The West Boone Dodgers edged the Rotary Pirates, 4-1, in Boone Little League action at Jimmy Archer Field Friday.

The combination of a Dodger win and a Pirate loss results in a three-way first place tie in the Little League standings.

The Dodgers, Pirates and Gi-

ants now have identical records of 6-3, while the Braves are 6-4, just one-half game back.

Pitchers Marty Dannatt and Roger Martin performed brilliantly for their respective clubs.

Dannatt, the Dodger ace, pitched no-hit no-run ball until the sixth inning.

BY THAT time, the Dodgers had scored four times to take a 4-0 lead.

In the sixth, the Pirates shocked Dannatt and the Dodgers with a pair of extra base clouts in a row. Eric Miles doubled for the first Pirate hit and then John Hopkins tripled Miles home.

Dannatt then settled down to fan both Mike Davis and Paul Clemenger to douse the fire and preserve the win.

Martin was just a fraction

behind Dannatt in the pitching department. The Pirates twirler gave just five-hits, three of them in the final frame when the Dodgers scored two runs.

Unfortunately, of the five-hits Martin did yield, four were for extra bases.

Mike Manriquez of the Dodgers doubled and later scored in the first inning. In the fifth, Ron Hubby singled and later scored.

THREE straight doubles produced the final two Dodger runs in the sixth. Manriquez, Steve Jenkins and Randy Bennett were the long ball swatters and their barrage produced some vital insurance runs.

Manriquez was the only man on the field to garner more than one hit. He belted a pair of doubles in three trips.

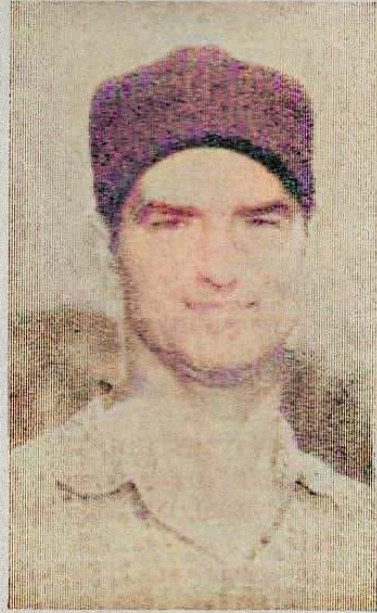
Winner Dannatt walked just one-man and struck out fourteen. Martin duplicated that feat.

