort Dodge; Northwestern College, Orange City; Westmar College, LeMars; Ellsworth College, Iowa Falls; and Emmetsburg Community College, Emmetsburg.

Last year Cedric Joseph, Denise Jacobson, and Kanjana Hutakovit attended the National Phi Beta Lambda Conference in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. These students reported on their activities in the fall. This year five students: Vickie Setterberg, Phyllis Cox, Helene Lawler, Denise Jacobson, and Sue Middle will represent DMACC-Boone Campus at the National Conference in Miami, Florida where Phyllis Cox will compete with the Iowa State Vocabulary Team, and Sue Middle will represent the State of Iowa in Extemporaneous Speaking.

















