＂Amn Baird，at the request of Erma North of the humane society，is serving time for serving shirts to her Billy goat．

Bertina Rlliott and Jessie McVicker were sent up for life for investigating a gas tank with a lighted match．
＇Virginia Rice，alias＇Singing Sadie，＇has spent seven years improving her voice at the Hudson River Vocal Academy，vulgarly known at Sing Sing．

"Over there you see Arlene Sparks. Florence Burlingame, Elinor Fenton, and Mary Hutchinson working at one of our most profitable industries that of making license plates for the dirigibles of prominent citizens, such as Fern Munden, Madeline Anderson, or Marie Peterson.
"Oho! It is nearly three o'clock and time for the tea, that is to be held in the drawing room; since this is our fiftieth anniversary our social committee. consisting of Virginia Lee, Mary Sullivan. and Alida Love, have arranged quite a program of outside talent.