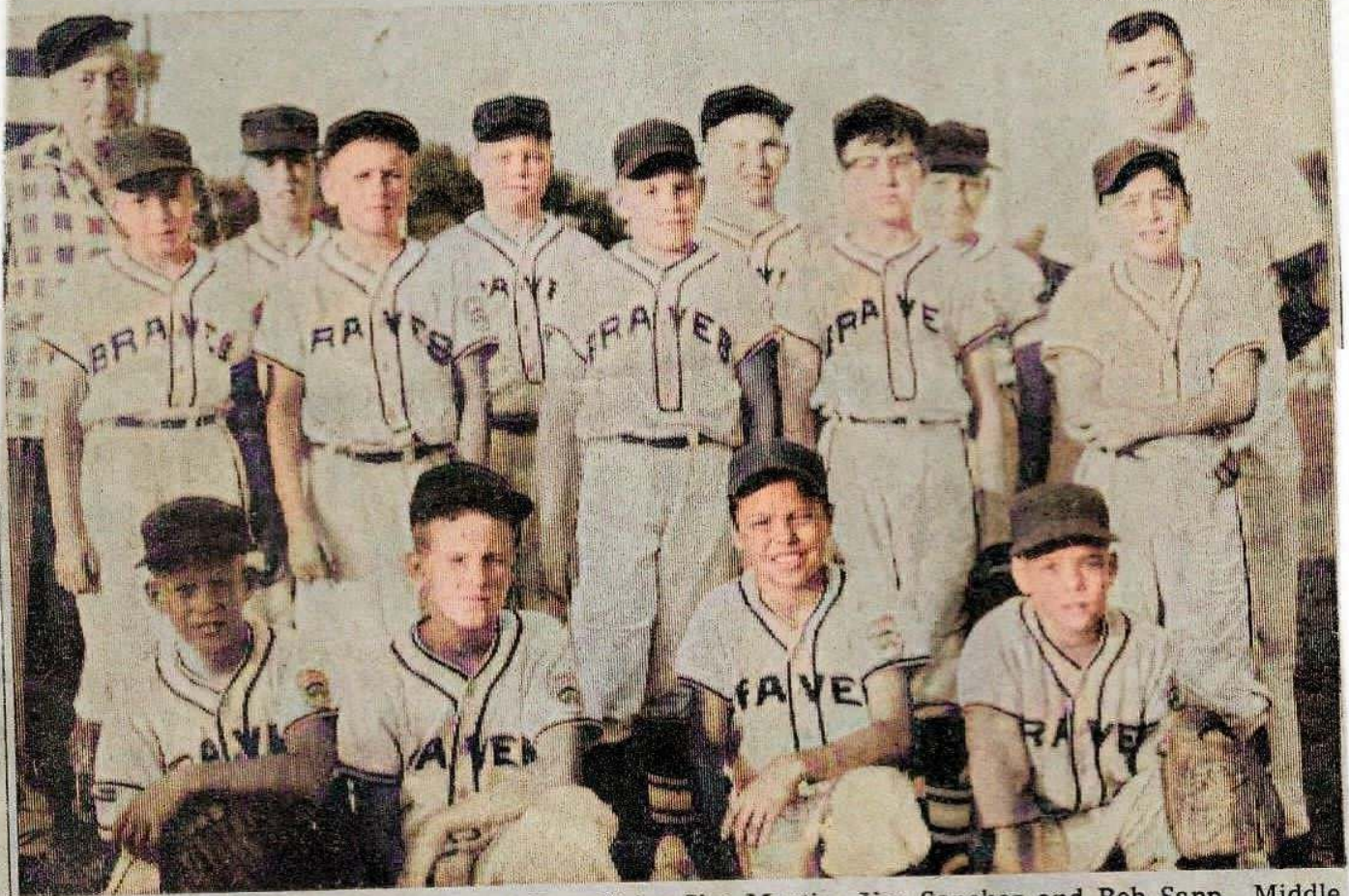

L.L. Braves, Dodgers, Cubs Open With Wins

The Cubs, Braves and Dodgers won opening day tests as Boone's ninth Little League season began Saturday at Jimmy Archer Field.

Some 6-hours of action produced 56-hits, 64-runs, 5-home runs, 39-walks and some of practically everything else essential to good . . . and bad baseball.

From a spectators standpoint, the opener was probably the most interesting game of the day.

In that one, the Cubs and Giants battled to a 3-3 deadlock through regulation play before the Cubs won it, 10-3, on a 7-run eighth inning barrage.

Denny Burkheimer was the Giants starting hurler and Denny Richards handled the chores for the Cubs. They left after 6-innings even-steven and the decision was tossed in the relievers laps.

Dean Johns, who hurled no-hit no-run ball during his 2-inning stint, became the winner and Giant reliever, Jay Nelson, was the victim of the Cubs onslaught.

There were no home runs in the game, but 4 of the Cubs 15-hits were 2-baggers. The Giants were held to 6-hits, 2 of them by Burkheimer.

The top Cub batter was Bill

Benson with 3 for 4 including 2 of the doubles.

THE Braves took a 23-12 win over the Cards in game 2, a game marred by 23-walks.

The Braves used 5-pitchers and the Cards countered with 4.

The Cards were limited to just 5-hits, but 4 Brave errors and 9-walks helped their run total.

The Braves collected 11-hits including a pair of homers. Rick Atherton socked a 3-run blast and Les Meadows belted one with the bags loaded.

That Meadows homer propelled an 11-run fourth inning that gave the Braves a 15-1 lead.

Bob Anderson with 2-for-4 paced the Cards at bat. For the Braves, Meadows was 2-for-2 and both Atherton and Bob Sapp added 2-hits each.

SIX extra base hits, including 2-homers and a triple by Mike Manriquez, powered the defending champion Dodgers to a 12-4 decision over the Pirates in the finale.

In addition to the 3 extra base blows by Manriquez, Randy Bennett, Denny Wilson and William Tripp, all doubled as the Dodgers collected 12-hits off Pirate hurlers Ron Brown and Brian Walker.

Ron Post, the winning hurler, came up with the days top pitching performance. Post

went the distance on a 7-hitter, walked only 1 and struckout 7.

Brian Walker and Jim Knight were the top Pirate hitters with 2-safeties each and John McNace thrilled the crowd with a last inning pinch homer for the losers.

Denny Wilson's superlative pitching and a pair of 5-run innings spurred the defending champion West Boone Dodgers to a 10-1 win over the K of C Giants in Little League action at Jimmy Archer Field Monday.

Wilson, in gaining his first win of the season, held his opponents to a lone hit, 1 run and walked just 5 while fanning 15.

Giant rightfielder Jeff McDermott cracked a single leading off the third inning for the only hit off the Dodger right-hander.

The only Giant run was scored an inning later when leadoff man Tom Hull drew a

walk and later scored from third on a passed ball.

