Nineteen hundred and eighty-nine marks the first time at Sacred Heart Parish that two priests have celebrated anniversaries of their ordinations in the same year. Rev. Clement T. Flannery, retired, a Boone native and the first graduate of Sacred Heart School to enter the priesthood, observed his 50th Jubilee. He was ordained May 21, 1939, at the Cathedral of the Epiphany, Sioux City, by Bishop Heelan. Our pastor, Rev. James C. McAlpin, celebrated his 25th Jubilee. Holy Orders were conferred by Bishop Mueller on May 31, 1964, at the Cathedral in Sioux City. The parish honored both jubilarians on Memorial Day at a special liturgy followed by a reception in the school gymnasium.

Sacred Heart Parish

The Catholic community of Boone dates back to June 13, 1860, when Fr. John H. Marsh said the first Mass in Boonesboro (West Boone). During the next few years the area was of mission status under Corpus Christi Church, Fort Dodge. When the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad was built through Montana (Boone) and Boonesboro in 1865, the area grew rapidly.

The parish's first permanent pastor, Fr. Delaney, arrived in 1868 and soon built a frame church at 5th and Clay Streets in Boonesboro. A parish cemetery was acquired.

Fr. John B. Concannon replaced Fr. Delaney in 1872, and remained until his sudden death on August 15, 1875.

During the pastorate of Fr. T. J. Mackey (1875-1878), services were held in Ives Hall on East Eighth Street in Boone to accommodate the ever increasing congregation.

Fr. Patrick Smith (1878-1886) is credited with purchasing the first of the properties at 12th and Marshall Streets, thereby moving the congregation from Boonesboro to Boone.

On July 6, 1881, a Sacred Heart parishioner, 15 year old Kate Shelley, gained national attention when she risked her life in a severe thunderstorm to warn an oncoming passenger train of impending doom; thereby saving all on board from certain tragedy. Miss Shelley died in 1912 and is buried in the Sacred Heart Cemetery.

Due to a fire in 1882, early parish records were destroyed; therefore, absolute documentation of early information at the parish level is unavailable. Events taking place prior to this time are based on diocesan records and a church history written by Mary Regan Davitt that appears in the 1914 History of Boone County.

When Fr. Smith left in 1886, Frs. Ward and Hogan were temporarily in charge until Fr. B. C. Lenehan was appointed pastor in 1887.

During his 16 year pastorate, Fr. Lenehan founded Sacred Heart School in 1887 and built the present Church of the Sacred Heart in 1892-93. Fr. Stravens, who was in charge of the parish while Fr. Lenehan toured Europe near the end of his pastorate, started the local Knights of Columbus chapter, Leo Council No. 814.

On January 15, 1902, the Diocese of Sioux City was formed from a portion of the Archdiocese of Dubuque, to which the area had previously belonged.

Fr. James Saunders came to Boone in 1903 to find the parish deeply in debt from the construction of the church ten years earlier. With the help of parishioner Thomas E. Fenton (who developed the "block system" wherein parishioners individually assumed a portion of the debt to repay), Fr. Saunders was able to retire the debt in five years.

In May, 1910, Fr. Saunders succeeded the late Msgr.

B. C. Lenehan as pastor of Corpus Christi, Fort Dodge, and Vicar-General of the diocese.

Fr. James P. Barron became pastor of Sacred Heart in 1910. He acquired a frame convent for the sisters in 1912 near the corner of 11th and Marshall Streets. In approximately 1914 the interior of the church was redecorated. St. Mary's Mission was built in 1914-15. The present brick rectory was built in 1915 or 1916 by contractor John Ivis, whose son, Cleophas J., would later become a priest. Fr. W. F. Mason served as "locum tenens" during Fr. Barron's final illness. Fr. Barron passed away on January 18, 1925, and is buried in the parish cemetery.

Fr. Edward Masterson was appointed pastor in 1925 and in 1931 became the third pastor of Sacred Heart to be transferred to Corpus Christi, Fort Dodge.

Fr. John J. Ryan came to Boone in June, 1931, and would remain as pastor for 33 years, the longest on record at Sacred Heart. Fr. Ryan redecorated the church in 1937 and again in 1954. He made the Holy Year Pilgrimage to Rome in 1950. Fr. Ryan built a new school building in 1951 and convent in 1958. Fr. Ryan observed both his 25th and 50th Jubilees of Ordination while in Boone, in 1933 and 1958, respectively. He was given the title Monsignor in 1959.

Msgr. J. L. Bauer succeeded Msgr. Ryan on February 2, 1964. Msgr. Bauer is credited with the building of Ryan High School in 1966-67. He celebrated his 25th Jubilee of Ordination on February 27, 1970. In May, 1970, Msgr. Bauer announced the closing of the high school. Also in 1970 Msgr. Bauer effected the fourth redecoration of the church. On September 4, 1974, Msgr. Bauer became the fourth pastor of Sacred Heart to be transferred as pastor of Corpus Christi, Fort Dodge.

During Fr. Thomas C. Nash's pastorate (1974-1981), the church was refurbished with new pews and carpeting. On May 6, 1978, parish son Craig A. Collison was ordained at Sacred Heart by Bishop Frank H. Greteman. Fr. Collison said his First Mass on May 7, followed by a reception in Ryan Gym. Fr. Nash observed his 25th Jubilee on May 6, 1979.