The Dodgers meantime scored 5-runs in both the third and fourth innings. Four hits, a walk and a Giant error produced the third inning tallies and 2 walks, plus 3 consecutive hits did the damage in the fourth frame.

Hull went the distance for the Giants and was the losing pitcher. He yielded 8-hits, 3 of them to Dodger catcher Mike Manriquez and 2 to second baseman Bill Tripp.

Manriquez' double was the only extra base hit of the game.

Post limited his foe to just 3-hits, he fanned 8 and did not walk a man.

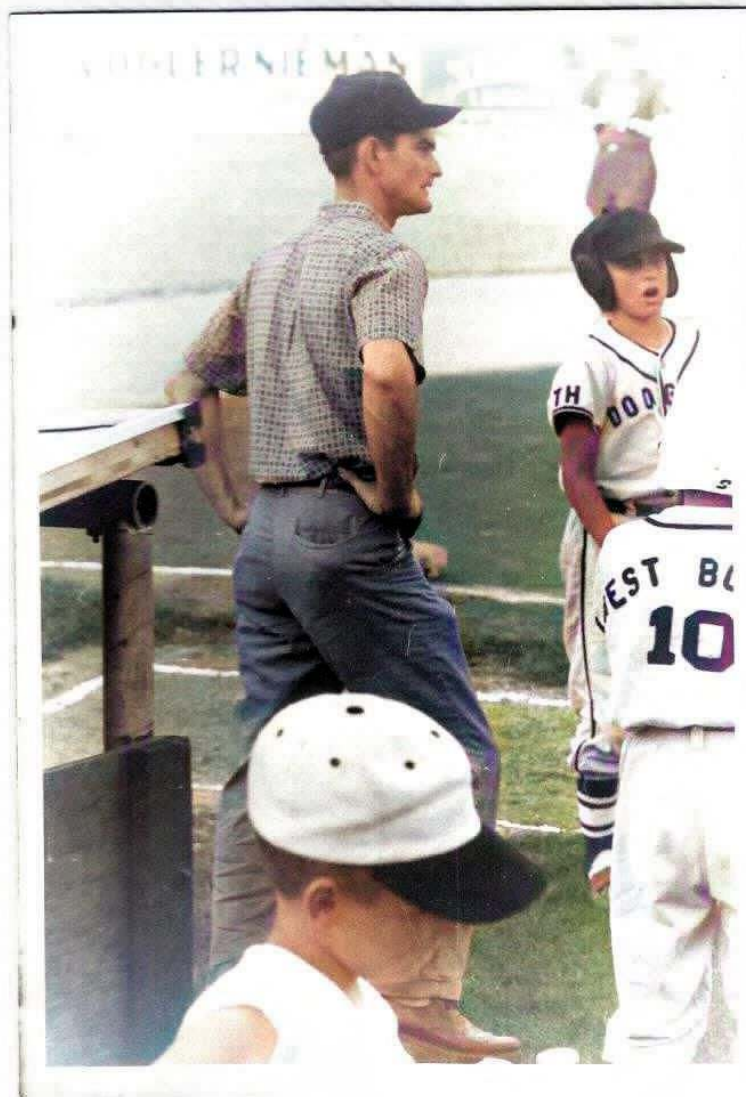
The Cubs hits, all singles, were collected by Bill Benson, Dave Germer and Bill Wallace and they came in separate innings.

The Duffy Appliance Braves increased their Boone Little League lead over the holiday weekend by defeating the Rotary Club Pirates, 5-1, while their closest rivals, the West Boone Dodgers were dropping a 9-3 decision to the K of C Giants.

The Giant-killer Giants, who handed the Braves their only loss of the season May 19, dropped the Dodgers out of a first place tie with their 9-3 win Friday and when the Braves took their decision over the Pirates Saturday, the Duffy nine upped their league lead to a full game. The Braves are now 6-1, the Dodgers 5-2.

The Giants had just 5-hits Friday, but 4 of them were for extra bases.

A double by Bill McVicker after a pair of walks got the K of C club off on the right foot in the first inning, then homers by winning pitcher Denny Burkheimer and center fielder Tom Hull later added to the Giants run total.

Burkheimer allowed 6-hits with a 2-run homer by Mike Manriquez and a solo shot by Randy Bennett the only damaging blows. It was the sixth homer of the season for Manriquez, the league leader in that department.

Bennett was the only man on

either club with more than 1 hit. Randy, the defending league batting champ, collected 2 for 3 and now has 8 hits in his last 12 times at bat. The last 4-games, Bennett's raised his batting average from .400 to .545.

RICK Atherton picked up his fourth pitching victory as the Braves dumped the Pirates Saturday.