On May 24, 1980, the Rev. John Slacks became an ordained deacon in the first diaconate class in the diocese. More recently, the Rev. Mr. Paul Hillyer, Sacred Heart School principal, was ordained to the diaconate on May 14, 1988.

Fr. LeRoy L. Seuntjens was pastor from 1981-1983. Fr. James C. McAlpin, present pastor, was appointed to Sacred Heart in April, 1983. Since Fr. McAlpin's pastorate began, Deacon Slacks has been instrumental in bringing the RCIA and Renew programs to Sacred Heart. The interior of the church was redecorated for the fifth time in 1989.

Groups currently active in the parish include: Parish Council, School Board, Altar Society, Knights of Columbus, Home and School Association, Cemetery

Board, Adult and Youth Choirs, Legion of Mary, Diocesan Council of Catholic Woman, Marriage Encounter, Search, Golden Agers, Holy Spirit Community, Christian Family Movement, RCIA, Catholic Women's Study Club, Prayer Chain, and Religious

Education programs.

Today Sacred Heart is home to just over 600 families which number approximately 1800 individuals. Weekend Masses are at 5:30 p.m. Saturday and 8 a.m., 9:15 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. Sunday.

Sacred Heart School

As mentioned previously, Sacred Heart School was founded in 1887 by Fr. B. C. Lenehan. In that same year four teaching sisters from the Community of Sisters of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary (BVM) arrived from Mt. Carmel, Dubuque. The first Superior was Sr. Mary Borromeo Condon.

The following four young women received diplomas in the first graduating class in 1890: Anna Fitzgerald, Mary Kenney, Mary Mahoney, and Agnes Rock.

The Sacred Heart PTA formed in 1922 was one of the first Catholic PTAs in Iowa. It was replaced by the present Home and School Association in 1962.

Extra-curricular sports were popular and very exciting during the 1930s. In both 1930 and 1938 Sacred Heart won the diocesan championship. Fondly remembered coaches of that era were brothers George (Bricky) and Bill Johnstone.

Upon completion of the new building in January, 1952, under Fr. Ryan's direction, the original red brick structure was torn down. The new two-story facility cost in the area of \$195,000 and contained the following: eight classrooms, library and full basement with kitchen and stage. Fr. Ryan also built a new convent for the sisters in 1958.

On November 23, 1958, the parish celebrated with the BVMs the 125th anniversary of the founding of their religious order. The BVMs had been founded in 1833 by Mother Mary Francis Clarke and the Very Rev. Terence J. Donaghoe.

By the mid 1960s there were record enrollments of well over 360 students per year. Msgr. J. L. Bauer,

superintendent, broke ground for a high school addition that upon completion would be named Ryan High School in honor of the late Msgr. J. J. Ryan. Ryan High cost approximately \$445,000 and featured the following: five classrooms, science lab, library, offices, kitchen and gymnasium. A hot lunch program was begun in the fall of 1967. The building was dedicated by Bishop Joseph Mueller on October 15, 1967.

Adverse economic conditions and the shortage of teaching sisters forced the closing of the high school in May of 1970, ending an 83 year period of continuous parochial high school education in Boone. The high school building is used by the grade school.

Raynette Weigel initiated a Kindergarten program in 1977 and Sacred Heart Preschool (which operates independently of the school itself) began in 1984 with Sandra Sawyer as director.

The last of the teaching sisters left at the close of the 1977-78 academic year after 91 years of service to Boone's Sacred Heart School. Since then the school has been staffed entirely by lay personnel. Mrs. Grace Rinker was the first lay teacher in 1956.

Sacred Heart reached a milestone in longevity in 1987 with the marking of 100 years of service to the community. Fifteen months of planning and preparation went into the Centennial celebration which was held the weekend of July 18-19, 1987.

Including 1989, Sacred Heart School has graduated 1141 students. In the 1989-90 school year there are 179 students enrolled in grades K-8, who are taught by 12 instructors and two teacher's aides.

St. Mary's Mission

For 64 years Sacred Heart Parish had a mission church, St. Mary's, located seven miles north and one mile east of Boone. Transportation and road conditions being what they were in the early 1900s, the many Catholics in the area were not able to attend Mass in Boone regularly. Sacred Heart parishioner Thomas E. Fenton enlisted the support of Bishop Edmond Heelan to instigate a drive to build the mission church.

The Catholic families in the area were enthusiastic and contributed both financially and physically to the building of their new church. The one acre plot of land for the church was donated by Thomas and Johanna Lacey on September 24, 1914. Fr. Barron laid the cornerstone on November 1, 1914; the building was completed in the spring of 1915. The first Mass was

celebrated by Fr. Barron on June 9, 1915. Bishop Heelan officially dedicated St. Mary's in 1922.

St. Mary's Altar Society was formed the day the cornerstone was laid. The ladies' efforts supplied funds to help furnish the church and to provide for its upkeep over the years.

St. Mary's celebrated its Golden Anniversary with a Mass and dinner on June 16, 1965.

Because of the shortage of available priests, Bishop Greteman announced that St. Mary's would close its doors in the summer of 1979. An auction of the furnishings was held August 24, 1980, with the proceeds being forwarded to Fr. James McCormick's mission work in Tanzania, Africa. The building was sold and later renovated into a home.
